Today we welcome our friends from Newport County to the Mangata Developments Stadium for our FA Cup 2nd Round encounter. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

We have had possibly the most extraordinary 6 months in the clubs' history, where we won ourselves promotion through the play offs, where we have started this season very well and sit just two points off the top of the National League, while we've already beaten an EFL club Crawley Town in the FA Cup 1st Round.

All of which brings us to today and gives us the chance to go head to head with yet another EFL 2 club in Newport County for a place in the FA Cup 3rd Round. With this head to head tie being a chosen TV FA Cup game, the broadcasters in all honesty are looking for a Cup upset and of course we hope they have chosen the right game.

For me today's game is tight and more of a toss up, with home advantage obviously being a factor. Other factors are Newport County's playing budget, recent managerial change and being an EFL 2 club with a good historical cup pedigree, so for me this game has a 50/50 feel about it.

When you're a small non league club and have our recent FA Cup pedigree, expectation

naturally rises because our fans know anything is possible in the FA Cup. As such when you've managed to get yourself into the 2nd Round yet again, there is bound to be an added importance put on the game and we must all understand how to handle that.

In truth both clubs this afternoon and both sets of supporters already know what victory, coupled with a fantastic 3rd Round draw, can do to change the landscape of any football club our size and perhaps therein lies a little bit of self created pressure.

To date we have not felt any pressure this season because after promotion, in all honesty, everything's gone like a dream and the football we're playing has been a joy to watch. The last two weeks are a perfect example of that, as we've recently beaten Gateshead away 3-0 when down to 10 men for an hour and beaten a decent Leicester City U/21's here. We then went and battered Halifax here in front of the DAZN cameras, and put another 4 past Wolves U/21's on Tuesday night to reach the last 8 of the National League Cup.

So results at present have been more than we could have reasonably expected, our key staff it appears are happy and working to levels I've never seen here before and the dressing room incumbents are simply an incredibly talented group of highly motivated individuals who collectively, through Luke's leadership, are creating great things for themselves, for our community, our town, our supporters and also for themselves and their loved ones.

As a Chairman, I'm very happy with everything associated with what's happening here both on and off the pitch, but I'm still quietly trying to improve our business model a tad off the pitch. As such I hope to begin the next phase to complete our facility upgrades, by finally starting the South Stand, its associated facilities and the away fan zone project in May 2026.

There are planning issues that I still need to solve but they are not insurmountable. At present they are being worked through and I'm confident that with my track record here, with my local relationships and with the clubs' very detailed planning application, that will help HBC's planning department to make the right decision and look favourably at our submission in mid January.

Anyway, back to today, there really is nothing like the excitement, madness and glory of the FA Cup for clubs at our level of the game. For me after 27 seasons here in the Chair, it's now only about the memories, it's only about the feeling that success can bring you and it's only about my family, my friends and our fans.

Of course the money from winning today would be very nice, but if you don't budget for it, if you never expected it and if you never had it, then trust me you're not going to miss what you never had. That said, if you lose, you will miss those memories, that feeling of collective success and that feeling of what this club, this town and this community would have achieved together and you miss watching your fans go nuts and trust me money cannot buy that.

So let's not worry for one second about falling short, let's just picture the finish line, let's just picture and bank the magic of the FA Cup and remember our track record in recent years in the FA Cup, as it tells us we're more than capable of causing an upset.

Remember if it's our day, we'll simply enjoy the moment together and we can take the mental pictures and bank those wonderful memories that only the FA Cup can give you. Remember this is our town, this is our community and this

is our club, so let's embrace and run with our underdog story once again and let's try and create yet another FA Cup adventure that we can all take to the grave.

For me, as always, I'll be a bit emotional on Sunday as that's just me.... I'll as always be consumed with the memories of my mother and father who both helped build this amazing football club. I'll look around me on the day and see my partner, my family including my sister, cousins, my kids and my daughters-in-law. I'll also be surrounded by many of my 17 grandchildren as this is also their club and they are in truth the air I breath.

My best friend of well over 50 years, Ian Fryer, is also getting himself down to the club (a club we both played for so badly 40 odd years ago). Plus there will be lots of our Champions, Holmshill, Furzehill and Lyndhurst middle school friends dotted all around the Stadium.

No doubt lots of old Wood players and supporters will be here, hopefully to witness an upset and many of the lads we played local football with back in the day will be here. Best of all though, I know the fan base we've grown throughout all aspects of our local community will turn out for us this afternoon and these are the days that are quietly growing our football club.

In truth I feel blessed as a local man, whose family has been a part of our football club in some capacity since 1948. So to be it's longest serving Chairman is an honour, and oh what a blessing to still be in the FA Cup 2nd Round once again and striving once again to look to the heavens and cause an upset.

Lastly, and as a gently reminder, if it's not our day, then we must remember to wipe our mouths, we must accept defeat with good grace, as that's what the FA Cup is all about, and if we haven't got the result we hoped for, we will wish Newport County and their supporters the very best of luck in the next round and for the remainder of the season.

Finally, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

Good afternoon, firstly I would like to welcome Christian Fuchs, his Staff and Players to Mangata Developments Stadium for todays Emirates FA Cup second round fixture.

Having only recently taken over you can see the characteristics of what he wants his side to resemble and that was very noticeable in their recent fixture against Barrow.

I can imagine over time with his experience and knowledge he will have a side that mirrors him and competing to improve their league position and ultimately climbing the table.

They are currently on a sticky run of form having only won one of their last six, but we all know and appreciate that when it comes to the FA Cup form guides get chucked out the window.

We have to accept that confidence and belief most definitely does remain though, with us recording our seventh win in our last eight on Tuesday evening against Wolves, will give us all the conviction we need to cause another Cup upset this afternoon.

We know how tough the task will be today but we are in such a good place, the manner in which we are playing, the fluidity and freedom the squad have is evident and it's been a pleasure to watch at times.

Our game is constantly evolving and I'm seeing how well the players are improving and the understanding of our concepts is way clearer for them.

I speak openly about all the work that gets done on and off the pitch, especially within the Analysis Suite. I'm a strong believer in presentations and illustrations as I'm aware of everyone's learning needs within the group.

Some players are receptive through visuals, others understand through audio and the majority through physically being on the grass.

I have to appreciate and understand that not everyone is the same and if I isolate my coaching to only one of the three VAK learning model techniques then I will be neglecting potentially half the squad.

And when you are implementing a whole new style and trying to have many facets to your game, it's all well and good me understanding it and knowing what I want in certain areas of the pitch but that's not the art of coaching.

The art of coaching is making sure the players have all the knowledge to solve certain scenarios that are being presented to them and giving them the answers for them to find the solutions is key.

You can see the players are continuously working this out mid game, and trying to manipulate the opposition into certain positions to best play through them, around them or over them.

I keep saying it, we are in such an early phase of our progression and where I genuinely feel we can get to is streets apart, but to have the return of points and be as progressive as we have been in the Cup Competitions to date does wonders for BUY IN within the squad.

Because let's be honest if we were playing in the way we are and not currently sat 5th in the Division and also in the 2nd Round of the Cup there would be question marks over the "process" as it's a results based business.

Fortunately for us we have married our performances up with the substance of results and that for me is fundamental.

The focus turns back to Today and a one-off tie against League Two opposition, we as a Club have had many of these moments over the years and have memories to last a life time.

We have an experience and understanding of what is in front of us and with players still amongst us from our previous cup runs will only bode well.

We will look to implement our game from the off and try to be dominate in all areas, we know where we can hurt them and having the belief to go and deliver on this will be key.

Let's get right behind the boys and bring an energy and noise to make this into a real cup atmosphere.

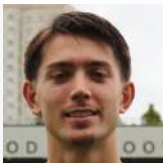

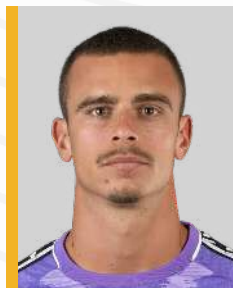

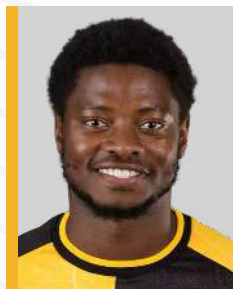


James CLARKE

NEWPORT COUNTY

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten leading Newport County managers

BILLY McCANDLESS

Former Irish international full-back Billy McCandless guided Newport County to the Third Division (South) title in 1938-39. He played for Linfield in three Irish Cup finals, moving to Glasgow Rangers in November 1920 and starring in seven Scottish League title triumphs. After a spell as Ballymena's player-boss, he managed Dundee, then Newport from September 1937 until April 1946. He guided Cardiff City to the Third Division (South) title in 1946-47, then became Swansea's manager in November 1947 and repeated the feat in 1948-49. Also plotting the Swans' 1950 Welsh Cup final success, he remained in charge until his death in July 1955.

BILLY LUCAS

Former Welsh international wing-half Billy Lucas had three spells as manager of hometown Newport County. Initially with Treharris, he moved via Wolves to Swindon Town in May 1937 and joined Swansea for a then record £11,000 in March 1948. He skippered them to the Third Division (South) title in 1948-49 and featured in two Welsh Cup finals, including their 1950 triumph. Appointed Newport County's player-boss in December 1953, he resigned in April 1961, then returned a year later but left again in February 1967 to manage Swansea until June 1969. He rejoined Newport for a third spell and became general manager. He died in October 1998.

LEN ASHURST

Ex-England U-23 left-back Len Ashurst managed Newport County to a promotion

and Welsh Cup 'double' in 1979-80. A former Liverpool junior, he moved via Prescot Cables to Sunderland in November 1957 and was ever-present as they won promotion in 1963-64. He became Hartlepool's player-boss in March 1971, then had spells in charge of Gillingham and Sheffield Wednesday, becoming Newport's manager in June 1978. Guiding them to the ECWC quarter-finals in 1980-81, he left for Cardiff in March 1982, plotting promotion in 1982-83, then managed Sunderland to the League Cup final in 1985 and Cardiff again. He died in September 2021.

COLIN ADDISON

Colin Addison plotted Newport County's 1982-83 promotion near-miss. Starting with York City, he starred in the top-flight for Nottingham Forest, Arsenal and Sheffield United, becoming Hereford's player-boss in October 1971. He managed their 1971-72 FA Cup run and 1972-73 promotion success. Later manager/coach of Durban City, Newport from February 1977 until May 1978, West Brom and Derby, he managed Newport again between January 1982 and May 1985, then had spells at Al-Ahli, Celta Vigo, Atletico Madrid, Cadiz, Hereford again, Al-Arabi, Badajoz, Merthyr, Scarborough, Yeovil, Swansea, Forest Green and Barry. He died in October 2025.

JOHN RELISH

John Relish managed Newport County to the Hellenic League Premier Division title in 1989-90. The left-back turned professional with Chester in October 1971 and moved to Newport in June 1974. Featuring in their 1979-80 promotion and Welsh Cup 'double' success, he also helped reach the ECWC

quarter-finals in 1980-81. Scoring nine times in 338 League games, he was player-manager before joining Forest Green Rovers in October 1986. He became player-boss of the newly re-formed Newport in June 1989 and remained in charge until June 1993, then managed Weston-Super-Mare, Merthyr Tydfil and Bath City. His son Lee also played for Newport.

GRAHAM ROGERS

Graham Rogers managed Newport County to the Southern League Midland Division title in 1994-95. Signing professional for hometown Newport in September 1973, the central defender joined Merthyr Tydfil in August 1976, then played for Caerleon, Minehead and helped Barry Town to win the Welsh League title three times. Returning to Newport in August 1985, he made 11 League appearances overall before joining Forest Green Rovers. He joined Newport AFC in July 1989 and helped win the Hellenic League Premier Division title in 1989-90. Managing Newport from July 1993 until June 1996, he worked as a heating and plumbing engineer.

TIM HARRIS

Tim Harris managed Newport County back to the Southern League Premier Division in 1998-99. A former goalkeeper, he had spells with Shrewsbury Town, Newport, Cheltenham Town, Redditch and Gloucester City. He began his managerial career at Cinderford Town, then was Newport's boss from July 1997 until November 2002, taking Blackpool to an FA Cup first round replay in 2001-02. Later managing Forest Green Rovers, Merthyr Tydfil and Gloucester City, becoming general manager, he returned to Newport as general manager, then director of football. He has since managed Gloucester again, Redditch United, Hereford and Worcester.

DEAN HOLDSWORTH

Former England B international striker Dean Holdsworth managed Newport County to the Conference South title in 2009-10. Initially at Watford with his twin brother David, he joined Brentford in September 1989 and was leading marksman in their 1991-92 Third Division title triumph. 'Deano' moved to Wimbledon for £720,000 in July 1992 and was

twice top scorer. Sold to Bolton Wanderers for £3,500,000 in October 1997, he then played for Coventry, Rushden & Diamonds, Wimbledon again and Havant & Waterlooville. He has managed Redbridge, Newport from June 2008 until January 2011, Aldershot, Chelmsford, Brentwood and Stratford.

MICHAEL FLYNN

Michael Flynn managed Newport County to the League Two play-off final in 2019 and 2021. The midfielder began with hometown Newport, then played for Barry Town and helped Wigan Athletic win the Second Division title in 2002-03. Later at Gillingham, Blackpool, Huddersfield and Bradford City, he rejoined Newport in July 2012 and featured in their 2013 Conference National play-off final triumph. He had a spell as player-coach before managing Newport from March 2017 until October 2021, also guiding them to the FA Cup fourth round in 2017-18 and fifth round in 2018-19. He has since managed Walsall, Swindon Town and Cheltenham.

JUSTIN EDINBURGH

Justin Edinburgh managed Newport County's 2013 Conference National play-off final success. Starting at Southend, the left-back helped win promotion in 1989-90 and joined Spurs for £150,000 in July 1990. He helped win the FA Cup in 1991 and League Cup in 1999. Later with Portsmouth, he had a spell as Billericay's player-boss, then managed Fisher, Grays Athletic and Rushden & Diamonds before Newport from October 2011 until February 2015, also taking them to the 2012 FA Trophy final. He managed Gillingham and Northampton, then Leyton Orient to the Conference National title and FA Trophy final in 2018-19. He died in June 2019.

NEWPORT COUNTY

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Newport County 'Classic Campaigns'.

1948/49

Newport County reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1948/49. Tom Bromilow's side defeated Brighton and Leytonstone before gaining a shock 3-1 victory at Leeds United in the third round. Newport then triumphed 3-1 at top-flight Huddersfield Town in a fourth round replay after a 3-3 draw before losing 3-2 at that season's champions Portsmouth in front of 48,581. The thrilling FA Cup run contrasted with disappointing League form as Newport won just one of their opening 14 games and crashed to an 11-1 defeat at Notts County in January, finishing 15th in the Third Division (South). Reg Parker was top scorer, while George Roffi was ever-present.

1972/73

Newport County narrowly missed promotion on goal average in 1972/73. Billy Lucas' side lost just four of their opening 18 Fourth Division games and trounced Hartlepool 5-1. They slipped down the table after gaining only one point from their next four matches but charged back into the top four with five straight wins and hammered Gillingham 5-1. Just one victory in eight games, scoring just three goals, saw Newport slip to sixth place. They revived hopes with a 5-1 win at Doncaster but were pipped to promotion by Aldershot despite winning their last two matches. Willie Brown was leading marksman, while John Macey and Willie Screen were ever-present.

1979/80

Len Ashurst guided Newport County to a promotion and Welsh Cup 'double' in 1979/80. The Ironsides won their opening two games and the introduction of summer signing John

Aldridge sparked a run of just one defeat in 13 matches that lifted Newport up to second place, with 'Aldo' grabbing his first League hat-trick in a 5-0 win at Stockport in mid-November. A club record ten consecutive League victories included a 5-2 demolition of Halifax and Newport clinched promotion in third place with a 4-2 win at Walsall on the final day. John Aldridge was leading marksman, while Welsh internationals Steve Lowndes and Nigel Vaughan were both ever-present.

1980/81

Newport County reached the European Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals in 1980/81. They hammered Crusaders 4-0 and Haugar 6-0, then gained a marvellous 2-2 draw at East German side Carl Zeiss Jena in the quarter-final first-leg before narrowly losing 1-0 at home to the eventual finalists. Len Ashurst's side finished mid-table in the Third Division despite being without the injured John Aldridge for much of the second half of the season, beating Chesterfield 5-1 and netting four goals in both games against Carlisle United, then against Blackpool, Hull City and Sheffield United. Top scorer Dave Gwyther and Tommy Tynan netted 28 League goals together.

1982/83

Newport County narrowly missed promotion to the Second Division in 1982/83. Colin Addison's side were early pace-setters, winning 5-1 against Orient and AFC Bournemouth as they climbed to second place by mid-November. They maintained their promotion challenge and a thrilling run of ten wins in 11 games took them top of the

table in early April, with a crowd of 16,052 watching their 1-0 win at home to Cardiff City. But Newport finished fourth after gaining only four points from their last seven matches. Ever-present leading scorer Tommy Tynan and John Aldridge netted 42 League goals overall and ten players made 40 or more League appearances.

1994/95

Newport AFC won the Southern League Midland Division title by a 14 point margin in 1994/95. Despite the distraction of fighting a High Court action against the Welsh FA for restraint of trade, their fine seven-match unbeaten start included a 6-2 win at Forest Green Rovers and a 4-0 victory in the return game in mid-November heralded a thrilling run of 14 successive wins. Ceri Williams scored four goals in their 5-2 victory at home to promotion rivals Ilkeston in early December as Newport went top of the table for the first time, remaining in pole position. Ceri Williams was leading scorer with 32 League goals, while Ray John was 'Player of the Year'.

1998/99

Newport AFC won promotion back to the Southern League Premier Division in 1998/99. Karl Bayliss grabbed a hat-trick as Tim Harris' side began with a 4-0 win over Sutton Coldfield. They also scored four goals in both matches against Stourbridge, then hammered Bilston 5-0 and Bloxwich 6-0 in quick succession, becoming the only Southern League club with an unbeaten home record. But disappointing away form, with nine defeats, cost the Midland Division title as they finished runners-up to Clevedon. Karl Bayliss was top scorer with 31 goals, while Bradley Thomas was 'Player of the Year'. They became known as Newport County again that summer.

2009/10

Newport County won the Conference South title with a club record 103 points in 2009/10. Dean Holdsworth's side were unbeaten in their opening 13 games, including a 5-1 win over Eastleigh, until losing 1-0 at Staines. They remained top with a 21 match unbeaten run, scoring five goals past Thurrock, St Albans and Basingstoke, before a shock 2-1 defeat at

Thurrock in late March. Newport's third defeat was 4-0 at Havant & Waterlooville. They were the only Conference club with an unbeaten home record, finishing 28 points ahead of Dover. Craig Reid and Sam Foley scored 40 Conference goals between them, while Glyn Thompson was ever-present.

2012/13

Newport County regained Football League status after an absence of 25 years in 2012/13. Justin Edinburgh's side were early Conference leaders, starting with five straight wins and losing only two of their opening 14 games. They hammered Cambridge United 6-2 and Luton Town 5-2 at Rodney Parade, then triumphed 4-2 at Lincoln City. Five successive wins, including a 2-0 victory over eventual champions Mansfield Town, kept them in contention before just one win in six matches ended title hopes. They qualified for the Conference play-offs in third place, beating Grimsby Town 2-0 in the semi-finals, then Wrexham 2-0 in the Wembley final.



2018/19

Newport County reached the FA Cup fifth round for only the second time in 2018/19. Michael Flynn's side defeated Metropolitan Police and Wrexham before goals by Jamille Matt and Padraig Amond gave them a shock 2-1 FA Cup third round win at home to top-flight Leicester. Matty Dolan's last-gasp equaliser gave Newport a 1-1 draw at Middlesbrough, then Robbie Willmott and Amond scored in their 2-0 victory in the replay. They lost 4-1 at home to 'treble' winners Manchester City in the fifth round. Newport qualified for the League Two play-offs in seventh position, beating Mansfield in the semi-finals before losing 1-0 to Tranmere at Wembley.

The Wood cruised into the National League Cup quarter-finals with a dominant 4–0 win over Wolverhampton Wanderers U21s, maintaining their perfect record in the competition.

Luke Norris set the tone after just two minutes, finishing from close range before Wood took firm control of the first half. Despite a couple of warning signs from Wolves, Lewis Richardson doubled the lead shortly before the break with a composed strike after a superb Regan Booty pass.

Wood resumed on the front foot, and although Norris struck the bar from the penalty spot, Jon Benton soon made it 3–0, capitalising on a scramble in the box. Wolves enjoyed a brief spell of pressure but rarely threatened, and Wood regained control late on. In stoppage time, Booty capped the night with a crisp low finish to seal an emphatic victory. The win offered valuable minutes for fringe players as attention now shifts to Newport County.

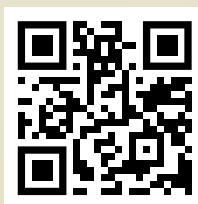
