Tonight we welcome our good friends from Yeovil Town to Meadow Park, may I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well other than the National League Cup, it's not been the best of starts to the New Year for us, either with our results or performances. In truth we've hit a bit of sticky patch and that coincided with us picking up a few injuries to key players and Jeff King's loan ending.

As such as we look to steer ourselves into calmer waters, let's remember the positives, let's continue to be honest with each other, as we still sit safely in a Play Off place and we've worked our socks off over the last two seasons to get ourselves into this position. In truth if we're going to have a sticky patch, much better it comes now while we can still wheel, deal and tweak the squad.

If we don't overreact to the current set back, if we're sensible we can do something long term about it, rather than wait until later in the season when the non league transfer window closes at the end of March and when we've already entered the final run in.

Let's be honest when we went top a little over a month ago, I know myself, the 'Wood Army' and our wider community's expectations went through the roof and while we were top (which wasn't for long) we loved every minute of it and so we should.

If like me in early January you were literally on cloud nine that's perfectly

understandable, as we were in the 3rd Round of the FA Cup, we were Top 3 in the league and the football we were playing was outstanding and we were all possibly dreaming the impossible dream of the EFL.

Today the situation is slightly different, as two very good sides in Rochdale and York City have got away from the rest of us and the title is now a straight fight between those two ex Football League clubs. However, for us the Play offs and a top 5 league finish is still very realistic.

Thankfully it appears that some of our injured players are now slowly coming back and our squad certainly looks a lot stronger than it has over the last month. When looking back over the last 18 months we actually went through three sticky spells last season but found ways to turn things around because we were focused, motivated and desperate for promotion, trust me nothing has changed this season.

Of course you need certain things like a good budget, club unity, good players, a good structure and real togetherness, but firstly you must deal with any weak mindsets, any self doubt, the poor excuses. Those things are honestly debilitating if they take hold within a dressing room or amongst the wider staff. In truth self weakness like that gets on my nerves, especially when it's from our weaker known characters who are always looking to find a ready made excuse that suits their me, me, me disposition.

Thankfully most of the people wrapped around me are over achievers and the sooner everyone settles down, focusses on the next 10 weeks and deal with their own jobs, the teams current form, their own self doubt, then the better things will turn out for everyone.

When the singular recognises the collective then the sooner we will arrest this bump in the road and I expect that to happen this evening. In truth I don't want to keep hearing about Jeff King going back to York City, as for me it's a complete irrelevance now.

Trust me Jeff was very good but he's not Rushy, he's not Bushy, he's not Brunt and he's certainly not Abdul. Jeff's a very good right back but that's it, so let's all get over a right back departing and find a way to deal with finishing the season well and winning the Play-offs without him.

For me there are some big questions that need answering tonight regarding some of the players within our squad and whether they are quite good enough both mentally and physically to fill the injured players' boots in the heat of battle. In all honesty everyone within the squad has had more than enough time in both training and in games, to of put down a marker down and we've had more than enough time to assess all of these things.

I say this, because we're at a very critical stage of the season and so we might in all honesty need to bring in one or two

more players to re-balance the squad especially down the right hand side, plus add someone up top.... Luke Garrard and Charlie Hunter must now decide if the players who have recently been given a chance during the injured players' absence have done enough to keep Erico Souza, Callum Reynolds and Tom White out of the side when they return and can the squad players if needed get us promoted?

Put simply the above might sound harsh but I'm a winner and I want success for my town, so I'm more than happy to spend my children's and grandchildren's inheritance to back Luke and Charlie Hunter in the transfer and loan market again, but only if the right players and right characters become available.

That said, tonight is a further opportunity for some of the squad players to send a real message to the gaffer, by showing him their attitude, discipline, desire and performance is of a level to be winners and they are ready for the run in. In terms of our last league outing here against Boston United, we were ok at best, 1 up at half time, we were coasting without ever looking great but by anyone's reckoning we were in very little danger of ever losing the game.

A silly penalty is then given away early in the second half, a red card is dished out to Femi Ilesanmi and the game changes in an instant - that's football I'm afraid. A second red card is then given to Regan Booty for foul language and suddenly we're 2-1 down and instead of sitting third

in the league and on the leaders tails, we're sitting in 5th and those around me instantly talk about pressure.

Trust me the talk of pressure and me listening to peoples reasoning about pressure is complete nonsense. There's no pressure on me as an owner nor as a club when we're sitting in a Play-off position. It's not a pressure situation it's just an expectation thing and long may your expectations stick around at Meadow Park, as it means we're all doing something right.

Anyway enough of my diatribe, let's get back to tonight's game, where we welcome a rejuvenated Yeovil Town under new ownership. Yeovil are coming here after winning 1-0 up at Altrincham on Saturday and in truth I watched the game on DAZN and they did a smash and grab number on Alty and so we can expect a very difficult game this evening.

Lastly, whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.



He also has experience as an England youth international as recently as 2024 with the U20 side.



Luke McCORMICK

Born: 21 January 1991

Position: Midfield

Midfielder Luke is an experienced midfielder with spells at several EFL clubs. He was on the books of Chelsea whilst gaining first team experience at both Shrewsbury & Bristol Rovers before being released. The 27-year-old has arguably hit his best spell of his career this season, after joining at the start of this season and scoring eight times in 25 appearances. He was rewarded with a new contract recently, extending his deal until 2028.



Harvey GREENSLADE

Born: 8 April 2004

Position: Forward

Formerly of Bristol Rovers all the way through youth level, striker Harvey will provide the threat on the last line for the visitors. A man who has experiences at various levels of non-league, including time with Chippenham Town, Truro City and Oxford City, his experience earned him a professional contract with The Gas before leaving for Yeovil in 2024. He currently has 3 goals so far this season in seven starts.

Wood were unbeaten since game week two in tough conditions set by Storm Amy, they took the lead 20 minutes in when Abdul Abdulmalik burst down the left, skipping past Andrew Oluwabori before curling a shot home.

Jeff King was then denied by the post from a free-kick from distance before Matt Rush doubled the lead in first-half stoppage time, turning in a cross from Charles Clayden.

Wood were knocking on the door for a third and nearly got it through Clayden after Jed Ward got a superb fingertip to his curling effort. Femi Ilesanmi got a decisive third just after the hour however, turning in the loose ball after Clayden's mis-hit shot, but Rush was offside when he had the ball in the net for a fourth time late on.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Yeovil Town goalscoring favourites

ERIC BRYANT

Centre-forward Eric Bryant was leading marksman as Yeovil Town reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1948-49. He represented the Army during wartime service and joined Mansfield Town in May 1946, topping their goalscoring charts in 1946-47. Moving to Huish in July 1948, he scored Yeovil's winner against top-flight Sunderland in the epic 1948-49 FA Cup fourth round upset and joined Plymouth Argyle in October 1949. He reunited with Alec Stock at Leyton Orient in July 1951, then played for Chelmsford City, Poole Town, Dorchester, Swanage and Wareham. Settling in Wareham, he died in November 1995.

FRANK FIDLER

Centre-forward Frank Fidler scored twice for Yeovil Town in the 1956 Southern League Cup final. A former Manchester United amateur, he starred as Witton Albion twice won the Cheshire League title and joined Wrexham in May 1950. He moved via Leeds United to Bournemouth in December 1952 and was leading marksman in 1953-54. Joining Yeovil in July 1955, he was top scorer in 1955-56 and netted 70 goals in 92 games before moving to Hereford United in July 1957. He starred in their 1959 Southern League Cup final success, then played for Bridgwater. Settling in Farnborough, he died in November 2009.

DAVE TAYLOR

Ace marksman Dave Taylor holds Yeovil Town's goalscoring record. Signing professional for Gillingham in September 1957, he joined Portsmouth in June 1959 and followed Basil

Hayward to Huish in July 1960. He scored a record 59 goals as Yeovil won the Southern League Cup in 1960-61, also starring as the Gloves won the Southern League title and reached the FA Cup third round in 1963-64, then won the Southern League Cup again in 1965-66. Netting a club record 285 goals overall for Yeovil, he joined Bath City in March 1969 and later played for Cheltenham, Bath again and Glastonbury. He died in March 2017.

CLIFF MYERS

Attacking midfielder Cliff Myers starred in Yeovil Town's 1970-71 Southern League title triumph and netted the goal that beat Bournemouth in that season's FA Cup to earn a lucrative third round tie at home to Arsenal. He turned professional with Charlton Athletic in September 1964 and gained League experience prior to joining Brentford in July 1967. He reunited with Ron Saunders at Yeovil in January 1968 and netted 84 goals in 330 games before joining Torquay United in July 1973. Linking up with Mike Hughes again at Salisbury, he later ran the Sunburnt Arms bar in Lindos, Rhodes until his death in February 2019.

DICK PLUMB

Striker Dick Plumb was Yeovil Town's top scorer on four occasions. Initially with hometown Swindon, he joined Bristol Rovers in April 1965 and played against Arsenal in the 1966-67 FA Cup fourth round. He moved to Huish in October 1968, starring as Yeovil were Southern League runners-up in 1969-70. Joining Charlton Athletic in September 1970, he had a spell with Exeter City before

returning to Yeovil in January 1974. He featured as the Glovers were Southern League Cup finalists in two consecutive seasons, netting 150 goals in 337 games overall prior to joining Chard Town in July 1978. Still living and working locally.

JOHN McGINLAY

Versatile striker John McGinlay was capped 13 times by Scotland after leaving Yeovil Town. Initially with Nairn County, he joined Yeovil in March 1985 and was top scorer in 1985-86. He starred alongside Paul Randall in their 1987-88 Vauxhall-Opel League title triumph and netted 56 goals in 147 games for the Glovers, briefly returning to Scotland with Elgin City before joining Shrewsbury Town in February 1989. After spells with Bury and Millwall, he joined Bolton Wanderers for £125,000 in September 1992 and was an important figure in three promotion successes. He later played for Bradford City and Oldham Athletic.

GUY WHITTINGHAM

Striker Guy Whittingham was Yeovil Town's leading marksman in 1988-89. Initially with Oxford City and Waterlooville, 'Corporal Punishment' joined Yeovil in November 1988 and netted 18 goals in 23 games for the Glovers prior to joining Portsmouth in June 1989 after buying himself out of the Army. He was top scorer as Pompey were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1991-92 and qualified for the play-offs in 1992-93. Sold to Aston Villa for £1,200,000 in August 1993, he later played for Wolves, Sheffield Wednesday, Pompey again and Wycombe. He managed Newport (IW) and Newbury, then was coach and manager at Pompey.

MICKEY SPENCER

Striker Mickey Spencer topped Yeovil Town's goalscoring charts on four occasions. A former soldier, like Guy Whittingham, he represented the Army and had a spell with Wokingham before joining Yeovil in February 1989. He scored in the Glovers' 1990 Bob Lord Trophy final triumph and netted the first goal in a competitive match at the new Huish Park against Colchester United in August 1990. Starring as Yeovil reached the FA Cup third

round in 1992-93, he appeared against eventual winners Arsenal and netted 104 goals in 281 games before moving to Bath City in March 1995. He later played for Salisbury City.

WARREN PATMORE

England Semi-Pro international striker Warren Patmore was Yeovil Town's top scorer in four successive seasons. Initially with Northwood, he joined Cambridge United in March 1992, then had spells at Bashley and Millwall before moving to Northampton Town in December 1993. He was briefly with Ards prior to joining Yeovil in July 1995 and starred alongside Howard Forinton in their 1996-97 ICIS League title triumph. Netting 68 times in 149 Conference games, he joined Rushden & Diamonds in June 2001 and scored their first-ever League goal, then played for Woking, Margate, Hayes and Hemel Hempstead.



PHIL JEVONS

Striker Phil Jevons was leading marksman in Yeovil Town's 2004-05 League Two title triumph. Signing professional for Everton in November 1997, he helped win the FA Youth Cup in 1998 but had few chances and joined Grimsby Town for £150,000 in July 2001. He was loaned to Hull City before moving to Yeovil in July 2004 and also topped their goalscoring charts in 2005-06. Netting 42 times in 84 League games, he followed Gary Johnson to Bristol City in July 2006 and was leading scorer in their 2006-07 promotion success. He joined Huddersfield Town in November 2007, then Morecambe, Hyde and Stockport County.

MAHADY TO STAY WITH THE IRON

Scunthorpe United have extended the loan spell of Leeds United goalkeeper Rory Mahady until the end of the season.

The 19-year-old Scot initially joined the Iron in October and has made 14 appearances for the National League side.

Before that time period, the Scotsman had spent plenty of time at Elland Road developing his craft in the Premier League 2 after making the move from Celtic, working across both the U18 & the U21s during his time in Yorkshire.

Andy Butler's team are sixth in the table, 10 points clear of eighth-placed Southend as they bid to secure a play-off spot.



FOREST GREEN LOAN IN READING DEFENDER

Forest Green Rovers have signed right-back Ashqar Ahmed on loan from League One side Reading for the remainder of the season.

The 18-year-old Royals academy graduate has broken into their first team over the past 18 months, making 24 appearances including nine in the league this campaign.

He made his debut for Reading in August of 2024, making his league debut just a few months later and was rewarded for a strong spell last term with a new two-year contract with the club.

He joins The Green looking to gain valuable first team experience and help Robbie Savage's side push towards a return back to the football league.

SAVAGE TO STAY AT THE NEW LAWN



Robbie Savage says links to the vacant Blackburn job are "pure speculation" and that he "can't wait to see through" his project.

The 51-year-old former Wales international midfielder played 100 games for Blackburn from 2005 to 2008 before a move to Derby and was among the bookmakers' favourites to replace Valerien Ismael as boss at Ewood Park.

Savage spoke on Thursday morning : "It's purely speculation. I have loved my time here. I have got a great relationship with [the board], we are on a journey and a project and it's something that I can't wait to see through. There's nothing at all for the fans to worry about."


