Back the boys!

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Today, we welcome promotion rivals Harrogate Town to the Mangata Developments Stadium Meadow Park. Can I wish their directors, manager, players and supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, it's been a more than eventful ten days or so since we last played here, when we beat a young Newcastle United team 2-1. Since then, we've drawn 1-1 down at Eastleigh after conceding a late goal, having battered them for most of the game.

On Wednesday, we travelled north and deservedly beat a stubborn Scunthorpe United side 2-1, with debutant Ben Whitfield scoring a late headed winner. As such, we now top the league by three points after an eight-game unbeaten start to our league campaign.

On the downside, we lost striker Matt Rush to a short-term injury down at Eastleigh, but on the upside, we've brought in both Ben Whitfield and Conor Wilkinson on three-month loans from Barrow and Solihull Moors respectively to bolster the ranks.

Callum Reynolds is also now nearing a return to play, with his concussion protocols soon coming to an end. When you consider that we've also strengthened the squad over the last three weeks with high-quality players such as Jay Bird and Ted

Curd, it's no wonder that it gives me great pride to see Luke Garrard and Charlie Hunter building our squad so intelligently.

It's amazing how positive things are in most areas of the club and, having achieved promotion five times in my time here, I know that challenging for a title or promotion takes a lot out of you. It takes focus and a huge collective effort from everyone, as it's certainly not an 11-a-side game anymore.

Other club info

Next week, after ten years of trying, we will begin in earnest the work down at the South End of the stadium. In truth, we will embark on a 10 to 11-month build programme that will take up much of my energy, focus and time.

That said, it will encompass new community changing rooms, a rehab/tiny tots astro pitch, an away fans' zone, digital turnstiles, new toilets, new catering and bar units, plus a new maintenance and grounds building, a new maintenance office and a new control room, along with lots of mechanical and electrical groundwork.

On top of that, we must look to the future and build new supporter pathways, new entry and exit roads, and new fence lines and security gates. We also have new lighting designs, new signage and, oh, of course, a brand-new shiny South Stand to build that will take us to EFL level in terms of our ground grading and increase our capacity to well over 5,600.

Anyway, that's enough of that. Let's get back to today.

As such, I would like to thank all of our travelling supporters who got themselves down to Eastleigh and then up to Scunthorpe United. What an effort. Trust me, it never goes unnoticed and you are making a huge, huge difference this season. Hopefully, I'll see many of you up at Solihull Moors next week.

It just leaves me to say, whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

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Good afternoon. Firstly, I would like to welcome Simon Weaver, his staff and players to Meadow Park for today's National League fixture.

The last time we faced each other was back in 2020, when we travelled to play our semi-final play-off fixture, where unfortunately for us, we returned back down South having been on the wrong end of a 1-0 loss.

Harrogate then went on to win at Wembley, which led to them being promoted to the EFL for the first time in their club's history.

We now face each other once again as equals and with us both firmly in the title race, which I can imagine will lead to a very entertaining match this afternoon.

Having watched them closely the last few matches, they are a side that has a clear identity and personnel that can cause you problems, and we need to guard against that with an attitude to implementing our match script and gaining control as soon as possible.

We showed so many great traits on Wednesday evening away against Scunthorpe, and it was a near perfect performance in the first half, with us only missing a goal to our name.

The way in which the players performed and showed the volume and quality in our attacks was extremely pleasing. The level of intensity and energy was evident to see, and

I believe that played a huge part in us once again scoring in the latter stages of the game.

For us to still have the intent to go for the win shows the mentality of this group. They were pegged back with the equaliser but had to quickly adapt to taking back control and showing a relentless side to our attacks.

Having seen the metrics from Wednesday evening, it once again proves we have to continue to trust in what we are doing. The level of detail we present to the squad is very much being digested, and that is clear for us all to see.

We now need to go again, look to improve day to day and find even more solutions to what problems we are facing.

Teams are showing clear pressing cues throughout the match, and we're having to be proactive on how we then evolve, making sure we see it quickly on the side of the pitch and get the information over to the players sharpish so we can then roll into a different build shape which then leads to us having success.

Being fluid in the way we present and having many ways to play is really giving us an edge in our performances. And showing we have variation is the biggest pleasing aspect to

our current run of form.

I know it will be another tough test this afternoon, but the group are very much in a sweet spot and we need to continue to ride this wave.

I speak openly to the dressing room and discuss that squads like this and days like this are never promised. What they are creating is a joy for everyone involved, and I truly believe we have to harness this and make sure we fully appreciate what's being achieved and work even harder to maintain the standards that are being set.

So, please get right behind the boys and give us the energy to continue what has been a very positive start.

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Feature interview: Oli Bainbridge

"The squad is in a good place at the moment and if we can take the positives from Wednesday and refine them a little bit, we can be confident going into the weekend."

When a defender goes understated for their performances, it tends to be a positive and Oliver Bainbridge certainly fits that bill.

Touching down in Hertfordshire in the summer, the attack-minded full-back ended his six-year association with Sunderland having enjoyed a fruitful spell on loan at South Shields last term.

Settling into new surroundings is never straightforward yet Bainbridge has slotted into Luke Garrard's side seamlessly and has started in all but one Enterprise National League clash.

The ex-Killmarnock loanee assesses his start to life at Meadow Park.

"It has been an enjoyable start to my time here," he said.

"From pre-season and now into the league, all of the lads have made a real effort in welcoming me both on and off the pitch which has made it easy to settle in."

"Of course, positive results help with that too but it has been a great group to get to know."

An integral part of South

Shields' title pursuit from the National League North last term, it was the 21-year-old's first taste of regular first-team football earn a place in the division's Team of the Season.

Although they fell short of their ultimate goal of promotion in the play-off final, Bainbridge feels his experience of being in a promotion hunt will serve him well this term.

"The transition has been good as I've come from a team that plays in a similar way," he explained.

"I think my time at South Shields has allowed me to get a taste of playing in teams that are striving to get promoted.

"I also suffered a play-off final loss last season so I can relate to some of the boys experiences here and I know that we all want to go one step further."

A 2-1 victory at Scunthorpe United on Wednesday night kept our unbeaten start in tact as well as our position at the summit of the table. Tyrell Sellars-Fleming cancelled out Zak Brunt's strike, but Ben Whitfield proved to be the hero on his debut to head home from close range.

Bainbridge reflects on another vital three points in Lincolnshire, paying testament to the squad's character having been on top for large periods.

"It was a great away performance," he said.

"We have full belief that when we dominate games that the goals will eventually come and we have to stay patient. The squad is in a good place at the moment and if we can take the positives from Wednesday and refine them a little bit, we can be confident going into the weekend."

Harrogate Town is the latest examination, a side who have made a strong start to the campaign in fifth place having been relegated from Sky Bet League Two last season.

Bainbridge is relishing the opportunity to lock horns with another promotion hopeful.

"Our main aim is to keep this positive momentum going," he explained.

"We know the opposition are a good side but we embrace the challenge and hopefully it's an exciting game between two top teams."

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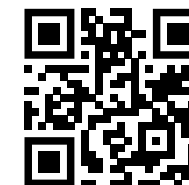

Manager

Simon Weaver has been at the helm of Harrogate Town since 2009, initially taking charge as player-manager before moving into management full-time. He has overseen an extraordinary rise for the club, guiding them from the National League North to the EFL, with two promotions along the way. Weaver also led Harrogate to FA Trophy success at Wembley in 2020, before establishing the club in League Two. After six seasons in the EFL, Harrogate returned to the National League in 2026, with Weaver continuing in charge as the club begins life back in non-league football.

Archie Baptiste

Defender • 28/10/2005 (20) • Last club: Middlesbrough

A product of the Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur academies, Baptiste joined Middlesbrough in November 2025 after progressing through Spurs' youth ranks. The centre-back made his professional debut as a late substitute in Boro's 2-1 Championship victory over Derby County before joining Rochdale on loan towards the end of the 2025/26 season. He then joined Harrogate Town in July 2026 and has started all eight of the club's National League matches this season, scoring once.



Bailey Hobson

Midfielder • 01/08/2002 (24) • Last club: Chesterfield

A product of the Sheffield United academy, Hobson joined Alfreton Town in 2021 and quickly established himself, scoring 22 goals in 91 appearances for the National League North side. Chesterfield signed the midfielder in 2023, with Hobson gaining National League experience on loan with Kidderminster Harriers, Barnet and Brackley Town. He helped Chesterfield win promotion to the EFL as National League champions in 2023/24 before joining Harrogate Town on a permanent deal this summer.



Shawn McCoulsky

Forward • 06/01/1997 (29) • Last club: Maidenhead United

A striker who began his senior career with Bristol City, McCoulsky gained experience with loan spells at Torquay United, Newport County and Aldershot Town before joining Welling United permanently in 2018. He later played for Ebbsfleet United, Boreham Wood, Yeovil Town and Wrexham, where he helped the club win promotion from the National League in 2023. After spells with Dagenham & Redbridge and Maidenhead United, McCoulsky joined Harrogate Town in 2025 and remains with the club for the 2026/27 campaign.

Classic campaigns: Harrogate Town

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** selects ten post-war Harrogate Town 'Classic Campaigns'

1980/81

Harrogate Town finished Yorkshire League Third Division runners-up in 1980/81. Alan Smith had been appointed Harrogate's player-manager the previous year when the club was at arguably the lowest point in its history and the former York City winger plotted a successful era at Wetherby Road. Harrogate won 20 of their 30 matches and scored 64 goals but were pipped to the Yorkshire League Third Division title on goal difference by newcomers Bradley Rangers, despite winning 6-1 in their final game of the season. John Campbell was leading marksman with 15 goals. Harrogate also won the Yorkshire League Third Division Fair Play Award.

1981/82

Harrogate Town were Yorkshire League Second Division champions in 1981/82. Alan Smith's newly-promoted side quickly adjusted to higher status and won 16 of their 30 matches, pipping Ossett Town to the title on goal difference. Mick Margis and John Campbell were joint top scorers with 18 goals apiece as Harrogate netted a total of 56 goals. As it was the final season of the Yorkshire League, merging with the Midland League to form the Northern Counties East League, normal promotion and relegation did not apply

because of re-organisation. Harrogate competed in the Northern Counties East League First Division (North) the following season.

1985/86

Harrogate Town won the West Riding County Cup for the third time in the club's history in 1985/86. Harrogate had previously lifted the West Riding County Cup in 1962/63 and 1972/73. Alan Smith's side defeated holders Goole Town 1-0 in the final. Leading marksman Jeff Demibickij and Dave Ballantyne netted 30 goals between them as Harrogate narrowly missed promotion, pipped by Sheffield on the final day, finishing third in the North East Counties League First Division behind champions North Ferriby United. They won 7-0 at bottom of the table Pilkington Recs, also hammering Borrowash Victoria 7-2 and Bradley Rangers 6-3 at Wetherby Road.

1989/90

Harrogate Town won the Northern Premier League First Division Cup in 1989/90. Alan Smith's side defeated Accrington Stanley 3-2 and Winsford United 2-1 before beating Congleton Town 5-1 on aggregate in the final. Paul Williamson skippered Harrogate to ninth place in the Northern Premier League First Division, winning 17 of

their 42 games and gaining 60 points. Colin Hogarth was 'Player of the Year', while striker Ian Blackstone moved from Accrington Stanley and was top scorer, later transferred to York City. The club became a Limited Company to fund the construction of a new main stand which was opened at the start of the following season. 2001/02

2001/02

Alan Ashman achieved a Harrogate Town won the Northern Premier League First Division title in 2001/02. John Reed's side began with a 2-1 defeat at Lincoln United but soared to the top with a nine-match unbeaten run. They slammed five goals past Farsley Celtic and Lincoln United, then six past Rossendale United and Belper Town, finishing ten points above runners-up Ossett Town. Player-coach Neil Aspin was 'Player of the Year' as Harrogate also won the West Riding County Cup, beating Farsley Celtic 4-0 in the final. They defeated Colwyn Bay and Kendal Town en route to the FA Trophy third round for only the second time, losing 2-0 in front of 1,886 at Doncaster Rovers.

2002/03

Harrogate Town reached the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in the club's history in 2002/03. John Reed's side defeated Great Harwood Town 2-0, Accrington Stanley 3-2 and Wisbech Town 2-0 in the FA Cup before losing 5-1 at Conference side Farnborough Town in the first round. Skipper Robbie Whellans was leading marksman, while Simon Sturdy was 'Player of the Year' as Harrogate finished sixth in their first season in the Northern Premier League Premier Division. Town also retained the West Riding County Cup, beating Farsley Celtic 3-1 after extra-time in the final with goals by Colin Hunter, Paul Sykes and Robbie Whellans

2005/06

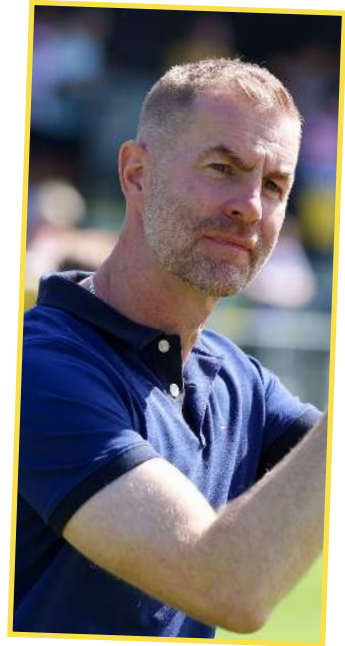
Harrogate Town qualified for the Conference North play-offs in 2005/06. They won 4-1 at home to Worcester City and secured three-goal wins over Lancaster City, Leigh RMI and Moor Green. Winning 22 of their 42 games, they finished fifth with 71 points but lost 1-0 to eventual winners Stafford Rangers in the play-off semi-finals. Harrogate beat Great Harwood 3-0, Witton Albion 2-0 and Scarborough 1-0 en route to the FA Cup first round proper. Travelling to Torquay United, their first ever Cup game against Football League opposition, they drew 1-1 at Plainmoor with a goal from Danny Holland but lost 6-5 on penalties after a 0-0 draw in the replay. 2012/13

2012/13

Harrogate Town reached the FA Cup second round proper for the first time in 2012/13. Simon Weaver's side defeated West Auckland 5-1, Frickley Athletic 3-2 and Hyde 1-0 in the FA Cup before Chib Chilaka's goal clinched a 1-0 victory at Torquay United in the first round proper. It was the first occasion that Harrogate had beaten Football League opposition in the FA Cup. They faced Hastings United in the second round and Tom Platt scored to secure a 1-1 draw in front of 2,986 at Wetherby Road. Platt scored again in the replay at Hastings, with his late equaliser forcing extra-time. This tie also ended 1-1 but Harrogate lost 5-4 on penalties.

2017/18

Harrogate Town won promotion to the Conference National for the first time in 2017/18. They signed numerous new players before their pre-season home match against Leeds United and began training as a full professional club in July. Simon Weaver's side won 26 of their 42 Conference North games to finish runners-up to Salford City and qualify for the play-offs. Dominic Knowles scored twice, including a dramatic last-gasp winner, as Harrogate triumphed 2-1 over Chorley in the semi-finals. A first-half double by leading marksman Knowles plus Joe Leesley's second-half strike gave Harrogate a 3-0 win over Brackley Town in the play-off final.



2019/20

As the 2019/20 Conference National season was curtailed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, table positions were determined on average

points per game. Harrogate Town had 1.78, placing them second in the final table behind champions Barrow and meaning they again qualified for the Conference National play-offs, this time in the semi-finals. Jack Muldoon's second-half header clinched a 1-0 victory over Boreham Wood in the semi-final at Wetherby Road. George Thomson, Connor Hall and Jack Diamond scored as Harrogate defeated Notts County 3-1 in the final at Wembley Stadium, earning promotion to the Football League for the first time in their history.



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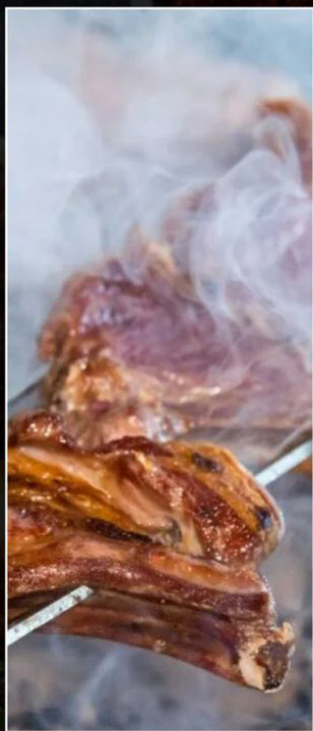
