# DANNY HUNTER

***Today we welcome Hartlepool United to the Mangata Developments Stadium Meadow Park, can I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.***

Well as a club it's fair to say we've had a very good season to date, including a decent March and an up and down beginning of April and we now need to see it through. We also now have most of our injured players back and that has helped us cement a top 4 or 5 league place ahead of the play offs.

We have I feel played open, attacking football throughout this season, we've entertained the fans both home and away with a string of decent performances and on top of that we've won the National League Cup on a wonderful night for our football club and town.

With three league games left we will need three wins from three to put any pressure on Carlisle United in third but

that's a real long shot and we possibly need two wins from three to secure fourth place and one win from three to secure fifth.

Either way to finish third, fourth or fifth would be an incredible achievement for a newly promoted club of our size, especially with one of the smaller fanbases. Let's be honest, nobody at the start of the season had us in their play off conversations. Most had us in a relegation fight and in truth after some poor pre season performances in July, I thought most people's relegation battle forecasts were pretty accurate.

That said, when you've been through what we've been through in recent years, you learn what you need to do a touch earlier, and through past mistakes

we knew exactly what was required to strengthen our squad and we got on with it, only this time quietly, calmly and intelligently.

After relegation two seasons ago and promotion last season, we now know our strengths, we also know our shortcomings and that helped keep us a long way from a relegation battle this season. We of course carry the scars from past play off defeats against Tranmere Rovers, Harrogate Town and Notts County and we remember the hurt of our recent relegation, but as I said we've all learnt lessons.

Last May after beating Dorking Wanderers, Torquay United and Maidstone United when winning the National South play offs, we got busy pretty quickly regarding player targets in post season. We knew how good promotion felt and were happy to be back within the National League, but also understood what it had taken to get ourselves back to this level and what was needed to push on.

I won't lie, much of the above was pressure, pressure, pressure. This time round it's just pleasure, pleasure, pleasure. During my time here this is by far and away the best footballing side this club has ever produced and very soon we will enter the National League Play offs for the fourth time in my tenure, only this time our expectation levels must be quite different.

In boxing terms, I believe we have a punchers chance of going to the EFL this season and I hope we go into the Play Offs with a bit of momentum like we did last season, while we do have belief

in what we're doing, especially now we have most of our injured players back.

We've already achieved a record points total for us at this level, we've already scored a record number of goals in a season and we've already won the National League Cup. As such there is a positivity and confidence around the club and town, and the feeling is now more expectation and excitement rather than pressure and in truth that's exactly how I feel.

People since the turn of the year have text, emailed or asked me, if we can win the play offs with all of the big ex football league clubs lying in wait? They also want to know how we've improved ourselves so much over the last 12 months?

To answer the first question, can we win the play offs? Thats simple, "of course we can, we are a very good side, have a very good manager, have very good players, our recruitment has been good and with our amazing staff anything is possible".

In terms of how have we improved ourselves so much this season? Again my answer is simple, "For me it's been more about a mindset change, a togetherness, an improvement in both the squad and in our investment. When you add in great recruitment and management you have your answer".

Every season there is a surprise package and this season we are the surprise package so don't over analyse it just enjoy it. I feel one of our biggest strengths, is that we know who we are and we embrace being a small club

amongst the many big clubs. We don't pretend to be anything other than who we are, we don't live in the past like many of the ex football league clubs at this level, but importantly we also don't get the type of pressure from our support base that those bigger clubs have to deal with.

We accept some supporters will always call us tinpot no matter what we do, but as a small club owner I'm very happy to say "I love being in the National League", and though I'm content, that doesn't mean I wouldn't bite your hand off for just one chance to take this football club into the EFL.

That said, I don't believe football owes me anything, as we've come up the hard way and battled our way through the lower leagues. I feel we've done it without fuss, whinging, parachute payments, entitlement, running up debt, calling other clubs tinpot or going in and out of administration. We are simply a very hard working, small community club who try to learn from our past mistakes. This season we are near the top of the league on merit and I think we're a very good side.

As an aside off the park, we will soon begin building our new South Stand and associated facilities, that includes new boundary lines, pathways, a new lighting design, digital turnstiles, additional signage, additional toilets, catering units, away fans bar and much more.

With a fair wind I'm going to create a fantastic new away fan zone to look after all of our visitors in the manner that we would like our supporters to be treated on their travels. We'll do the build in three

phases over the next 18 months, as we must build a new access road into the stadium via the Brook Road Car Park.

We will build a new grounds/maintenance building with additional storage space and wheel wash, as having a great pitch and a happy grounds team is so important to the way we now play. We must also create a new control room to UEFA specification and PA system which is all part of the overall project.

In addition we will build a new community hub, which will include two new dressing rooms, a manager's and sporting director's office, a new analyst suite and dining area, a medical and performance centre and we'll put in a host of additions like WiFi, CCTV, TV's and alarm systems throughout, that will help me make our club fit for the EFL.

The overall project, including the new South Stand, will take us around 18 months to complete and will raise our capacity to around 5,750. I feel we must plan for some unexpected overages and as such our project could perhaps top £4 million.

This project though, will bring huge benefits to our club, our town and our wider community, through additional third party spend that will help support local hotels, local pubs and local restaurants. Additional footfall through the town will also help our retailers, newsagents, petrol stations and even the train station etc while no doubt our match-days and match-night visitors will use our local car parks and bring hundreds of thousands of pounds into our local economy.

I've ensured that at every stage of my project projections and throughout its complex design, that the estimates, guesstimates, consultants fees and the ground reports needed were firstly achievable and secondly manageable.

I know more than anyone that I can only move us forward if we get to the build stage carrying no historic debt and if I do that then I can afford to take my three phase development forward. I have a self policing policy here, in that I only spend what I can underwrite and that means on occasions I need to delay or do things slightly slower and step by step.

In truth my risk averse policy has not changed much in my 27 years here and I do try and explain this to all the new club owners in the National League who ring me and there's quite a few of them who do. As an 'old school' Chairman, my advice to all the new club owners at our level both domestic and foreign who make contact, is to slow down, take stock of where you presently sit, look at all things moving forward more cautiously, and before you let strangers (who you hardly know) start spending your money, do your own due diligence on them and their companies.

I say that because in my opinion most of these agents, consultants and advisors in football are complete chancers and are not remotely trained or monetarily regulated. In the main they are only looking after themselves, most have no schooling or track record in business and if they get things wrong they will not take any of the blame or be around for long.

My message to all owners is simple "it's

down to you and only you to take your club forward. Football ownership at our level is like a marriage and it's your responsibility to be in it for the long haul and to love, honour and care for your club and its community with steadfast honesty and loyalty. As a new owner it's always, always, always down to you not others.... it's you who must ensure your money is spent wisely from the outset, and not spent by consultants or others in an ad hoc manner, because trust me when your money has gone or been heavily depleted these people will move on to their next victim.

At that point an owner will end up with a manager, staff and players you don't want and you are then sacking consultants, staff and managers you don't trust. The supporters will quite rightly be watching everything as it's their club. The club then looks like it's in disarray and in a panic, and if you're not careful over the following few years it can become a situation of wash, rinse and repeat - but what do I know?

In truth the very loyal supporters at most big non league clubs, have over many years been lied to, shortchanged, in some cases fleeced and they're now a group of damaged, distrusting and hurting supporters who simply love their club but choose to live in the past.

So I tell all the new owners and chairman who get in contact with me, "if you're lucky you will perhaps get 12 months grace before your supporters patience starts to wain. If your lucky you might perhaps get another 6 months to turn it round if they like you - but that's it. So for me they must understand the clock

is ticking from day one, as 18 months is absolutely no time to turn things round in football unless you get incredibly lucky.

So if they've not hit the ground running then all new owners are going to need either a massive dollop of Lady Luck to keep their supporters and sponsors onside or will need a very thick skin, either way it becomes a lot more difficult to keep the loyal fans onside in a toxic environment.

Lady Luck certainly played a huge part in our success last season. So after spending a small fortune to challenge in National South, we entered the play offs but only in fifth place. We then stole and I mean stole a 4-3 quarter final win against Dorking Wanderers, after trailing 3-1 with just 7 minutes left in what was the most amazing game I've ever witnessed here at Meadow Park.

We literally got ourselves out of jail that night. We went and beat Torquay away 1-0 in the semis and in the final against Maidstone we won 1-0 in front of a full house here to win ourselves the most unlikely of promotions and we were suddenly off life support.

We have since made the very best use of that luck to build ourselves a new club, with a more talented squad but trust me we got lucky.... as I often tell you "god loves a trier" and after winning promotion and just 2 days after beating West Ham United here in the National League Cup Final we have had our long standing planning application for the South End of the Stadium finally approved.

Hopefully my experience as a long standing club owner, chairman and film

prop master, will help with both our planning, design and budget when we finally begin our legacy build in May. For transparency, not everything is in place financially at present but with the help and support I've received to date from HBC, EBTC, AFC, AWFC, Football Foundation, National League and Premier League (not EFL) the stadium and facility investment is very nearly there and the partners listed above all share my vision for our community football club.

We've built a very solid structure here, we already have a very good manager and a very good dressing room. If you couple those things with good recruitment and good business practice, it means even a small club like ours within the National League can reach for the stars and have a chance of achieving the impossible dream.

As I've said you really do need Lady Luck at times, and our improvement has also coincided with the quicker than expected progress made by three quite exceptional young players in Abdul Abdulmalik, Matt Rush and Charlie O'Connell. Their growth this season has been way beyond expectation and when you throw in the rest of our squads' collective improvement, you realise we now have all the ingredients to bake our cake and watch it rise.

We are a club who are not financially crippled with historic debt, and that has really helped us this season, as I could sanction and approve some very big signings by our standards. As such I approved certain targets and Luke and Charlie Hunter went and brought in Zak Brunt, Regan Booty, Lewis Richardson, Tom White and James Clarke (my

northern boys). They also brought in two more local lads in Marley Marshall-Miranda and Ollie Kensdale.

In truth both Charlie and Luke have great knowledge of the National League as a whole. They also have great knowledge of the Premier League, Championship Academies and the EFL and it's evident that knowledge hugely benefits us. Good recruitment showed itself earlier in the season with two very good short term loans in Finn Herrick from West Ham United and Jeff King from York City. When both Finn and Jeff's loans had ended they were replaced with the loans of Ted Curd, Leon Ayinde and Josh Landers from Chelsea, Ipswich Town and West Ham United respectively and all of these boys have strengthened us and added belief to our squad.

Anyway that's enough of my diatribe, today is all about trying to secure fourth or fifth place to give us home advantage in the play off quarter finals. It's all about us maintaining momentum and trying to secure three points this afternoon by beating a very difficult opponent in Hartlepool United. No doubt Luke has worked on a game plan and if the dressing room can post a win this afternoon it will take us closer to where we need to be. The bigger picture, as always, perhaps become more apparent by around 5pm, as results elsewhere might tell us if we've secured 5th place.

If it has, we know we'll have at least one home game within the play offs to look forward too...however before the play offs come round, we will need our community to keep supporting this very talented dressing room by getting themselves,

their friends and family down to an ever improving Meadow Park facility.

Please, please please, continue to bring your passion, your energy, your noise, the flags and the drum to the North Bank. If we want a chance of seeing ourselves in the EFL next season, then every one of us must play our part, as "we're in it to win it".

For me the play offs are a partnership, a partnership where our supporters look to our dressing room to perform and our dressing room looks to our supporters to turn up and make the noise - together I believe we can do this!!!

Finally whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

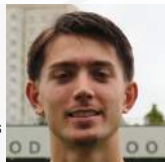

Featherstone made over 380 appearances across nine seasons, winning promotion in 2021, and later became permanent manager last year following a successful interim spell.

# ONES TO WATCH



## Tom PARKES

**Born:** 15 January 1992

**Position:** Defender

Experienced defender Tom Parkes began his career at Leicester City, progressing through their academy and gaining experience via loan spells with Burton Albion, Yeovil Town and Bristol Rovers. He joined Bristol Rovers permanently in 2012, captaining the side and earning Player of the Year as they secured promotion. Later spells included Leyton Orient, Carlisle United, Exeter City and Livingston. He signed for Hartlepool United in 2024, becoming captain last year. Parkes also represented England at under-17 level.



## Adam CAMPBELL

**Born:** 1 January 1995

**Position:** Forward

Forward Campbell came through the Wallsend Boys Club and debuted for Newcastle United at 17 in Europe. He gained experience through loans, notably scoring on debut for St Mirren. After spells with Notts County and Morecambe, he thrived in non-league with Darlington and Gateshead, winning the National League North. He later helped Crawley Town secure promotion before joining Hartlepool United. He too represented England at youth level.



## Alex REID

**Born:** 6 September 1995

**Position:** Forward

Reid came through Aston Villa's academy before spells at Walsall and in Sweden with Ånge IF. After impressing at Rushall Olympic, the forward joined Fleetwood Town in 2017 and later plied his trade for Stevenage, with further loans before joining Stockport County. A move to Oldham Athletic and a prolific loan at Wealdstone followed. Last year, Reid made the move to the North East, continuing his career with the Pools and becoming their top scorer so far this campaign.

Luke Garrard's side controlled much of the contest, creating the better openings throughout a lively first half in which Matt Rush and Luke Norris were both denied by an in-form Harvey Cartwright, while Abdul Abdulmalik repeatedly threatened without reward.

The Pool caused occasional danger on the break, but their task became far tougher early in the second half when Max Kouogun was sent off for hauling down Norris. Wood pressed relentlessly against the depleted hosts, yet struggled for composure in the final third, with efforts from Jeff King and Norris either off target or well blocked by a resolute defence.

# HARTLEPOOL UTD

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Hartlepool United goalscoring favourites

### ERIC WILDON

Centre-forward Eric Wildon topped Hartlepool United's goalscoring charts in four successive seasons. He impressed with Price's in local football before moving to Hartlepool in December 1947 and made his League debut three months later. Scoring four times against Wrexham in October 1950, he also grabbed hat-tricks in consecutive home games against Barrow and Bradford PA that season and netted 87 goals in 200 League outings prior to joining Stockton in July 1955. He was later an electrician at ICI, then ran a newsagent in Stainton until April 1984 and resided in Middlesbrough until his death in September 1998.

### KEN JOHNSON

Long-serving centre-forward Ken Johnson holds Hartlepool United's all-time goalscoring record. Born locally, he turned professional with Hartlepool in May 1949 and scored on his League debut at home to Bradford City seven months later. He netted the penalty that took Nottingham Forest to an FA Cup fourth round replay in 1954-55 and was leading marksman as Hartlepool finished Third Division (North) runners-up in 1956-57. Scoring a club record 98 goals in 384 League games before leaving in May 1964, he subsequently ran a fish and chip shop in Hartlepool until June 1997 and died locally in December 2011.

### TOMMY McGUIGAN

Scottish inside-forward Tommy McGuigan was Hartlepool United's top scorer in 1954-55. Previously with Ayr United, he joined Hartlepool

in August 1950 and was an experienced figure as they took Nottingham Forest to an FA Cup fourth round replay in 1954-55. He also helped 'Pool finish Third Division (North) runners-up in 1956-57, facing Manchester United in that season's FA Cup third round and netting 75 goals in 325 League outings before moving to Spennymoor United in July 1958. Later playing for South Shields, Wingate and local side St Mary's, he became a steelworker and died in Hartlepool in December 1997.

### GEORGE LUKE

Skilful outside-left George Luke starred as Hartlepool United were Third Division (North) runners-up in 1956-57. Signing professional for hometown Newcastle in December 1950, he moved to Hartlepool in October 1953 and was an influential figure as Fred Westgarth's team took Nottingham Forest to an FA Cup fourth round replay in 1954-55. He missed just one match in 1955-56, netting 60 goals in 186 League games before rejoining Newcastle in October 1959 and appearing in the top-flight. Later with Darlington and South Shields, he ran a carpet business in his native Newcastle until retiring and died in March 2010.

### ERNIE PHYTHIAN

Former England Youth centre-forward Ernie Phythian was Hartlepool United's leading goalscorer in two consecutive seasons. Signing professional for Bolton Wanderers in July 1959, he had few opportunities in the top-flight and moved to Wrexham as part of the Wyn Davies deal in March 1962. He helped clinch promotion and played in two Welsh Cup finals, moving to Hartlepool in June 1965. Featuring in their 1967-

68 promotion campaign, he netted 51 goals in 124 League outings before joining South African side Southern Suburbs in June 1968. He was later a car salesman in Johannesburg and died in August 2020.

### KEITH HOUCHEN

Striker Keith Houchen was Hartlepool United's leading marksman in four successive seasons. A former Chesterfield junior, he moved to Hartlepool in February 1978 and formed an exciting partnership with Bob Newton before joining Orient in March 1982. He joined York City two years later and starred in their 1984-85 FA Cup run, then moved via Scunthorpe to Coventry City in June 1986. Scoring in their 1987 FA Cup final triumph, he joined Hibernian in March 1989 and returned to Hartlepool from Port Vale in July 1993. He became player-boss, netting 92 goals in 279 League games overall until dismissed in November 1996.

### BOB NEWTON

Powerful striker Bob Newton starred in Hartlepool United's 1977-78 FA Cup run. Signing professional for Huddersfield Town in November 1973, he moved to Hartlepool in August 1977 and played alongside Keith Houchen. He joined Port Vale in September 1982 and was leading marksman in that season's promotion success. Moving to Chesterfield in October 1983, he was top scorer in their 1984-85 Fourth Division title triumph and rejoined Hartlepool in July 1985. He netted 50 goals in 161 League games overall, then had spells at Stockport County, Bristol Rovers and Goole Town, becoming a lorry driver in Chesterfield.

### JOE ALLON

Ex-England Youth striker Joe Allon was Hartlepool's top scorer on four occasions. Signing professional for Newcastle United in November 1984, he joined Swansea City in August 1987 and was a promotion winner in 1987-88. He moved to Hartlepool in November 1988 and equalled the club record with 28 League goals in their 1990-91 promotion success. Sold to Chelsea for £250,000 in August 1991, he had spells with Brentford, Port Vale and Lincoln City before rejoining Hartlepool in

October 1995. He scored 67 times in 168 League games overall until injury ended his career in February 1998, becoming a match summariser.

### TOMMY MILLER

Attacking midfielder Tommy Miller starred as Hartlepool United qualified for the Third Division play-offs in two consecutive seasons. He turned professional with Hartlepool in July 1997 and made his League debut in their 3-1 win at Chester three months later. He was leading marksman in 1999-2000, moving to Ipswich Town for a club record £800,000 in July 2001. Helping qualify for the Championship play-offs in 2004-05, he joined Sunderland in July 2005, then played for Ipswich, Sheffield Wednesday, Huddersfield, Swindon and Bury. He rejoined Hartlepool in August 2014, netting 35 goals in 153 League games overall.

### ADAM BOYD

Striker Adam Boyd was leading marksman as Hartlepool United reached the League One play-off final in 2004-05. Born locally, he turned professional with Hartlepool in September 1999 and helped them qualify for the Third Division play-offs in successive years before featuring in their 2002-03 promotion success. He was sold to Luton Town for £500,000 in August 2006. Moving to Leyton Orient in August 2007, he was top scorer in 2007-08 and rejoined Hartlepool in May 2009. He netted 69 goals in 236 League games overall, then had spells with Celtic Nation, Lincoln City, Spennymoor Town and Bishop Auckland.

## TRURO VOW FULL-TIME FUTURE

Truro City will remain a full-time professional club despite relegation to the National League South, chairman Eric Perez has confirmed.

The Tinners' drop was sealed by a late defeat to Yeovil Town, with manager John Askey calling the season "embarrassing." However, Perez insists the club's ambitions remain unchanged, emphasising their commitment to bounce back at the first attempt.

He described the decision as a sign of belief and forward planning rather than retreat. Truro showed resilience in their first match after relegation, earning a 1-1 draw with Forest Green Rovers. Askey praised his players' effort and highlighted strong fan support, expressing confidence the club can rebuild and return stronger next season.



## SOUTHEND OVERHAUL SPARKS SENIOR DEPARTURES

Southend United are undergoing a major restructure that will see chief executive Tom Lawrence and head of football John Still depart, alongside several staff changes. Still leaves immediately, while Lawrence will remain until the end of the season.

The National League club plans to introduce new director of football and general manager roles to improve accountability and streamline operations. First-team coach Jason Demetriou will also exit this summer.

Chairman Justin Rees insisted the overhaul is about long-term stability rather than cost-cutting, despite ongoing financial challenges. The changes come as Southend push for the play-offs and prepare for an FA Trophy final at Wembley, highlighting a pivotal moment both on and off the pitch.

## LATE STRIKE SENDS WORTHING TOP



Worthing climbed to the top of the National League South with a dramatic 2-1 victory over Dorking Wanderers, sealed by a late winner from substitute Remiero Moulton.

After a bright first half in which the visitors created the better chances, they fell behind shortly after the break when Charlie Carter fired Dorking ahead. Worthing responded quickly, with Razzaq Coleman De-Graft continuing his fine form by levelling the score just minutes later.
