Back the boys!

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Good evening. This evening we welcome our good friends from Carlisle United to Meadow Park. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Like ourselves, Carlisle United have their own ambitions for this season, and it's no secret that they, along with clubs like Southend United, are, if you base things purely on support, head and shoulders above the other clubs at our level.

When you also add in well-supported clubs like Hartlepool and Scunthorpe, only time will tell if the larger crowds or bigger budgets will prevail this season. We can only hope this might be a season when one of the underdog clubs, like ourselves, comes through to nick one of the available promotion places – I certainly hope so.

In recent weeks, as you've possibly heard haha, we've had to make a few tough decisions and deal with a bit of transfer drama involving our own "little maverick", Abdul Abdulmalik. Though we tried desperately to keep him, it became very clear that was going to be almost impossible, and so the decision was made to sell him – but we wanted it done fairly and on our terms.

In truth, over the last few weeks, Luke and the dressing room have remained very focused and nothing has disrupted them too much. Most of the noise regarding a deal with Djurgårdens IF tended to come from others on social media, which I don't tend to read.

What I can say is that I laid out the course of events regarding the transfer saga in my last programme notes, and I can now confirm that we have sold Abdul for an undisclosed non-league record fee. We refused to be rushed or railroaded by anything or anybody. We stuck to our guns on a series of fair but achievable add-ons, including a sell-on fee, appearance fees and an international clause.

In truth, negotiations were not always plain sailing, but I'm an experienced Chairman and have very good staff around me who all know their jobs. I knew the true value of this player, as most of you did, and at our level he really was a Rolls-Royce.

That said, in any fluid negotiation you need negotiators who know

how to play the game without emotion, who understand what the end game is and who know what value must be put on any fair deal. Once we knew Abdul had made his mind up to leave us no matter what, it became evident that he was prepared, on the advice of others, to down tools for the foreseeable future.

As such, both my mentality and the club's had to change or, put more simply, we then needed to get the very best deal possible, remain fluid and have the ability to compromise and recalculate our position if need be. At that point, a difficult and sometimes noisy negotiation is never easy to re-evaluate, and you must factor the risk-to-reward element into your thinking.

I feel experience helped us in this instance and, whatever happens, you must ensure you do not make false promises, show others any weakness or allow for any self-doubt.

In truth, both my position and Charlie Hunter's became slightly easier as others went to the

press and social media and showed their hand, while we waited before making our position clear – and only from within my programme notes. We focused solely on the club and Manager's wants and needs, and we gave NO outside interviews.

I feel that by being a bit pragmatic, old-school and calm, by refusing to deal with the player's agent throughout, and by having a very clear valuation in my head regarding which add-ons were key, we knew where we would compromise and where we could possibly steer the negotiations. That stance, ably co-ordinated by Charlie Hunter, got us to a place where everyone was happy.

Once the noise and a bit of silly behaviour didn't get the reaction some people expected, proper negotiations could then take place in earnest between the two clubs. At this point, I'd like to thank Max Hann of Djurgårdens IF for his professionalism in getting the deal done, along with Charlie, with plenty of time to spare and without any further drama.

In terms of what the future might hold for Abdul, who in truth knows? What I can say is: "The sky really is the limit for this very talented player."

In my opinion, I would expect him to be a Nigerian international before too long, I would expect him to become an exciting regular within the Djurgårdens IF set-up, and I would expect him to go to the very top in Sweden and be sold on for a sizeable profit within three years.

If Abs does all of those things, trust me, Boreham Wood Football Club will have deservedly benefited at all stages of the signed deal because of the time, care, nurturing and development we put into Abdul during his time with us.

So, as that joyous chapter closes, we of course wish Abdul, his family and friends well in everything they do, but our main focus must quickly turn to our own ambitions. Hopefully, that means a successful promotion push and providing whatever is needed for our Manager and dressing room to keep us moving forward.

Off the field, I must also deliver to our supporters, town and wider community a £4 million-plus South Stand project, complete with a number of associated facility upgrades to EFL standard.

This evening, though, our focus turns to Carlisle United and, in truth, we can have no bigger game

at Meadow Park than the visit of our Cumbrian friends. It will give us another barometer of just how far we've come over the last few years.

Tonight, DAZN have again made this a 5:30pm kick-off, and I ask one simple question: how many more times are they going to punish the Carlisle United travelling supporters with these late games?

It's a complete joke that amazingly loyal fans, especially at Carlisle, Southend and elsewhere, are made to struggle to get themselves to certain away games because of these ridiculous streaming company schedules.

Only last Friday, Carlisle United were made to play at Wealdstone with a 7:45pm kick-off, meaning Carlisle fans who would normally travel by train could not get home. Those fans are again being abused this evening, and it's now embarrassing that it's left to club owners like myself, with no backing whatsoever from the League, to constantly highlight this complete and utter nonsense.

In my opinion, National League football, for no real money, is being held over a barrel by a streaming company, while supporters of its larger clubs are being discriminated against

almost weekly with these deliberately timed late kick-offs. They appear designed simply to drum up more stream purchases from away supporters, which in turn reduces home attendances – it's a lose-lose situation.

If I was part of a supporter group at our level – and I'm not – I would encourage my fellow supporters up and down the country to get together and promote a blanket ban on buying anything on the DAZN streams.

I would also encourage our League's Board, through respectful messaging, to find a way to end this deal with a streaming company who charge loyal fans an awful lot, care nothing for the real fans' well-being and, in my opinion, give our clubs such poor production value. That includes terrible camera work, often biased commentary and poor sound quality.

Since highlighting all of this last Christmas, after the pathetic DAZN-led "12 Days of Christmas" nonsense, which again disadvantaged Carlisle United fans amongst others, I've tried my very best to meet with the National League Board, only to be told by the then Chairman, Jack Pearce, that there was no appetite amongst the Board to

meet me.

In truth, I've also had very little or no support from other club owners who, in the main, seem completely disinterested in their supporters' plight and the poor commercial value afforded by DAZN to our member clubs, who've had our greatest asset – live football – given away by our Board for a pittance...

I suppose that's hardly surprising, with more and more new club owners being foreign and, on further inspection, many don't even live in this country. In simple terms, they don't understand that our historical football culture is that Saturday football at our level is played at 3pm...

If anyone can tell me, our Managers, Players and Supporters why the National League Board, without consultation, decided to put on a full league programme at 7:45pm last Friday, other than for DAZN, I'd like to hear it.

We are not performing seals, and none of us received one penny extra for having every one of our games televised...

This change from a 3pm Saturday kick-off was done without any thought for you, the supporter, for train times or transport

availability, nor was there any discussion with our member clubs.

As such, it's now very clear to me that DAZN are the ringmasters and care nothing for the clubs who provide the entertainment, while those clubs have become the National League Board's performing poodles and get literally a pittance, or nothing, for the privilege of working with DAZN.

Anyway, that's quite enough of my diatribe. Let's get back to this evening and what is a fantastic fixture to be a part of, other than seeing the Carlisle United fans being abused by this time slot yet again.

Finally, whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

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Feature interview: Regan Booty

"They've got real quality throughout their whole squad and it's going to be a game where we've got to be at our best to make sure we get a positive result."

Our formidable start to the season has deservedly earned plaudits for the devastating forward line, but Regan Booty remains a vital cog in Luke Garrard's well-oiled machine.

Signing on a permanent basis at the start of the year after an initial loan stint from Barrow, the 28-year-old made an immediate impact in Hertfordshire.

A stunning strike on his debut in a 3-0 victory at Gateshead was a tantalising glimpse of what to expect, with further impressive goals against Solihull Moors and Aldershot Town adding to his repertoire.

The Wood currently sit at the summit of the Enterprise National League, one of only two unbeaten sides left after five games alongside Yeovil Town.

Booty points towards continuity as the driving factor behind the fine start. "I don't think it's a surprise to anyone in the building that we've continued in the same form as last year," he said.

"We knew at the back end of the season how good we were as a group.

"Then the quality we've added this summer, as well as keeping nearly everyone together, was always going to be a massive factor to us starting the season well and maintaining the standards we set."

Tom White's return from injury in March coincided with a sublime end-of-season form, just one defeat in ten matches, with Booty his midfield partner.

The former Huddersfield Town man explains how their close bond off the pitch has translated into success on it.

"I have an unbelievable relationship with Whitey both on and off the pitch," the former England C international explained.

"On the pitch, he's probably the most consistent player I've ever

played with, so I know week in, week out what I'm going to get from him.

"His biggest strengths are probably things I'm not as good at and vice versa, so we complement each other a lot and I think that's really starting to show now.

"Off the pitch, we spend so much time together.

"We live about 25 minutes apart up north, so any opportunity we get to go home, we're always doing the journey together, so we probably spend more time with each other than anyone else."

Starting in all of our league matches so far, Booty assesses his own performances in the middle of the park.

"Personally, I think I've had a really good start to the season," he said.

"In the recent games, I've managed to chip in with a few assists, which is obviously something I love to do for my teammates.

"With the quality we have in the front line, there are so many options as a midfielder like myself, so hopefully there's plenty more to come.

"Obviously, goals and assists aren't what I would judge my performances on, but they're always a nice bonus on top of what has been a really positive start to the season."

A tough test awaits on Saturday with the visit of a fellow promotion hopeful, Carlisle, the side we memorably edged past in last season's play-off semi-final.

Zak Brunt proved to be the hero with an audacious chipped finish in extra-time to book our ticket to Wembley Stadium, and Booty reflects on that afternoon with immense fondness.

"It was an unbelievable occasion, the type of games that you want to play in as a footballer," he

reminisced.

"To play in front of 14,000 fans and be one game away from Wembley was incredible.

"I've only got good memories of the game as we had one objective and that was to win.

"It was a real nervy end to the game, but the celebrations after with our fans are something that I'll remember for a long time."

There is limited time for sentiment, though, with Rob Elliot's new-look Cumbrians eager to return to the Football League at the second time of asking, impressing in a 4-2 victory over Scunthorpe United last time out.

They have made several notable additions this summer, including in midfield with Miguel Azeez and Harvey Bunker Burrell from Morecambe and Forest Green Rovers respectively, while Brad Nicholson and Adam Desbois reunite with Elliot from Gateshead.

Booty is treating it like any other game, while recognising the significance of securing a statement victory.

"We're expecting a really tough test," he acknowledged.

"They've got real quality throughout their whole squad and it's going to be a game where we've got to be at our best to make sure we get a positive result.

"I think with Carlisle being the only team left in the league that finished above us last year, from the outside, people will say it's a big marker laid down.

"However, with it being so early on in the season, the performances and the way we're going about games at the minute are the most important thing.

"Hopefully we can continue that and if we do, I'm sure there will be a real positive outcome on Saturday evening."

A former goalkeeper who enjoyed a long-playing career with Charlton Athletic, Newcastle United and Watford, Rob Elliot moved into management after hanging up his gloves. He first took charge of Gateshead, leading the club to FA Trophy success at Wembley in 2024, before a spell with Crawley Town. Returning to Gateshead in difficult circumstances in January 2026, Elliot successfully guided the club away from relegation danger. Appointed Carlisle United Head Coach in May, he arrives at Brunton Park with a clear ambition to build an attacking, energetic side.

One's to watch



Leo Duru

Defender • 12/01/2005 (21) • Last club: Birmingham Legion

A product of the Blackburn Rovers academy, Duru joined the club after beginning his football journey with Manchester United. The right-sided defender progressed through the ranks at Ewood Park before making his senior debut in a 6-1 EFL Cup victory over Stockport County in August 2024. He subsequently gained experience with Barrow and spent time in the United States with San Diego FC and Birmingham Legion. Following a successful trial period, the 21-year-old joined Carlisle United this summer and has already impressed during the early stages of the campaign.



Miguel Azeez

Midfielder • 20/09/2002 (23) • Last club: Morecambe

Azeez began his footballing journey at Arsenal, joining the Gunners at the age of five before progressing through their academy and signing professional terms in 2019. The midfielder gained senior experience on loan with Portsmouth, Ibiza and Wigan Athletic before moving abroad to Atlético Baleares and PAS Giannina. He returned to English football with Morecambe in 2025, making 40 appearances and scoring five goals. His performances earned him a move to Carlisle United this summer, where he became Rob Elliot's first signing as Head Coach.



Georgie Kelly

Forward • 12/11/1996 (29) • Last club: Rotherham United

A proven goalscorer, Kelly began his senior career in Ireland with Derry City and UCD before spells with Dundalk and St Patrick's Athletic. He really found his feet with Bohemians in 2021, scoring 21 goals in 31 appearances and finishing as the league's top scorer. That form earned him a move to Rotherham United, where he scored on his debut as the Millers secured promotion to the Championship. The experienced forward joined Carlisle in 2024 and has since become an important figure in the Cumbrians' attack, offering a physical presence and proven eye for goal.

Classic campaigns: Carlisle United

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** selects ten post-war Carlisle United 'Classic Campaigns'

1961/62

Carlisle United won promotion for the first time in 1961/62. New signings Terry Caldwell, Les Dagger, Hugh Neil and Sammy Taylor made their debuts as Carlisle kicked off with a 2-1 victory over Aldershot and later surged up the table with five straight wins. They beat Darlington 4-0 and Barnsley 2-1 before losing 3-1 at Wolves in the FA Cup third round. Billy Stark arrived from Crewe and Geoff Martin from Darlington, helping Carlisle overcome inconsistent results to remain in the promotion race. Ivor Powell's side won 2-1 at Doncaster, then beat Chester 2-0 in front of 12,660 at Brunton Park to clinch fourth place.

1963/64

Carlisle scored a club record 113 League goals as they regained Third Division status at the first attempt in 1963/64. Alan Ashman swapped Alan McBain for Luton pair Jack Lornie and Allan Ross, with the latter setting the club appearance record. Ace marksman Hughie McIlmoyle spearheaded the attack as Carlisle slammed 13 goals past Hartlepool's in two meetings, also trouncing Lincoln 5-0, Darlington 6-1 and Doncaster 6-0. They

progressed to the FA Cup fifth round before losing 1-0 at Preston and despite just one defeat in their last ten games, were pipped to the Fourth Division title by Gillingham on goal average.

1964/65

Alan Ashman managed Carlisle to the Third Division championship in 1964/65. Stan Harland made his debut as newly promoted Carlisle kicked off with a 1-0 victory at Colchester but won just two of their next ten League games. Hughie McIlmoyle was sold to Wolves, while newcomers included Frank Large, Willie Carlin and Ronnie Simpson. Carlisle smashed four goals past Barnsley, Colchester and Bournemouth, then gained seven wins in eight matches before being held to a 0-0 draw by Bristol City. They lost 2-0 at rivals Mansfield but bounced back to beat the Stags 3-0 in the title decider at Brunton Park the following day.

1969/70

Carlisle United reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1969/70. Summer signings included Bob Hatton from Northampton and Tot Winstanley from Newcastle, with Carlisle losing just one of their first five Second Division games.

They defeated Huddersfield Town 2-0, Blackburn Rovers 2-1, Chelsea 1-0 and Oxford United 1-0 in the League Cup before losing 4-2 on aggregate to West Brom in the semi-finals. Bob Stokoe left to manage Blackpool and Ian MacFarlane replaced him in charge, with Carlisle defeated 2-1 by Middlesbrough in the FA Cup fifth round. Chris Balderstone was ever-present as they finished mid-table.

1973/74

Alan Ashman achieved a minor miracle by taking Carlisle United into the top-flight in 1973/74. Frank Clarke scored on his debut as Carlisle started with a 1-1 draw against Cardiff but then crashed to a 6-1 defeat at Luton and failed to win any of their first six games. Chris Balderstone returned from cricket duty and Carlisle lost just three times in 21 Second Division matches, also beating holders Sunderland in the FA Cup and taking eventual winners Liverpool to a fourth-round replay. Top scorer Frank Clarke netted four goals as they beat Swindon 5-1 and Carlisle pipped Orient to third place with a 2-0 win over Aston Villa.

1974/75

Carlisle United sat proudly on top of the First Division after winning their opening three games of the 1974/75 campaign. Record signing Bobby Parker made his debut as goals by skipper Bill Green and Les O'Neill gave Carlisle a 2-0 victory at Chelsea, then Les O'Neill scored twice more to secure a 2-0 win at Middlesbrough and Chris Balderstone's penalty beat Spurs 1-0 at Brunton Park. Carlisle slipped down the table after this and were relegated but thrashed eventual champions Derby 3-0, completed the double over Everton and defeated the likes of Arsenal, Ipswich and Wolves. They also reached the FA Cup sixth round.

1981/82

Bob Stokoe managed Carlisle back to the Second Division in 1981/82. Newcomers Jackie Ashurst, Bob Lee and Pop Robson featured as Carlisle kicked off with a 2-2 draw at home to Bristol City. Gordon Staniforth grabbed a hat-trick in the 3-1 victory over Plymouth and Carlisle soared to the top of the table with six straight wins. Peter Beardsley returned to Vancouver but Tommy Craig arrived as player-coach and Tom Ritchie joined on loan from Sunderland, helping Carlisle to finish runners-up. Pop Robson was top scorer, while other stars were Trevor Swinburne, Jackie Ashurst, Dave Rushbury and Bobby Parker.

1994/95

Carlisle United were Third Division champions and Auto Windscreens Shield finalists in 1994/95. They had qualified for the play-offs the previous season and Mick Wadsworth signed David Currie and Derek Mountfield. Carlisle stormed to the top of the table after winning seven of their first eight games and bounced back from a 2-1 defeat at Northampton to remain unbeaten in their next 19 matches. David Reeves was leading marksman as Carlisle won the title with a club record 91 points. They also reached their first Wembley final but lost 1-0 to a golden goal in extra-time against Birmingham City watched by 76,633.

1996/97

Mervyn Day guided Carlisle to a promotion and Auto Windscreens Shield 'double' in 1996/97. They had been relegated the previous season, but new defenders Owen Archdeacon and Stephane Pounewatchy were key figures as they swept to the top of the table after losing just once in their first 12 games. Allan Smart arrived from Preston and Carlisle maintained their promotion challenge with a ten-match unbeaten run. They also reached the FA Cup fourth round but finished in third place after winning only three of their last 11 matches. Carlisle beat Colchester on penalties after a 0-0 draw in the Auto Windscreens Shield final.



2005/06

Karl Hawley (pictured above) scored 22 goals as Carlisle United won the League Two title in 2005/06. Paul Simpson's side won promotion from the Conference the previous season and new signings included Zigor Aranalde, Danny Livesey and Chris Lumsdon. Carlisle won five of their first nine matches and overcame four successive defeats, with Karl Hawley scoring consecutive hat-tricks against Stockport and Torquay. Newcomers Keiren Westwood and Michael Bridges helped Carlisle go top of the table with a 5-0 win over Chester in February and they lost just one of their last 16 matches, also reaching the Football League Trophy final.



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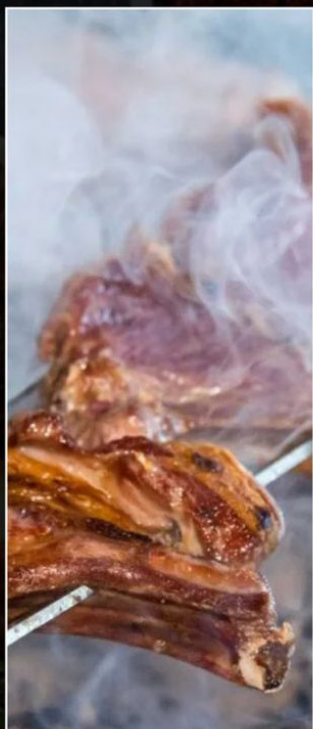
