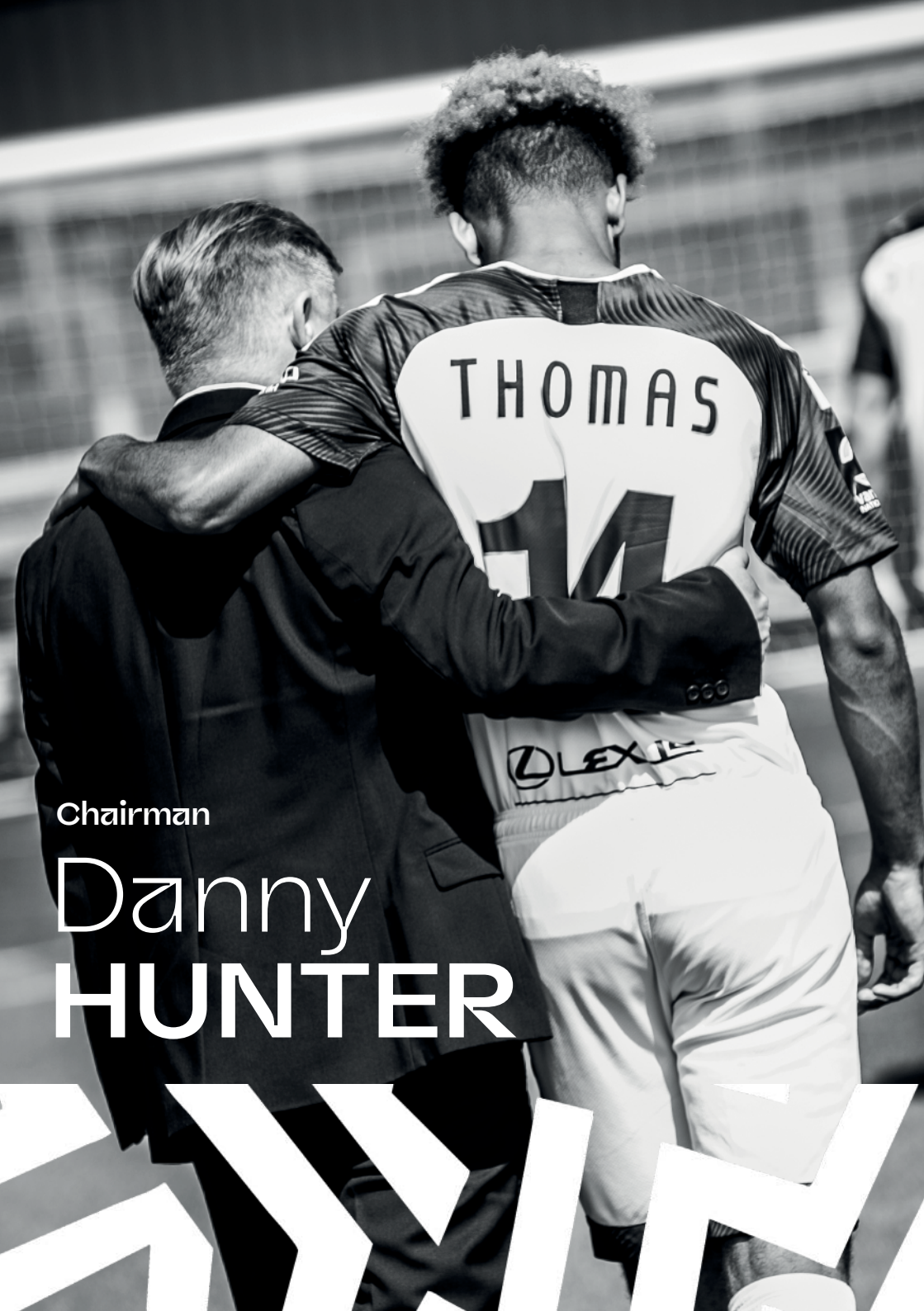

Good afternoon. Today we welcome our good friends from Tamworth to Meadow Park. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable afternoon with us and a safe journey home.

We have had a very positive pre-season programme, recording five wins and a draw from six varied games. That included an excellent week of fitness work and team bonding in Barnstaple. All in all, I'm excited and quietly optimistic about the season ahead.

For a club of our size to enter a new season with this level of ambition and expectation, both internally and among our supporters, says a great deal about our planning, our focus and the people driving this football club forward. Luke, my staff, our sponsors, partners, manager, players and supporters have all played their part.

To have turned the disappointment of relegation two seasons ago into the position we now find ourselves in is remarkable. I am incredibly proud to be leading this wonderful community football club as I begin my 28th season as Chairman.

I know this season will be challenging. There will be obstacles to overcome, but I also know we will be

competitive. We know where we want to go, we know our ambitions, and from the very first day we will be pushing for the play-offs. As I have promised, I will also continue working towards delivering a four-sided EFL-graded stadium over the next 14 months.

Other club news

To those season ticket holders and sponsors who attended Thursday's Q&A in the Glass House, thank you. We covered everything from players and transfers to agents, ambitions and the future direction of the club.

What I want to say here is simply this: your humour, kindness, knowledge and love for this football club genuinely energise me. As many of you see on social media, I'm constantly trying to do what's right for our community, our town, our club, our staff, our dressing room and our talented squad. It isn't always easy, but it's always worth it.

As an owner, you'll never please everyone all of the time. My approach has always been to trust my experience. After all these years, I believe my knowledge of running this football club will continue to guide me. As transfer speculation intensifies, I won't be distracted by the noise or rushed into making the wrong decision.

What I do understand is how to harness collective ambition and how to deal with individual behaviour when it becomes misguided. There has to be balance. Young players can sometimes receive poor advice, including being encouraged not to train or to down tools. At our level of football, however, predictable bullying tactics from people who aren't even contracted to a club cannot be allowed to succeed when so much of the posturing is unnecessary.

Before football, I built my career in the British film industry, property and sports education. Working on major film productions alongside some of the industry's finest directors, producers, designers and actors taught me how to manage pressure, process, ambition, negotiation and, occasionally, large egos. Compared to that, handling a difficult transfer doesn't intimidate me.

Equally, I understand that young players have emotions. I try to take both their talent and their circumstances into account, even when faced with selfishness, disruption, poor behaviour or simple immaturity.

Football is full of strong personalities, and I include myself in that. Right now, people I care about are being poorly advised. Downing tools to force through a transfer

will not make a deal happen in this case. Nobody likes hearing the word "no", but sometimes we all need to step back and understand what a good outcome looks like for everyone involved.

I'll continue to remain patient, listen to people's concerns and make sensible decisions while standing up to those who seek to bully smaller clubs. At 64, I understand the value of hard work and the value of a pound. I've never taken a wage from this football club, but I do understand what genuine talent is worth.

I remember exactly where I came from. I grew up in a broken home, left school at 15 without taking an exam and, by the age of 28, had bought my first house, become the father of five and was managing multi-million-pound film productions as a Prop Master for Warner Bros., Universal, Paramount, Miramax and many independent productions.

Growing up with very little taught me values, humility and the importance of hard work. Working on independent films with limited budgets taught me financial discipline, while later managing major productions taught me how to protect valuable assets. Those lessons have stayed with me throughout my career and throughout my time at this football club.

I know what exceptional talent looks like at this level. I won't be rushed into selling the family silver because of outside noise. I know the value of the player involved, and I understand the situation well enough to make the right decision when the time comes.

My upbringing also taught me how bullies operate. After 28 years as Chairman, I know exactly how football people react when they hear the word "no". I ask our supporters to trust my judgement because I have a long track record of building businesses, growing investments and helping this football club move forward.

Above all else, I know how to look after our supporters, our town, our community, our staff and this ambitious football club. Even after 28 seasons, I still believe we can overachieve. I still believe we can upset bigger clubs, develop outstanding people and players, and create an environment where everyone can flourish if they commit themselves fully.

At times, football's wages and demands bear little resemblance to reality, and some people struggle to accept that smaller clubs have every right to say "no". As I often remind myself: "Stick to the fight when you're hardest hit," and "God loves a trier." Agents, intermediaries and even players won't always

agree with my decisions, but my responsibility is clear: to do what is best for our staff, supporters, players, our community and this football club. Any decision we make must be right for all parties.

Anyway, that's enough about the transfer window.

This afternoon we face a talented and much-changed Tamworth side that completed the league double over us last season. We also have the opportunity to welcome several excellent new signings, who may make their competitive debuts today: Luca Gunter, Oli Bainbridge, Tyler Golden, Tarryn Allarakhia and Danny Cashman.

Finally, whoever you support, let's hope for an open, entertaining game and may the best team win.

Good afternoon. Firstly, I would like to welcome Andy Peaks and his Tamworth players and staff to Meadow Park for today's Enterprise National League opening fixture.

Tamworth arrive here after another successful campaign last season. I can imagine they will want even more success this time round, and that has been evident in their off-season business.

Having watched them live last Saturday against AFC Telford United, they still have the same characteristics of the side from last year, but have a lot more depth in their ranks, with undoubtedly more quality.

For us, it's been a very productive six weeks, with some really positive work on the grass, which has been transferred onto the pitch with some effective performances.

We knew when we came back on Monday 29th June, this group needed to be challenged and engaged from the off, especially considering how last season ended. They are a very receptive group with standards and are constantly demanding more from each other and from us as staff.

This, in turn, makes us even better as a management team, as we are being afforded the luxury to really stretch this group with so much more knowledge and understanding of how we want them to play.

I speak openly about having a concept and being fluid in the way we present against any opposition, and this was very evident across all our fixtures recently. Whether a team low blocks, mid-blocks or full presses, we have displayed many scenarios to the group during pre-season to problem-

solve and find many solutions to go and hurt the opposition.

We have principles which we must adhere to, and we also have "rules" in certain areas of the pitch which we have agreements with the squad, and they have to take full accountability for. However, the main thing we have with this dressing room is trust. They know they can play with a freedom and fluidity which gets the best out of this set of players.

We speak often about "what winning looks like", and that for me will be our biggest improvement. Yes, we have sharpened up our offensive patterns, shown more determination to counter-press and have an attitude towards defending, but there's an appreciation now to "what winning looks like" and how we must show characteristics of the complete side to achieve what we all want to achieve this season.

I'm excited to see the squad go into battle this afternoon. I have felt all week how ready they are, and they are fully chomping at the bit to go out there and perform to the level they can and achieve a huge three points to start the league campaign.

Get right behind them. This is the start of our journey. Show the energy and support that you all showed in abundance last year, and we will mirror you with a full-throttle performance that gives you the belief we are going to achieve something special this year.

I hope you enjoy the game and look forward to seeing you all.

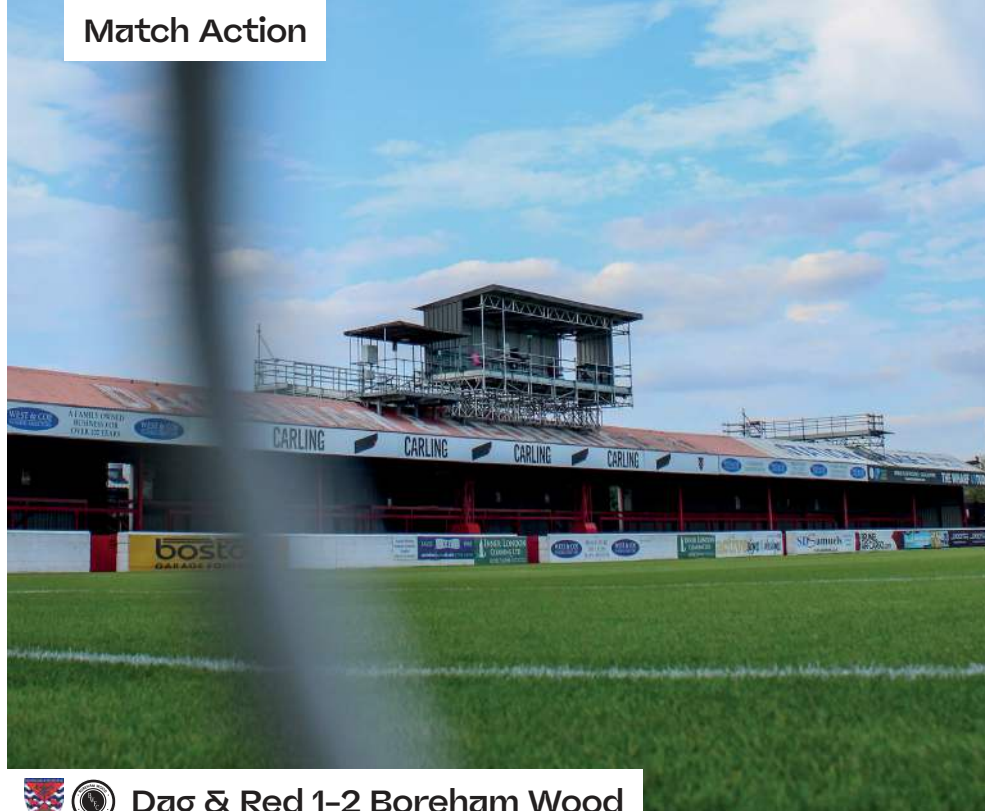

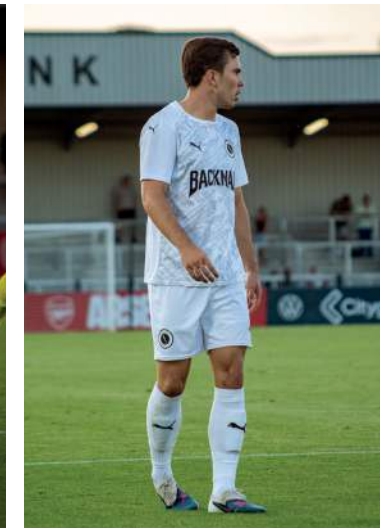

Boreham Wood 2-1 Norwich City XI

Boreham Wood rounded off an unbeaten pre-season campaign with an impressive 2-1 victory over a strong Norwich City XI at Meadow Park. Wood started brightly and took the lead after 18 minutes when Regan Booty released Tylor Golden, who finished confidently across goal.

Norwich responded just three minutes later, with Amankwah Forson finding Elliot Myles to fire beyond Luca Gunter. The visitors enjoyed spells of pressure either side of the interval, but Wood remained organised and continued to threaten going forward.

The winner arrived with 20 minutes remaining when Matt Rush's persistence was rewarded as his deflected effort found the near corner. Wood then saw out the closing stages to secure victory and complete their preparations positively ahead of the 2026/27 campaign.

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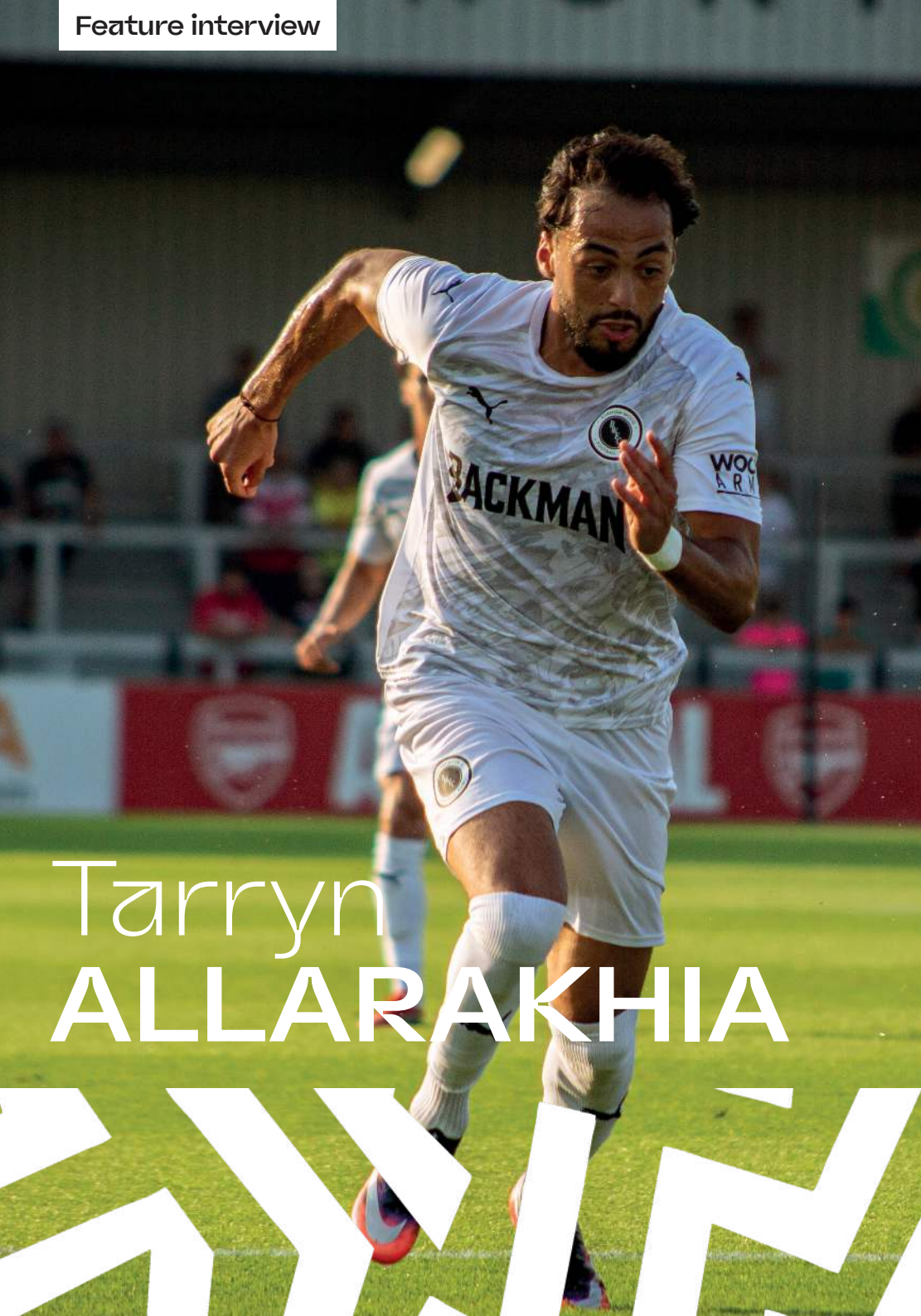


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Tarryn ALLARAKHIA

Tarryn Allarakhia knows what it takes to secure promotion from this division; a familiar foe having experienced the highs of doing so with Rochdale three months ago.

While the west end of Wembley Stadium suffered palpable heartbreak and unimaginable grief from penalty shootout heartbreak, those in the jubilant Rochdale end were experiencing contrasting emotions.

Celebrations were led by Allarakhia who netted several crucial goals last season for the Dale as they tussled with York City for the title, and he is ready to do it all again in Hertfordshire.

The Tanzania international is determined to replicate his promotion success as we embark on the league season.

"I think I can bring that experience and help the team on and off the pitch," he said.

"We know what we want to achieve this season and we also know that it is going to be tough.

"However, I know that the squad is ready for any challenges that come our way."

One of three new additions brought through the door as July began, Allarakhia has hit the ground running and given a glimpse of his explosive pace and agility in pre-season.

His infectious energy has already endeared him to a settled squad which has remained largely unchanged from last season and a sprinkling of stardust, which the 28-year-old certainly possesses, may be decisive in our promotion push.

Allarakhia explains how it has been a seamless transition into his new surroundings.

"I just try and show my qualities," he said.

"It is a really good group on and off the pitch so we must keep our standards high, which ever since I have come into the building, that is what we have done.

"I definitely feel the connections are getting closer and closer everyday.

"It is still early doors but it is showing encouraging signs and I am looking forward to the season.
"I am just trying to feed as much positive energy as I can around my teammates."

Tamworth present a challenging opening day opponent, one of only two sides to do the double over Luke Garrard's side last season.

They have primarily opted for experience this summer, bringing in National League know-how in the likes of Nathan Tshikuna and Tom Parkes. Meanwhile, they have also signed exciting talent who are yet to ply their trade at the level permanently with Jake Hutchinson and Tommy Fogarty.

The former Wealdstone and Woking wideman is keen to point towards the importance of starting the season strong.

"We are expecting a tough test," he admitted.

"Every game in the National League is hard and we need to expect teams will not make it easy for us this season.

"It is really important that we start strong and show our authority early on in the game and hopefully we can get all three points to start the season."

Allarakhia is back down south having enjoyed a successful two-year stint at Rochdale but the attraction of being closer to home will provide an added incentive to make his return a success.

The 12-time Tanzanian international cannot wait for Saturday's curtain-raiser.

"It's been an enjoyable start and the players and staff have made me feel welcome," he said.

"It was good to get minutes in pre-season but the main event starts now and we are so excited to get going and to play in front of our fans on Saturday.

"Hopefully I can bring my quality, energy and enthusiasm towards our goal but we have got a long way to go so we just need to take it step by step and see what happens!"

Review: 2025/26 season



Tamworth continued their progress during 2025/26, finishing 11th in their second season back at National League level. Under Andy Peaks, the Lambs built impressively on their first campaign, establishing themselves as a competitive and increasingly assured side in the division..

Star man Beck-Ray Enoru was again an influential figure before earning a permanent move to Notts County, while Stefan Mols also made a significant impact during the campaign. Tamworth produced several memorable results along the way, including completing an impressive league double over Boreham Wood.

An 11th-place finish underlined another encouraging season for Peaks' side, as Tamworth continued to consolidate their position in the National League and laid firm foundations for the 2026/27 campaign..

In the dugout: Andy PEAKS



Andy Peaks has overseen a remarkable period of success since taking charge of Tamworth in February 2022. After steering the Lambs clear of relegation, he masterminded back-to-back promotions, winning the Southern League Premier Central before securing the National League North title and a return to non-league's top flight.

Peaks further enhanced his reputation during a memorable 2024/25 campaign. Tamworth defeated League One sides Huddersfield Town and Burton Albion during a superb FA Cup run, earning a dream third-round tie against Tottenham Hotspur at The Lamb.

His side famously held the Premier League giants for 90 minutes before eventually losing 3-0 after extra time. Those achievements, alongside Tamworth's continued progress, have seen Peaks establish himself as one of the most respected managers in non-league football.

Boreham Wood 1-2 Tamworth

Tamworth produced a determined away performance to secure an impressive 2-1 victory over Boreham Wood at Meadow Park. The hosts made the brighter start and took the lead after 20 minutes when Matt Rush converted Jeff King's cross at the far post.

The Lambs responded just eight minutes later, with Ben Milnes keeping his composure to convert from the penalty spot and restore parity. The sides went into the interval level before Boreham Wood applied further pressure after the restart, only to find Jas Singh and the Tamworth defence in resilient form.

Tamworth made their opportunity count in the 72nd minute, breaking quickly through Beck-Ray Enoru, who released Manny Duku to finish confidently and put the visitors ahead. Wood pushed hard for an equaliser during the closing stages, but Andy Peaks' side defended resolutely to see out the contest and secure all three points.



Jas SINGH

Experienced and highly respected goalkeeper Jas Singh joined Tamworth in the summer of 2018 after previously representing Shrewsbury Town, Kidderminster Harriers, Solihull Moors, Gloucester City and AFC Telford United. A reliable presence between the posts, Jas has played a key role in the Lambs' success, earning the Players' Player of the Season award in 2021/22 and Manager's Player of the Season in the title-winning 2023/24 campaign. Now in his ninth season as Tamworth's first-choice custodian, Jas began the campaign approaching 350 competitive appearances for the club, highlighting his consistency, longevity and importance at The Lamb.



Morgan ROBERTS



Morgan Roberts previously worked under Andy Peaks during a loan spell at Rushden & Diamonds, while also representing Banbury United and Brackley Town. He helped Banbury win promotion to National League North in 2021/22 before joining League Two Swindon Town, later spending time on loan at Aldershot Town. Roberts subsequently returned to Brackley, where his impressive performances earned him a place in the National League North Team of the Season, despite the Saints suffering play-off final disappointment.

Tyler LYTTLE



Wolves academy graduate Tyler Lyttle began his senior career with Bristol Rovers before spells with Stafford Rangers, Hednesford Town, Sutton Coldfield Town, Rushall Olympic and Stourbridge. He later made over 100 appearances for Brackley Town, helping secure promotion in 2024/25, before making the move to The Lamb in summer 2026.

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** selects ten post-war Tamworth 'Classic Campaigns'

1963/64

John Bayliss was top scorer as Tamworth won the West Midlands League title for the first time in 1963/64. The Lambs won their first three games and a 3-2 victory over Hednesford in late December heralded a remarkable run of 21 straight wins, including a 6-1 demolition of Redditch, before they were held to a 1-1 draw at home to Dudley Town in their final match. They won 29 of their 36 West Midlands League games, finishing nine points ahead of runners-up Kidderminster Harriers. The Lambs also won the Staffs Senior Cup final, beating Brierley Hill Alliance 6-2 on aggregate, and were Birmingham Senior Cup finalists but defeated 3-2 by Kidderminster.

1965/66

John Bayliss was again leading marksman as Tamworth won the West Midlands League and Cup, Birmingham Senior Cup and Staffs Senior Cup in 1965/66. They kicked off with a 4-1 defeat at Wolves 'A', but soared to the top of the table with a 22 match unbeaten run before a shock 5-0 defeat at Dudley. The Lambs bounced back to hammer Lye Town, Port Vale Reserves and Halesowen in quick succession, scoring 123 goals and finishing nine points clear of runners-up Walsall Reserves. They beat Bilston 4-2 on aggregate in the League Cup final, Kidderminster 3-1 in the Birmingham Senior Cup final and Walsall Reserves 3-1 in the Staffs Senior Cup final.

1971/72

Tamworth won the West Midlands League and Cup 'double' in 1971/72. They won six of their opening seven games and maintained their title challenge after the departure of manager Hughie Morrow in September. Ray Holmes and

new player-boss Tony Foster netted a total of 93 goals in all competitions. Tamworth lost 1-0 at title rivals Atherstone in late March, one of only four defeats, but a six-match unbeaten run culminated in a thrilling 5-0 victory at home to Atherstone on the final day. The Lambs finished two points ahead of their local rivals, winning 25 of their 36 games. They beat Bromsgrove Rovers 2-1 on aggregate in the League Cup final.

1987/88

Tamworth won the West Midlands League and Cup 'double' in 1987/88. The Lambs began with a 1-0 defeat at Oldbury United but then went 12 matches unbeaten before losing 4-2 in the return game. Mark Stanton was top scorer as they finished with five straight wins, pipping Oldbury to the title after Terry Blewitt's goal clinched a 1-0 victory at Gresley Rovers in their final match of the season. Graham Smith's side scored 98 goals and won 27 of their 34 games, losing just four, as they regained Southern League status. They also hammered Malvern Town 5-0 in the League Cup final to achieve the West Midlands League 'double' for the first time in 16 years.

1988/89

Tamworth became the first Southern League club to win the FA Vase in 1988/89. Graham Smith's side beat Bridgnorth, Gresley Rovers, Ilkeston, Eastwood Hanley, Wisbech and North Ferriby before drawing 1-1 with Sudbury Town in the Wembley final watched by 26,487. Two goals by Mark Stanton plus another from Ian Moores gave Tamworth a 3-0 win in the replay at London Road: Dale Belford, Corrigan Lockett, Bobby Atkins, Steve Cartwright, Martin Finn, Martin Myers, Micky George, Martin

Devaney, Ian Moores, Russell Gordon (Paul Heaton), Mark Stanton. Tamworth were pipped to promotion by Atherstone on goal difference.

1996/97

Tamworth swept to the Southern League Midland Division title with a club record 97 points in 1996/97, losing just three matches in the process. The Lambs made an impressive 20 match unbeaten start that included a 6-0 hammering of RC Warwick and ended with a 2-0 defeat at Solihull Borough in late January. Solihull achieved the 'double' over Tamworth by winning 4-2 at The Lamb in the last match of the season. Tamworth's only other Southern League defeat was 1-0 at Ilkeston in late March. They won 30 of their 40 games and finished 26 points ahead of runners-up Rothwell Town. Ian Bennett, Paul Hunter and Gary Smith scored 57 goals between them.

2002/03

Tamworth stormed to the Southern League title and were FA Trophy finalists in 2002/03. The Lambs defeated Accrington Stanley, Nuneaton Borough, Stevenage, Margate, Farnborough and Havant & Waterlooville before losing 2-1 to Burscough in the FA Trophy final watched by 14,265 at Villa Park: Darren Acton, Rob Warner, Richard Follett, Brian McGorry, Dave Robinson, Steve Walsh, Nick Colley, Mark Cooper, Scott Rickards (Paul Hatton), Mark Sale (Mark Hallam), Steve Evans (Mark Turner). Top scorer Mark Cooper and Scott Rickards netted 25 goals between them as Tamworth won the Southern League Premier Division title by 13 points.

2005/06

Tamworth reached the FA Cup third round for the first time in 2005/06. Mark Cooper's side beat Altrincham in the fourth qualifying round, then won 2-1 at League One clubs AFC Bournemouth and Hartlepool United before holding Stoke City to a 0-0 draw in front of 9,366 at Britannia Stadium: Scott Bevan, Graham Ward, Jimmy Turner, David Bampton (Mark Cooper), Matt Redmile, Adie Smith,

Steve Melton, Michael Tuohy, Nick Wright (Kyle Storer), Jake Edwards, Eddie Anacleit. Tamworth went close to beating Stoke in the replay watched by 3,812 at The Lamb, leading in a 1-1 draw with their Championship opponents before losing 5-4 on penalties.

2008/09

Tamworth won the Conference North title with 85 points in 2008/09. The Lambs lost their opening home game 3-0 to Stalybridge Celtic but bounced back to hammer Burscough 6-2 and went top with a 15 match unbeaten run. They were trounced 5-1 at title rivals Gateshead in mid-January and the Tynesiders displaced them in pole position for a couple of months before Tamworth returned to the top with a 12 match unbeaten run. Gary Mills' side clinched the title with a 1-0 victory at home to Hinckley United in their penultimate game and they finished five points ahead of runners-up Gateshead. Gareth Sheldon was leading marksman with 23 Conference goals.

2023/24

Tamworth stormed to the Conference North title in 2023/24. They had won the Southern League Premier Division Central title the previous season. Andy Peaks' side won 29 of their 46 games, winning 4-0 at home to Darlington, Hereford and Southport, also 4-1 at Peterborough Sports and Spennymoor Town. The Lambs clinched the title with two matches remaining, earning promotion for the second consecutive season. They had the best defensive record, losing just eight times and conceding only 29 goals. 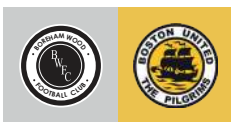
