This evening we welcome Carlisle United to the Mangata Developments Stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Firstly, can I say to every attending Carlisle United fan, your commitment and resolve to get yourselves down here on the last Sunday before Christmas with 600 of you making a 600 mile round trip is absolutely outstanding and if any team and any group of fans deserve to get themselves back into the EFL it's you guys, and after tonight I wish you all nothing but success.

For me, I accepted a long time ago that we are a much smaller community based club than many who now reside within this league. I accepted as a lowly populated town

at this level, that we would have our limitations if we focused only on attendances. However, maybe foolishly I never saw that as a sole reason to forego my aspirations, my ambitions or stop me dreaming the impossible dream for my club.

In truth like my father before me, who managed our club with such distinction in the sixties and seventies, I still love the fact that sixty years later, we are still finding ways, whether through our staffs' work ethic, our academy or with our improved scouting system, to improve the club off the park, while

recruiting good young players on it, who might then get the chance to compete at the top of this league and who might well then go on beyond.

As such, it's not as mad as most people seem to think that a small well run club with a good catchment area for players, can be playing a club of Carlisle United's size as an equal in this league and not only in the FA Cup. I say that as I well remember watching on the terraces from the Shed end at Chelsea way back in 1974 when Carlisle United won that day 2-0 to go top of Division 1 - and just to put that into perspective, Division 1 is nowadays known as the Premier League.

Though Carlisle United led the league that day after three or four games, they still got relegated that year and that was possibly the best it has ever been for them? And nowadays, with the type of money available and on offer in the Premier League, that was maybe the best it will ever be, who knows?

Only the current 'Blues' diehards will know exactly how they've managed to get themselves down into the National League with their incredible support. From the outside there has obviously been huge historical Boardroom, manager and player changes that perhaps in hindsight would be questioned by the fanbase,

but only the clubs diehards will truly know how they are playing Boreham Wood FC as equals this evening?

For me, I'm now in my 27th season in the Chair here and our story under me was firstly one of survival at the start, followed by a bit of yo-yo success, that then got replaced with more long term ambition and it's now a story of patience, which yet again might be slow, but my aim is to provide a long lasting period of over achievement that will one day land ourselves in the EFL. Is it likely? No, not really but Leicester City did win the Premier League and in truth most of our past achievements were also unlikely, yet we somehow found a way, so here's hoping and praying.

Whatever the reasons for us ending up in the same league as tonight's visitors, along with some of the other big ex-Football League clubs in this division, it is a very big deal for me. As a way of explanation, I go back to my earliest football upbringing long before becoming a fairly successful local businessman. In the seventies and eighties I was a street supporter who followed Chelsea and England up and down the country and over land and sea. I was a big Chelsea fan mostly in the Ken Bates era at Stamford Bridge and so I know the ups and downs of supporting a mad yo-yo club. That said I loved every minute of it and to this day I'm still following England around the world

and loving every second of being a die-hard England fan.

So for me as a local owner, it's a real privilege for our small club, when trying to compete with the Carlisle, Southend, York, Rochdale and Scunthorpe's of this world on a level playing field. I of course accept with a Town population being in or around 35k and with us presently averaging around 900 home fans on a regular basis that things are difficult.

That said, our fanbase is quietly growing, as is our sponsorship, as are our partnerships and in truth so are our relationships with both our Borough Council and Town Council which have never been stronger. For me that is the recipe for our community football club's future success and why we've seen sustained progress over the last two decades. In that time we've dealt with the setbacks, we've shown resilience, shown patience to achieve a bit of longevity, and that longevity means at National League we are making memories and a bit of history along the way.

Other Club News:

The Annual Mencap and Day Centre Christmas lunch held at the club each year, was a resounding success. The lunch itself was great, the staff [servers] were first class, the Mencap, Day Groups and Carers are

quite simply amazing people and our players, manager, staff and local dignitaries made it a community day [once again] to cherish and remember.

No doubt there are photos and videos online somewhere and possibly in this digital programme and I hope they convey the joy, care and love in the room, because without being corny, everyone in our community should feel like they belong and everyone deserves to feel both cared for and loved. In truth this is one of the clubs' most cherished and anticipated days and once again it did not disappoint.

On to the Clubs' South end planning application. I'm sorry to say that timelines have slipped planning wise once again and our submission will not be heard until February. In truth the project was not where the planners wanted it to be, nor where I was feeling happy and I've let my feelings and frustration be known to my architect and inner circle. As such, after certain decisions were made beyond my control, the project has been tweaked once again to incorporate further community provision that includes two new changing rooms, that will be under our control but will also be made available for the park and its pitch users.

For clarity, if everything goes well in February then the start date will remain May 2026 but if it slips any further, then I'll need to rethink things, re-budget and plan accordingly.

Anyway, back to tonight and the visit of the 1974 Division 1 leaders in Carlisle United, plus the first league visit of their incredible supporters. Their Manager is none other than the legendary Mark 'Sparky' Hughes. It's fair to say that back in the day, I would loyally follow both Hughsie and Chelsea up and down the country and on occasion even up Wembley way itself, "what a special player he was"....

That was a lifetime ago and we are now in a very different social and streaming era, an era that tramples on common sense and cares nothing for the attending supporter. As such, I want to repeat myself and give the warmest of welcomes to Carlisle's amazing travelling supporters. As a long-standing Chairman of a National League club, I can only apologise to Carlisle fans and every away supporter for DAZN and the National League's recent stupidity, and especially in putting this game on at 4pm on the last Sunday before Christmas. To disregard the away fans, who will be lucky to be home by 2am tonight is dangerous, could be the beginning of the end for

the travelling supporter and it's absolutely scandalous.

Once again the National League Board have refused to meet me to discuss things, surprise surprise which is frustrating, but I'll keep trying to meet them on the little man's behalf, and I'll try to ask them for a more common sense approach toward both supporters and clubs and try to find some common ground on how we best implement a streaming deal that can work better for all parties.

However, that's for another day, and as we are the last game of DAZN's "Nightmare of Christmas" I hope that both teams give the attending fans exactly what we want, that being a brilliant, exciting and attacking game, and no matter who you support this evening, may I genuinely wish you a very happy and peaceful Christmas and more importantly a very happy, healthy and prosperous New Year.

Conn-Clarke is a dynamic attacking midfielder who joined Carlisle United on loan in October. A graduate of Glentoran's academy, he moved to Burnley before spells with Chorley, Fleetwood Town, Altrincham and Waterford. Conn-Clarke starred for Altrincham in 2023/24, scoring 23 goals to win National League Player of the Year, earning a move to Peterborough United. The Northern Irishman has represented his country at youth level.



Regan LINNEY

Born: 12 May 1997

Position: Forward

Forward Regan Linney joined Carlisle United in May on a three-year deal. A product of Bamber Bridge's youth system, he made his senior debut aged 17 before moving to FC United of Manchester, where he netted 40 goals in 89 appearances. Linney joined Altrincham in 2023, becoming a key attacker and netting 25 goals in 2024/25, earning himself a spot in the National League Team of the Season. Mark Hughes' number 10 has netted 12 times in the division so far this campaign.

After weathering early pressure, Wood grew into the game and were rewarded just before the break when Erico Sousa's perfectly weighted pass released Luke Norris, who finished clinically to give Luke Garrard's side a half-time lead. Carlisle emerged with renewed intensity after the interval and quickly turned the game on its head, scoring three times through Georgie Kelly and a superb Regan Linney double to seemingly take control.

However, Wood refused to fold. Matt Rush and Chris Bush both threatened before Norris reignited belief with a powerful header. Momentum swung decisively when Sousa's free-kick was met by Charlie O'Connell, whose towering header drew Wood level late on. In a breathless finale, we held firm to secure an a well-earned point in Cumbria.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Carlisle United goalscoring favourites

IVOR BROADIS

Clever inside-forward Ivor Broadis was capped 14 times by England in between two notable spells at Carlisle United. A former Tottenham Hotspur amateur, he served in the RAF during the war and became Carlisle's player-manager at just 23 in August 1946. Twice leading marksman before moving to Sunderland for £18,000 in February 1949, he also starred in the top-flight for Manchester City and Newcastle United prior to rejoining Carlisle in July 1955. He netted 84 goals in 250 League games overall before moving to Queen of the South in July 1959. Later a sportswriter, he resided in Carlisle until his death in April 2019.

JIMMY WHITEHOUSE

Experienced inside-forward Jimmy Whitehouse was twice leading marksman at Carlisle United. Signing professional for West Brom in May 1948, he had spells with Walsall and Rochdale before moving to Brunton Park in October 1951. He scored twice on his Carlisle debut and five times in their record 8-0 annihilation of Scunthorpe on Christmas Day 1952. Netting a post-war record 100 goals in 198 Third Division (North) games for the Cumbrians, his playing career was ended by a knee injury in May 1957. Settling in Carlisle, he was a newsagent, then worked 18 years for Pirelli. He died in September 2005.

ALF ACKERMAN

South African centre-forward Alf Ackerman was Carlisle United's top scorer in two consecutive seasons. Initially with Pretoria Municipals, he moved via Clyde to Hull City

in July 1950. 'Ack Ack' joined Norwich City in August 1951, then played for Hull again and Derby before moving to Brunton Park in November 1956. He grabbed a hat-trick in Carlisle's 3-3 FA Cup third round draw against Birmingham two months later, scoring 62 times in 96 League games prior to joining Millwall in January 1959. Later Dartford's player-boss, he also managed Gravesend & Northfleet, then returned to South Africa and died in July 1988.

HUGH McILMOYLE

Centre-forward Hugh McIlmoyle was voted Carlisle United's all-time favourite player. Initially with Port Glasgow, he played for Leicester City in the 1961 FA Cup final and moved via Rotherham United to Carlisle in March 1963. He was leading marksman in the 1963-64 promotion success, then had spells at Wolves and Bristol City before rejoining Carlisle in September 1967 and was top scorer in 1968-69. Later with Middlesbrough, Preston NE and Morton, he returned to Carlisle again in July 1974 and netted 76 goals in 189 League games overall for the Cumbrians. He is now a retired warehouseman, living back in Carlisle.

STAN BOWLES

Colourful striker Stan Bowles was capped five times by England after leaving Carlisle United. Starting with Manchester City, he had spells with Bury and Crewe Alexandra before moving to Brunton Park in October 1971 and was Carlisle's leading marksman in 1971-72. He netted 12 goals in 33 League games prior to joining QPR for a then record £112,000 in September 1972 and starred in their 1972-

73 promotion success and 1975-76 League Championship near-miss. Later playing for Nottingham Forest, Orient and Brentford, he helped his sister in the London rag trade and worked in hospitality. He died in February 2024.

BOBBY OWEN

Striker Bobby Owen starred as Carlisle United won promotion to the top-flight in 1973-74. Signing professional for Bury in August 1965, he was leading marksman in their 1967-68 promotion success. He joined Manchester City in July 1968 and scored twice on his debut in the FA Charity Shield, reuniting with Bob Stokoe at Brunton Park in June 1970. Joint top scorer in 1971-72, he netted 51 goals in 204 League games for Carlisle before following Joe Laidlaw to Doncaster Rovers in July 1977. Leading marksman in 1978-79, he later played for Gainsborough and Retford. He worked as a fork-lift driver in Radcliffe.

DAVID REEVES

Striker David Reeves was leading marksman in three successive seasons at Carlisle United. Initially at Heswall with his twin brother Alan, he joined Sheffield Wednesday in August 1986 and gained top-flight experience. He moved to Bolton Wanderers in August 1989 and featured in their 1992-93 promotion campaign. Briefly at Notts County, he joined Carlisle for £121,000 in December 1993 and scored 48 goals in 127 League games prior to joining Preston for £300,000 in October 1996. He moved to Chesterfield in November 1997 and was a promotion winner in 2000-01, then played for Oldham and Chesterfield again.

MATT JANSEN

England Youth striker Matt Jansen featured in Carlisle United's 1996-97 promotion and Auto Windscreens Shield 'double' triumph. Born locally, he turned professional at Brunton Park in January 1996 and netted ten goals in 42 League games for Carlisle before sold to Crystal Palace for a record £1,500,000 in February 1998. He gained England U-21 international recognition and joined Blackburn Rovers for £4,100,000 in January 1999, scoring in their 2002 League Cup final

success. He suffered a serious head injury in a motor accident and later played for Bolton Wanderers, Wrexham, Leigh Genesis and Chorley, becoming manager.


KARL HAWLEY

England Semi-Pro international striker Karl Hawley was top scorer as Carlisle United won the League Two title and were Football League Trophy finalists in 2005-06. He turned professional with hometown Walsall in January 2001 and joined Carlisle in August 2004, starring as they regained Football League status in 2004-05. Scoring 34 goals in 78 League outings before moving to Preston in July 2007, he was loaned to Northampton Town and Colchester United prior to joining Notts County in August 2009. He later had spells at Scunthorpe United, Torquay United, Alfreton, Stourbridge, Boston United and Stafford Rangers.

PETER BEARDSLEY

Brilliant striker Peter Beardsley gained 59 England caps after leaving Brunton Park. He impressed with Wallsend Boys Club before joining Carlisle United in August 1979 and starred in the 1981-82 promotion campaign, netting 22 goals in 104 League outings prior to joining Vancouver Whitecaps for £275,000 in April 1982.

After a spell with Manchester United, he joined Newcastle in September 1983 and helped them win promotion in 1983-84. He later starred for Liverpool, Everton, Newcastle again, Bolton Wanderers, Manchester City, Fulham and Hartlepool United before returning to Newcastle on their coaching staff.


