Tonight we welcome Solihull Moors to the Mangata Developments Stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, as we come to the end of another rollercoaster year, it's arguably been one of the most successful in our long history. A year where we've won an unlikely promotion through the play offs after everyone wrote us off, and now put ourselves into the 3rd Round of the FA Cup by beating two EFL clubs and reached the quarter final of the National League Cup.

On top of the above, we've secured a record points tally for us of 50 points in 23 games and we now sit second in the league at the half way point of the season, while quietly putting together an improved infrastructure, team and squad to be proud of.

In the last 12 months we've also upgraded our floodlights, built a new away bar with toilets and a seated area. We've also finally completed the

new entrance road, home car park and barrier system, while creating a new control room complete with ground monitoring CCTV.

On top of the above we've lost the dug outs and created a new management technical area, improved the media areas, built a new fence line along the whole East side. We've also invested in a new Executive Office, while updating, improving and maintaining things across the whole site.

For those who went to Wealdstone on Boxing Day and looked at how they do things, I think you'll agree our facility upgrades is money well spent, though I accept raising facility standards at our level does cost a lot money and other clubs' business models often mean they put most of their money on the pitch.

It's always a difficult balancing act when you're in my position, as I'm always looking to improve our facilities and infrastructure, whilst balancing staffing levels, academy and improving the first team budget and squad. It feels to me over the last few seasons that between my Finance Director Ciara Dyer, Sporting Director Charlie Hunter and Manager Luke Garrard, we are just about striking a balance and even though we do now have a few big injuries, it's going to be down to all of us to cope and still find ways to keep our momentum going without damaging the club financially in the short term.

Trust me though, if we do need to strengthen in key areas, and I think we might, then I'll remain open minded if the right situations present themselves. Why? Because in our current situation I'd be a complete fool not to give you, Luke and the dressing room the chance to dream the impossible dream. That said, everything must be looked at on its merit, but it's fair to say that at this point our manager, younger players, experienced players and our dressing room have been incredible to date.

It's also fair to say that the permanent signings of both Zak Brunt and Marley Marshall-Miranda during the season, has shown our intent to hang around at the top end of the league, possibly bloody a few noses along the way and if we can, we want to give ourselves a realistic chance to progress and have success on the pitch, while I plan heavily for our future off it.

With my experience I say to each and every one of you please enjoy what you are witnessing as the football played has been exceptional. I temper that by saying in football you are only ever one bad week away from the wheels coming off and tonight is a horrible reminder

of that, as we meet a very dangerous Solihull Moors team and it's a fixture that will give us a major obstacle to overcome this evening.

Why? Because Solihull have replaced their old manager with new manager Chris Millington who is a very well regarded Gaffer. Chris knows this level well, he's recently brought in some great players, he's now got a few back from injury and Solihull are now flying up the table and close to the top of the form guide.

For me if I was a betting man I'd fancy Solihull Moors to go very close to taking the last play off place this season and though I feel the top six might be beyond them after their slow start, I do feel under Chris Millington that they have already got themselves within touching distance of Southend United who sit in seventh. So for me if they maintain their form, keep their players fit and continue their momentum I can see them nicking that last play off place.

In terms of our injuries, we have both Tom White and Erico Sousa out for a good while. Tom has now successfully undergone his hamstring operation pre Christmas and we are hopefully now on a 10 week rehabilitation countdown for his return.

Erico, after a quite ridiculous challenge at Wealdstone, will undergo a scan tomorrow [Wednesday] once the swelling has gone down on his knee, but at this point we must plan for the worst and hope for the best.

On a more positive note, it's good to report that Luke Norris is now back fully fit after he tweaked his groin in the Carlisle United warm up, and with Marley Marshall-Miranda now signed on a permanent basis, they are both good to

go. That means we should be strong this evening and no doubt Lewis Richardson, with eight goals already in both league and cup, and Charles Clayden, will see Erico's injury as an opportunity for them to shine and get more game time.

I can also report that our little midfield dynamo Jon Benton has been released from his contract by mutual consent. Jon is a bright lad who knows his mind and he has chosen to go into the City full time in accountancy and go part time as a footballer. Jon did great for me, you and for this football club, he played a huge part in last season's play off promotion win and I'm very thankful to him and glad we can forever share those promotion memories. So for me to help Jon deal with the next stage of his personal journey was not difficult, based on his honesty and circumstances. So can I say on behalf of the football club, staff, dressing room and supporters "good luck Jon and thank you once again for being such a huge part of our promotion season".

Other Club News:

There is such a lot going on in regard to the South End of the ground, including finalising the funding applications, laying out the supporting evidence and all things in between, that at times it makes your head hurt. That said, I do have to deliver a scheme to our partners at HBC, EBTC, AFC and residents that works for all stakeholders..

As you know, there has already been a series of delays for one reason or another, there has also been some serious project price increases based on me perhaps wanting all the sweets in the sweet shop haha, but luckily I've come to my senses.....because my out of control South Stand wish list has meant other than watching the Carlisle United

and Wealdstone games, I've spent most of Christmas re-working the budgets.

Even as I write these notes, I'm still a fair few quid over where I want to be but I'm prepared to underwrite the current figures personally to get my Community Infrastructure Levy [CIL] bids into the Council while completing my Football Foundation and Elstree and Boreham Wood Town Council bids. If I can complete these things in January, it will give me an outside chance of keeping the project on schedule.

With timeline pressures mounting off the pitch, I do hope Luke and the dressing room can continue our home form and get us another positive result this evening but these things are never easy. A win would obviously keep our momentum going and keep people's expectations growing, which in truth I do not want to dampen.

For me, the football being played is so exciting to watch and makes me very happy, especially as the South End project is full of red tape, lots of box ticking and a lot of one step forward two steps back at this stage. All of that means I should anticipate a lot more behind closed door meeting with my architect, QS, contractors, business partners, long term sponsors and all local stakeholders. All of which means we must complete a variety of funding applications by January 5th as the clock really is ticking and time is running out.

Trust me this project will genuinely be ground breaking, for me it's a "legacy build" and of course that takes time, as it challenges everyone and must be done correctly. If we do it well it will change the local landscape, and transform this Football Club, transform Meadow Park and will I believe treble the third party spend in and around the club and the local area.

Tonight though is all about staying in touch with the leading teams in our division who do not appear to be showing a weakness. That said we must deal with ourselves and deal with a very good Solihull Moors team and try and continue our very positive festive period league form. That form has seen us beat a very good Carlisle United team here 2-0 nine days ago and then saw us quietly deal with local rivals Wealdstone at their place 4-0 on Boxing Day.

I really must now thank all our home fans for your fantastic support in both of those festive games, as we got our best home crowd of the season against Carlisle United and that win I believe then resulted in our biggest away following of the season turning up at Wealdstone.

I hope that both of those performances might convince more of you to turn out this evening and in the future, because if you do, this squad will strive to give you great performances to show our gratitude as we strive to dream the impossible dream.

Finally can I wish everyone of all ages and both our old and new fans a very happy, healthy and peaceful New Year. For many of you, I know as we enter a New Year, that you may be without a loved one for the very first time as they've passed and I know that is such a difficult and emotional pill to swallow.

Please trust me when I say the tears will come but you are not alone on New Years Eve or on any other night for that matter. Always know there are many of us out there who understand how you are feeling and know how long the nights seem to last. Trust me the pain does ease and those great memories will return but it does take time.

No doubt I'll be raising a glass and a silent prayer to my remaining family and to all absent family and friends, who are all etched in the lines on my face and on the palm of my hands.

To the younger generation amongst the 'Wood Army', who have their whole lives in front of them, I hope you enjoy the greatest New Year of your young lives. Life genuinely passes you by very quickly so enjoy it to the hilt and I wish you everything that you would wish yourselves and so much more.

As an aside, our 'Wood Army' youngsters have brought such energy and such vibrancy to our football club over the last two seasons and their efforts cannot be underestimated. As such I'm more determined than ever to give you all a community football club that will one day sit within the Football League - but until that time, always stay with us, always stay loyal and always stay patient - it's the Wood way and it has served us well.

Good evening, firstly I would like to welcome Chris Millington, his Staff and Players to Mangata Developments Stadium for tonights Enterprise National League fixture.

Chris has done an incredible job since taking over back in October, currently sitting 4th in the form guide averaging just shy of 2points per game having built a side that possesses real quality throughout.

He has steadied the ship and now looks on course for a late charge to get into the play-offs and with his experience and know how I wouldn't put it past him.

They arrive here this evening having achieved back-to-back victories scoring eleven goals and only conceding two. This will give them belief for tonight and we are under no illusions of how tough the task will be.

For us we also have had a really positive Christmas period and want to finish off this calendar year with a positive performance and result tonight.

Having faced Carlisle here 10 days ago and then travelling to our local rivals 5 days later, gaining maximum points from both matches was very pleasing.

The way in which we navigated our way through two very tough fixtures was a testament to the squad and the level of consistency they are showing currently.

The way in which we performed over large periods in both matches was extremely pleasing, both sides presenting different challenges and for us to assess, acknowledge and adapt is a credit the boys.

The way in which the squad has progressed since pre-season has been brilliant, we had a team meeting last week and I praised them about the speed in which they have grasped all this new information and the way in which they are learning.

We are seeing sides present slightly different to how they have been prior with alternative opposition, this in itself is a challenge for us. With all our analysis and prep we don't leave no stone unturned and we will always pre-empt slight changes in how they may look to affect us.

This is why our "concept" has been such a success this year, we are extremely fluid in the way in which we look to take control of the game. However, the opposition try to press us we have solutions for all scenarios and that has been evident in our play.

The boys understand and appreciate how to roll in and out of shapes to create certain overloads to

give us the best opportunity of progressing up the pitch and attacking their goal.

We have showed in recent weeks very good variation, we are not one dimensional and have many ways of scoring goals, even as recently as Wealdstone away we scored four and two of them were from restarts.

This has been an area we have addressed for us to improve and I have to say we have seen an increase in return which is going to be fundamental if we are to maintain doing what we are doing.

We have another 10 game review coming up and we will look at how the previous matches have gone and also look at where we need to improve.

This dressing room is one that likes to be challenged and most definitely has an intrinsic mindset attitude which for me is great, it allows for me and the staff to continually look for improvement and growth which is huge for any teams progression.

We have quietly improved the squad over the last month or so with some permanent additions and short-term loans. We now understand we are in a delicate position with our next few signings, getting the right quality but also maintaining the harmony of the group is going to be key.

We want to go into the New Year with all this confidence and belief, giving us the best opportunity of creating some memories for this Season.

I want to wish all the fans a healthy & happy 2026 and I'll look forward to seeing out 2025 with you guys this evening ending our calendar year with a huge 3points.

Get right behind the players and give them the energy to continue the great work they are currently doing.

After failing to make a mark on the Gillingham first-team, the 27-year-old signed for Herne Bay after a plethora of loan stints at clubs including Margate and Cray Wanderers. It wasn't until his move to Billericay Town in 2022 where he demonstrated his attacking credentials, registering 46 goals contributions in his final season before a switch to professional football.



Conor WILKINSON

Born: 23 January 1995

Position: Forward

An experienced striker who has also represented the Republic of Ireland at youth level, Conor Wilkinson has played the vast amount of his football in the Football League. The Millwall youngster started out at Bolton Wanderers before making the switch to Gillingham in 2017, becoming recognised as a seasoned goal-scorer in further stints at Dagenham & Redbridge, Leyton Orient and Walsall. After spending a season in Scotland with Motherwell, Wilkinson headed south to Solihull and has netted two goals in nine appearances.

After early chances for James Clarke and Osborne, the visitors took a deserved lead on 39 minutes when Beck powered home a header from a corner. Wood struggled to respond before the interval and went in behind. Luke Garrard's side showed greater intent after half-time, forcing early corners and threatening through Jamal Fyfield, who went close from distance.

However, hopes of a Wood comeback were dented as Solihull struck again on 53 minutes as Osborne produced a superb 25-yard drive that beat the goalkeeper. Wood pushed hard in the closing stages and pulled one back in stoppage time through David Agbontohoma's header, but Solihull's defence held firm under pressure to secure a 2-1 victory away from home.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war solihull Moors goalscoring favourites

DARREN MIDDLETON

Ex-England Youth striker Darren Middleton was Solihull Moors' top scorer in 2007-08. Born in Lichfield, the son of Harry Middleton, he was a trainee at Aston Villa and Wolves and joined Stafford Rangers in August 2000. He moved via Forest Green Rovers to Worcester City in August 2001. Joining Moor Green in June 2004, he remained with the merged club, scoring Solihull Moors' first competitive goal to clinch a 1-1 draw at home to Barrow in August 2007. He moved to Chasetown in July 2009, then played for Leamington. Employed as a manager in the Shirley branch of Lloyds TSB, he became director of football at the Lichfield City Academy.

JAKE EDWARDS

Big, bustling striker Jake Edwards was Solihull Moors' top scorer in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Born in Manchester, he grew up in New Jersey and joined Wrexham in August 1998. He had spells at Telford United, Charleston Battery and Yeovil Town before joining Exeter City in July 2004. Helping take Manchester United to an FA Cup third round replay, he then played for Crawley Town, Tamworth and Burton Albion. He moved to Solihull Moors in August 2008. Becoming the club's commercial manager, he was appointed vice-president of the USL Championship in July 2013, then president two years later. He is now chief executive of Huddersfield Town.

RYAN BESWICK

Winger Ryan Beswick was Solihull Moors' leading marksman in 2010-11. Initially with Leicester City, he was loaned to Redditch

United prior to joining Kettering Town in May 2009. He moved via King's Lynn to Solihull Moors in September 2009, skippering them to the Conference North title in 2015-16. Scoring their first goal in the Conference National, he played over 230 games before joining Nuneaton in May 2017. He joined Tamworth in July 2018 but rejoined Nuneaton in June 2022 and skippered them to the Southern League Premier Division Central play-offs. Appointed Quorn's player-boss, he led them to the Northern Premier League Midlands title.

OMAR BOGLE

England Semi-Pro international striker Omar Bogle was Solihull Moors' top scorer in 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15. A former youth player with West Brom, Birmingham City and Celtic, he joined Hinckley United in March 2012. He moved to Solihull in July 2012 and netted 62 goals in 111 games prior to joining Grimsby Town in June 2015. Scoring twice in their 2016 Conference National play-off final success, he was also an FA Trophy finalist that season. He joined Wigan Athletic in January 2017, since playing for Cardiff City, Birmingham City, Portsmouth, Charlton Athletic, Doncaster Rovers, Hartlepool, Newport County and Crewe.

AKWASI ASANTE

Dutch striker Akwasi Asante was leading marksman when Solihull Moors won the Conference North title and Birmingham Senior Cup in 2015-16. Born in Amsterdam to Ghanaian parents, he turned professional with Birmingham City in January 2011. He was loaned to Northampton and Shrewsbury, joining Kidderminster in December 2014. Moving to

Solihull Moors in July 2015, he was top scorer again in 2016-17 and netted 28 goals in 61 games. He followed Marcus Bignot to Grimsby in January 2017 and rejoined Solihull on loan in October 2017. Joining Tamworth in February 2018, he then played for Chester, Gloucester, Chesterfield and Darlington.

ADI YUSSUF

Tanzania international striker Adi Yussuf was leading marksman when Solihull Moors finished second in the Conference National in 2018-19. A former Leicester City trainee, he was loaned to Tamworth before joining Burton Albion in August 2011. He had spells at Oxford City, Mansfield Town, Grimsby Town and Barrow, moving to Solihull in January 2018. Starring as they reached the FA Cup second round proper in 2018-19, he scored 19 times in 57 games before joining Blackpool in May 2019. Loaned back to Solihull in September 2019, he joined Yeovil Town in August 2021, then played for Gateshead, Brackley Town, Halesowen and Redditch.

ADAM ROONEY

Former Republic of Ireland U-21 striker Adam Rooney helped Solihull Borough take Wigan Athletic to an FA Cup first round replay in 2021-22. He was Stoke's youngest-ever hat-trick scorer at Brighton in April 2006. Joining Inverness Caledonian Thistle in August 2008, he was top scorer in their 2009-10 Scottish First Division title triumph. He played for Birmingham and Oldham before starring in Aberdeen's 2014 Scottish League Cup final win. Joining Salford City in July 2018, then Solihull in March 2020, he helped reach the 2022 Conference National play-off final and netted 13 goals in 53 games. He later played for Stratford, Brackley and Hereford.

JOSH KELLY

Striker Josh Kelly was Solihull Moors' leading marksman in 2023-24. He played for hometown Windsor before joining Maidenhead United in July 2015 and featured in their 2016-17 Conference South title campaign. Loaned to Chalfont St Peter and Walton Casuals, where top scorer in 2017-18, he was Maidenhead's leading marksman in 2021-22 and joined Solihull Moors in July 2022. He helped them qualify for the

Conference National play-offs and reach the FA Trophy final in 2023-24, netting 25 goals in 79 games before moving to AFC Wimbledon in January 2024. He featured prominently as they won promotion via the League Two play-offs in 2024-25.

MARK BECK

Ex-Scotland Youth striker Mark Beck scored twice for Solihull Moors in the 2024 FA Trophy final. Initially with Carlisle United, he was loaned to Falkirk before joining Yeovil in July 2015. Moving to Darlington in August 2016, he was top scorer in 2016-17. He joined Harrogate in November 2017, winning the Conference North play-offs in 2017-18, then the Conference National play-offs and FA Trophy in 2019-20. Returning to Darlington in July 2022, he joined Solihull in January 2023 and helped reach the Conference National play-off final in 2023-24. He netted 11 goals in 58 Conference games before joining Scunthorpe in November 2024.

ANDY DALLAS

Scottish striker Andy Dallas was top scorer when Solihull Moors reached the Conference National play-off final in 2021-22. Signing professional for Rangers in June 2016, he was loaned to Stenhousemuir, helping win promotion in 2017-18, then Greenock Morton before joining Cambridge United in July 2019. Moving to Solihull in August 2021, he scored all five goals in their 5-0 win over Dover in January 2022 and was leading marksman again in 2022-23. He netted 32 goals in 77 games and was loaned to Chesterfield, scoring in the 2023 Conference National play-off final. Joining Barnsley in July 2023, he has since been loaned to further clubs.

Truro City manager John Askey believes his side can still avoid relegation after a vital 1-0 victory over Yeovil Town boosted their National League survival hopes.

Although the Tinnies remain bottom of the table, the win reduced the gap to safety to just three points. Truro have now won two of their last three matches following a run of five straight defeats.

Askey is optimistic that strong home form against Tamworth, Brackley Town and Scunthorpe United can keep them in contention. Speaking to BBC Radio Cornwall, Askey praised his players' resilience and spirit, insisting that picking up points, regardless of performance, is key to staying in the division.



A BOOST FOR BRAINTREE

Braintree Town have completed the signing of forward Aramide Oteh. The 27-year-old became a free agent after leaving Welsh champions The New Saints in November and had recently been on trial with Scunthorpe United.

Oteh brings a wealth of experience, having featured in the Champions League qualifiers for TNS in July. He began his career in the academy at Tottenham Hotspur and has since enjoyed spells with several EFL and non-league clubs, including QPR, Salford City, Crawley Town and Walsall.

Braintree have not confirmed the length of Oteh's contract, but his arrival adds proven attacking quality and experience to their squad as they continue their National League campaign.

MINSTERMEN HALTED IN TITLE PURSUIT



York City suffered a slight blow to their title hopes as they were forced to share the spoils in a 2-2 draw with Boston United at the LNER Community Stadium last time out.

Ollie Pearce continued his fine goal-scoring form as he broke the deadlock with 38 minutes on the clock, the 30-year-old netting his 20th league goal of the campaign. Ollie Banks' red card just after the hour-mark proved to be the shift in the game as Graham Coughlan's side equalised courtesy of Alex Lankshear ten minutes later.

It looked like a fifth away win of the season was on the cards for the Pilgrims when Connor Teale netted four minutes from time. However, Josh Stones had the final say as he struck six minutes into additional time to ensure it was honours even.


