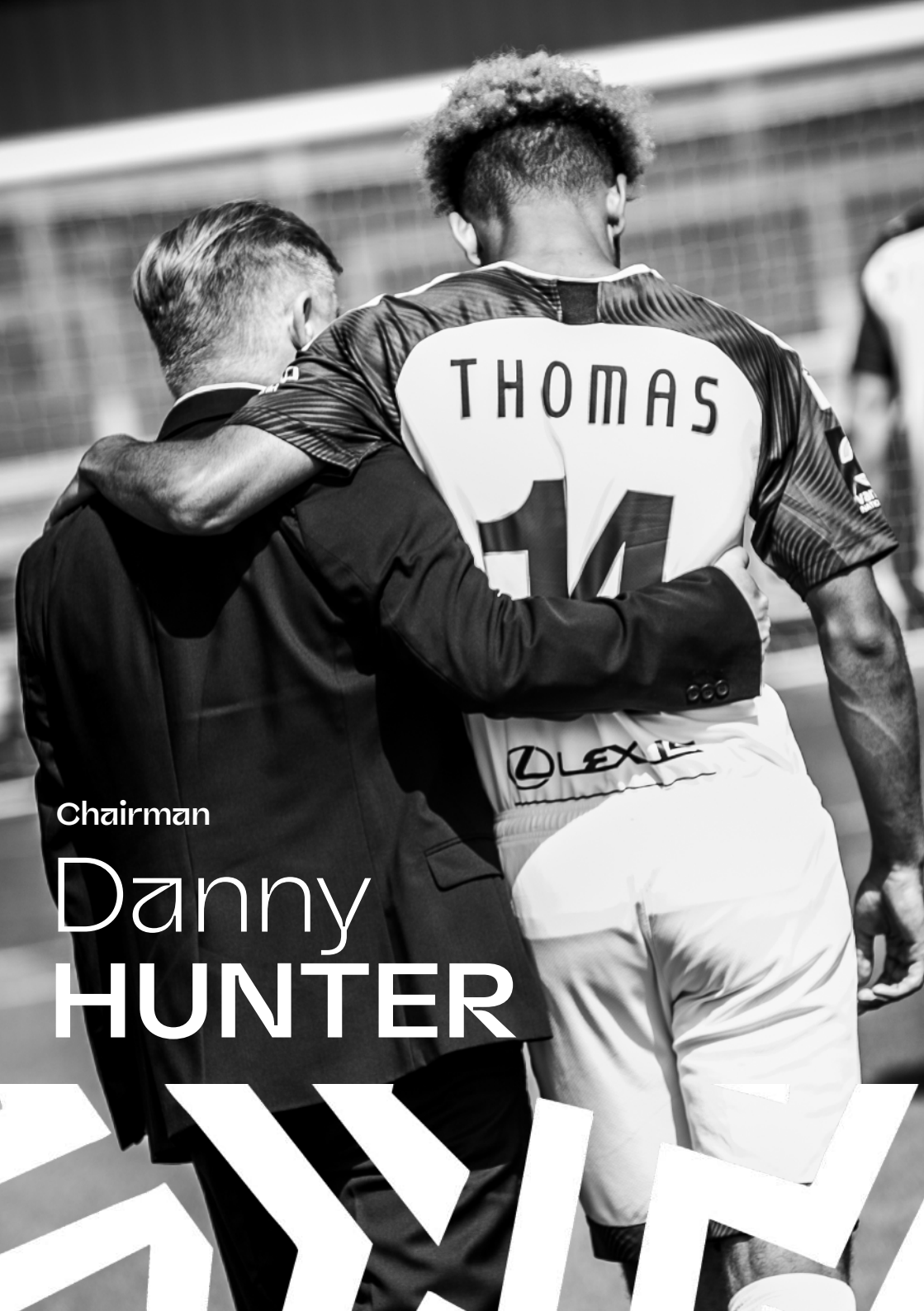

Good evening everyone and welcome to Meadow Park for tonight's final pre-season fixture against a talented Norwich City XI.

In terms of our preparations for the new season, we have applied ourselves in excellent fashion, and on Tuesday we beat a robust and hard working Dagenham & Redbridge side 2-1 away. Before that we beat a very good Spurs XI here 2-1 and drew with a talented Arsenal XI, too. On the previous Tuesday we enjoyed an very comfortable 8-2 win away at Real Bedford after starting pre-season by beating a very strong Watford side 2-1 here at Meadow Park.

Pre-season for me, especially this season has been painful and a bit "after the Lord Mayor's show" following our late play-off defeat on penalties at Wembley. As such, it's been about me dealing with myself, ensuring that both this club and my ambitions are well documented and understood by other clubs, our players, my staff and my Finance Director, as it's still about looking ahead and adding four, five, six or seven players to last season's squad.

I'm an experienced Chairman and of course it's all about balancing things out sensibly and creating a more competitive budget across the club, but that must be done by working smart not stupid as that way we enhance our quiet ambition.

After our Wembley defeat, I decided to send our existing players and footballing staff down to Barnstaple for a week to be looked after by my great friends John, Matthew and Max Brend from the Brend Hotel Group. I did this as part of a healing process, as it's also part of the players education about why this club cares, why it overachieves more times than not and why some monies are well spent in certain areas.

It's not cheap to send this club down to Barnstaple for a training camp but it is especially vital this pre-season to bond once again, for the newbies to get to know each other and us just a little better. Also, for those who were still quietly suffering from Wembley disappointment to start to heal mentally and know that that pain will forever shape them but for now it must be put to bed because as with any new season "hope does spring eternal", and if we want success then it's down to us to use pain as fuel, to work harder, to refocus on our ambitions and in layman's terms "let's go and achieve it".

The club's immediate future is me looking at what I feel is needed regarding our staffing levels, looking at how our infrastructure is managed and working through what our short to medium term investment goals are to move ourselves forward.

On the downside of all that, is

the honest conversations needed with some people who might not feature as much as they'd like once the league campaign starts, because experience tells me no game time affects a player's mindset and his attitude.

With some players and I've said this before, it's not easy telling them that they might need to look for a new club for their own benefit or to prolong their own playing careers, especially as most players just want to secure more game time. That was certainly the case with my great friend Femi Ilesanmi and similar for Aaron Henry and Junior Dixon.

After this evening's game, the new 2026/27 season is almost upon us. I hope as many of you as possible would have brought your season tickets for no other reason than they are incredible value, this is your local community club, we are striving for a promotion push and in all my time here, this team really is worth watching and this club really is worth supporting.

Next Thursday at 6:30pm, we've decided before the season starts, that we will have a Q&A session with myself and Luke in the Glass House, but strictly for season ticket holders and sponsors. It would be great to touch base with some of you before our home game to Tamworth on the Saturday, so I hope you can join us?

Please note, you must all pre-book your place on the night in advance, as I'll arrange a bit of food for you all, but as I said it's only for 2026/27 season ticket holders and sponsors only, and it is a private event on this occasion.

For me a Q&A gives me a chance to have a bit of fun with all of our season ticket holders, and it also gives Luke the chance to explain the season ahead and his post and pre-season decisions. Whilst we can also all speculate on why Jermaine Defoe and Stuart Maynard have departed Woking and York City in such strange circumstances... Yes folks, the football season really is back.

Also, on this occasion the Q&A will give me the chance to introduce our new Media Manager to you, explain all the changes we've needed to make within our community department, detail all our transfers etc., both in and out, and explain why further investment is needed and the planning obstacles I'm still facing at the South End of the ground...

Anyway, back to this evening, whoever you support let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

Review: 2025/26 season



Norwich City Under-21s endured a challenging 2025/26 Premier League 2 campaign, finishing 23rd after recording five wins, five draws and ten defeats. Despite their league position, the Canaries showed plenty of promise throughout the season, producing encouraging victories over Newcastle United and West Bromwich Albion while competing against some of the country's strongest academy sides.

The young squad scored 32 goals across their 20 league fixtures but found consistency difficult to maintain, conceding 42 at the other end. Although they missed out on the Premier League 2 play-offs, the campaign provided valuable experience for a number of emerging talents, with several players continuing their development in a demanding environment as they pushed closer towards senior first-team football.

Olly Lee is the Head Coach of Norwich City under 21's, having taken charge in November 2024 after previous coaching roles with Tottenham Hotspur and Ipswich Town. A former professional midfielder, Lee made more than 300 senior appearances during a career that included spells with Luton Town, Heart of Midlothian and Gillingham after progressing through West Ham United's academy.

Since moving into coaching, Lee has developed a reputation for nurturing young talent and preparing players for the transition into senior football. His coaching philosophy places a strong emphasis on high-intensity, possession-based football, alongside creating an environment where players can develop both technically and mentally. Under his guidance, Norwich's under 21's continue to compete in the Premier League 2, providing a platform for the club's brightest academy prospects to progress towards first-team football.

One's to watch



Ken **ABOH**

Powerful, quick and direct, Ken Aboh is one of Norwich City's most exciting young attacking prospects. The 21-year-old forward progressed through the Canaries' academy before making his senior debut in a 5-0 Championship victory over Rotherham United in March 2024. Comfortable playing as a central striker or in the wide attacking areas, Aboh is renowned for his pace, strength and ability to stretch defences. To aid his development, Aboh has gained valuable senior experience during loan spells with League One side Stevenage, League Two outfit Colchester United and National League side Boston United, while also featuring regularly for Norwich City's under 21's.

Miles **BRACKING**



Central midfielder Miles Bracking joined Norwich City from Brighton & Hove Albion in 2024 and is regarded as one of the club's brightest young prospects. Comfortable in a holding or box-to-box role, he is recognised for his composure in possession, range of passing and ability to dictate the tempo of games. Eligible to represent England, Zimbabwe and South Africa, Bracking became a regular for the Canaries' under 21's during the 2025/26 campaign.

Elliott **MYLES**



Creative attacking midfielder Elliott Myles is one of Norwich City's most exciting academy talents. The Wales under 21 international signed his first professional contract in 2024 before making his senior debut later that year in the Carabao Cup against Stevenage. Capable of playing as a number 10, winger or second striker, Myles is renowned for his creativity, close control and eye for goal.

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** profiles ten leading Norwich City Managers

Archie MACAULAY

Former Scotland international right-half Archie Macaulay managed Norwich City to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1958-59 and promotion in 1959-60. He helped Glasgow Rangers twice win the Scottish League prior to joining West Ham in June 1937, then moved via Brentford to Arsenal in July 1947. Featuring in their 1947-48 League Championship success, he had a spell with Fulham, becoming Guildford's player-boss in June 1953. He coached Dundee, then managed Norwich from April 1957 until October 1961. After managing West Brom, he guided Brighton to the Fourth Division title in 1964-65. He died in June 1993.

Ron SAUNDERS

Ron Saunders managed Norwich City to the Second Division title in 1971-72. A former England Youth centre-forward with Everton, Tonbridge and Gillingham, he was top scorer in Portsmouth's 1961-62 Third Division title triumph, then had spells at Watford and Charlton. Briefly managing Yeovil and Oxford United, he became Norwich's boss in July 1969 and took them to the 1973 League Cup final. He joined Manchester City in November 1973, then led Aston Villa to two League Cup final wins and the League Championship in 1980-81. Later managing Birmingham and West Brom, he died in December 2019.

John BOND

John Bond managed Norwich City to promotion and the League Cup final in 1974-75. A long-serving full-back with West Ham, he starred as they won the Second Division title in 1957-58 and FA Cup in 1964. He reunited with Frank O'Farrell at Torquay in January 1966, helping clinch promotion, then was

Gillingham's coach before becoming Bournemouth's manager in May 1970. Plotting promotion in 1970-71, he managed Norwich from November 1973 until joining Manchester City in October 1980. He led them to the 1981 FA Cup final. Later managing Burnley, Swansea, Birmingham and Shrewsbury, he died in September 2012.

Ken BROWN

Ex-England international centre-half Ken Brown plotted Norwich City's 1985 League Cup final triumph. Signing professional for West Ham in October 1951, he starred as they won the Second Division title in 1957-58, FA Cup in 1964 and ECWC in 1965. He joined Torquay in May 1967, then had a spell with Hereford before assisting John Bond at Bournemouth and Norwich. Succeeding him as the Canaries' boss in November 1980, he guided them to promotion in 1981-82 and the Second Division title in 1985-86. He remained in charge at Carrow Road until November 1987, then managed Shrewsbury and Plymouth.

Dave STRINGER

Dave Stringer managed Norwich City to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1988-89 and 1991-92. An England Youth defender, he turned professional at Carrow Road in May 1963 and was ever-present in Norwich's 1971-72 Second Division title triumph. He helped win promotion in 1974-75 and appeared in two League Cup finals, netting 18 goals in 419 League games before moving to Cambridge United in September 1976. He starred as they twice won promotion and rejoined Norwich as youth-team boss in November 1980. Managing the Canaries from December 1987 until May 1992, he was then assistant Academy director.

Mike WALKER

Mike Walker managed Norwich City to third place in the Premier League in 1992-93. Initially with Reading, the Welsh U-23 goalkeeper had spells with Shrewsbury and York City prior to joining Watford in September 1968. He starred in their 1968-69 Third Division title triumph and 1969-70 FA Cup run, moving to Colchester in June 1973. Ever-present seven times, he was a key figure in their 1973-74 and 1976-77 promotion campaigns, becoming their manager in April 1986. He managed Norwich from June 1992 until joining Everton in January 1994, then was the Canaries' boss again between June 1996 and April 1998.

Nigel WORTHINGTON

Ex-Northern Ireland international left-back Nigel Worthington managed Norwich City to the First Division title in 2003-04. Initially with Ballymena, he joined Notts County in July 1981 and followed Howard Wilkinson to Sheffield Wednesday in February 1984. He starred in their 1991 promotion and League Cup 'double', then was an FA Cup finalist in 1993 and reunited with Wilkinson at Leeds United in July 1994. Later with Stoke City, he managed Blackpool, then Norwich from January 2001 until October 2006, taking them to the First Division play-off final in 2001-02. He later managed Northern Ireland and York City.

Paul LAMBERT

Former Scotland international midfielder Paul Lambert managed Norwich to the League One title in 2009-10 and back to the top-flight in 2010-11. He played for St Mirren, Motherwell and Borussia Dortmund, starring in their 1997 European Cup final triumph, before joining Celtic in November 1997. Helping to win the Scottish Premier title four times and reach the UEFA Cup final in 2003, he managed Livingston, then guided Wycombe Wanderers to the League Cup semi-finals in 2006-07. He became Colchester's boss, then managed Norwich from August 2009 until June 2012, Aston Villa, Blackburn, Wolves, Stoke and Ipswich.

Alex NEIL

Alex Neil managed Norwich City's 2015 Championship play-off final success. A former midfielder with Airdrie, Barnsley and Mansfield, he played for Hamilton Academical in the 2005 Scottish Challenge Cup final and helped them win the Scottish First Division title in 2007-08. He became Hamilton's player-boss in May 2013 and guided them back to the Scottish Premier League in 2013-14. Appointed Norwich's boss in January 2015, he remained in charge until March 2017, then managed Preston and became Sunderland's boss in February 2022. Plotting promotion that season, he has since managed Stoke City and Millwall.

Daniel FARKE



German manager Daniel Farke guided Norwich City to the Championship title in 2018-19 and 2020-21. Initially with hometown SV Steinhausen, he was a striker with Paderborn-Neuhaus, SV Lippstadt, SV Wilhelmshaven, Bonner SC, Lippstadt again and SV Meppen before becoming Lippstadt's manager in June 2009. He plotted two promotion successes during a six-year reign, then managed Borussia Dortmund's reserves. Norwich's manager from May 2017 until November 2021, he has since managed Krasnodar, Borussia Monchengladbach and now Leeds United, taking them to the Championship title in 2024-25.

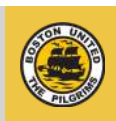
