Tonight we welcome Farnborough to the Mangata Pay UK Stadium, Meadow Park. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable time with us and a safe journey home.

Well, our FA Cup run is now over for another year and boy did we give it a go once again, but came up short, going out on penalties.

Our fans in the main since I last wrote my programme notes for the Leyton Orient game, have been very supportive of what we are looking to achieve this season. It is also nice to report that our home ticket sales for the FA Cup game did pick up and I would like to thank you all for the noise and making the day such an occasion.

That said, for the first time in over 10 years, it feels like some of our newer supporters who have only ever known cup success, including a trip to Wembley Stadium, numerous Play-Offs, a trip to Goodison Park and National League football, are slowly deserting the club on a match day and returning back to their Arsenal, Spurs, Chelsea, Watford, West Ham and other London club roots.

I might have to accept lower support levels for now, but I don't have to like it. I also know though if I stick to the fight when I'm hardest hit, we'll claw our way back, because club ambition and my future plans are still relevant and because my pockets are still not quite drained haha.

It means I'm ready to underwrite the losses in the club's immediate future and ready to fight for my staff and my own self-respect in creating another promotion-winning dressing room. That said, if we cannot achieve promotion

over the next two seasons, and if our support continues to dwindle, then I cannot keep throwing silly money at a black hole.

In real terms, if our crowd average remains 5th bottom in this division and if we do not keep our support levels above 800 over the next two seasons, then I will not keep my present investment levels to remain full-time in a part-time league while continuing to lose hundreds of thousands of pounds every season.

In truth, it makes no economic sense for me to gamble with our football club's financial future. As such, I will turn my full attention and investment more to legacy, and create a well-run and well-funded part-time club and look to complete our stadium build and new stand at the South End of the Stadium within the next three years.

We are in all honesty only strong after last season's relegation because I underwrite the club's losses, because of good governance, good fiscal management, because of your loyalty and because after more than 25 years we have created a very unique club, built on community, inclusion, family values, hard work and an underdog mentality.

Trust me, if we want our garden to grow again, we must be prepared to build a complete club and get our hands dirty again, while keeping our expectations realistic.

I am as determined as ever to achieve EFL status for our supporters, my staff and for this town and community, but after last season's relegation and our present league position, it might in truth take both patience and a bit more time than I'd originally hoped.

In my honest opinion, only three senior players this season have performed anywhere near the levels we could have expected, and I'm more than happy to name them in Tom Whelan, Erico Souza and, since fit, Kwesi Appiah......but 3 from a 20 man squad simply does not win you enough football matches or a league title.

We also have four young players within our midst that we must nurture, care for and help, they are Charlie Clayden, Charlie O'Connell, Junior Dixon and Abdul Abdulmalik. They get a pass from me because they are young players who need help, patience and guidance from our senior backroom staff and senior players, but they must learn quickly.

If our squad and management are completely honest with themselves, they know we're not remotely starting the second half of league games or ending the 90 minutes anywhere near strongly enough against predominantly part-time opposition, and whether we like it or not, we are now playing in a part-time league.

In midweek, we play against players who finish their full-time day jobs, then play or train in the evening while our players in the main have breakfast together, train full-time in the mornings four days a week, have Wednesdays off and rest during the day of a mid-week game and rest from 1 pm on a Friday before a weekend game.

In my opinion, I have created a hard-working, proven, and honest non-league football club, which has over-achieved for many years. We are I feel now being made mentally weak by some individuals and it's those weak mindsets and those easy street work ethics, that might have won people plaudits in the past, but in all honesty, they have not achieved any success in their recent footballing lives.

For most of my adult working life, with my limited ability, I needed to work like a dog to create a home and platform for me and my family, much of that being as a single dad. I believe because I cared so much about my family, how I did my job, and because I had a fear of failure, that I forged an unexpectedly successful career within the British Film Industry as a Property Master and that honestly changed my life.

I knew I was a limited individual, but also knew I was very hardworking, a good organiser and knew if I put in the hours, worked to my film boss's expectations, then I had a genuine chance to change my and my family's life and only by doing that, did I also change my mindset and my views toward hard work.

At 62, after nearly 48 years of hard graft, I went on to create a successful film career, a multi-million-pound property portfolio, a successful sports and education programme, and have proudly transformed my local football club. In the years ahead, (as long as I have my health), this club will remain my priority and I will complete our Stadium build and return us to the National League and hopefully beyond.

When I reflect back on the mess, mismanagement and black hole I inherited here, I perhaps know how

Rachel Reeves our new Chancellor of the Exchequer possibly feels. But when I look back at the tough decisions and huge efforts made by myself, my family, my staff and my partners. I'm in awe of what we've all achieved together.

As I sit here now, I've ensured this club does not have one penny of debt and everything you see built from top to bottom is all bought and paid for.

After my recent meeting with the HBC Leader, Local Councillors and Officers last week, news on the Meadow Park, Brook Road Car Park and the South End of the Stadium build and plans, will I hope be shared with you all in the very near future..

The last 18 months on the field have unfortunately not gone remotely as I, nor you, would have hoped. In simple terms we competed and lost in a National League Play-off semi-final against Notts County, we then suffered a damaging last-day relegation and unfortunately for us all the hangover is still with us.

The FA Cup is now gone, we presently sit mid-table in the National South, and again that's not where we want to be. As such, if our players and backroom staff genuinely want to be here, then they must become more resolute, focused, committed and act like full-time professionals playing in a part-time league.

They are all very good players and people, but they need to be prepared at the very least, to work hard, live the right life, keep themselves in shape and with their undoubted ability want to outthink, outrun and out fight parttime teams and in truth they should be winning more football matches.

At present that is not the case, and I think I've now been patient enough and listened to most of the excuses. Though I genuinely love and care for this dressing room, if they don't become more consistent then I have to make some tough decisions if we are to mount and maintain a promotion push and title challenge this season.

This squad is capable of winning this league - but if we haven't got the character, personality, attitude, discipline and desire to succeed for each other and ourselves, then we are all wasting our time. I hope tonight, especially after Sunday's performance, that we see a reaction from the lads - but it must start tonight, and it must continue for the rest of the season. If it does, I believe we'll win promotion, if it doesn't, we'll still be in this division next season.

Lastly, whoever you support let's hope for an open attacking game and may the best team win.



After stints at Bashley and Kingstonian, the Farnborough skipper joined Hampton & Richmond Borough, winning the Isthmian Premier title. Reuniting with manager Alan Dowson at Woking, he captained the team, achieving promotion to the National League and in 2023, the defender joined the Yellows.



Jack TURNER
Born: Ashford - 17 September 1992
Position: Goalkeeper

The Boro keeper began at youth level for Staines Town before moving to AFC Wimbledon, where he progressed into the first team squad. He returned to Staines in 2012 to make over 200 appearances for the Swans and in 2017, a move to Slough Town would follow. Turner began 2021/22 with Cray Wanderers before the switch to Farnborough in December of 2021 and has been ever present since he joined, being the only player to appear in every game in the 2022/23



Millar MATTHEWS-LEWIS

Born: 10 December 2004

Position: Striker

Millar developed at Luton Town from Under-14s through to Paul Benson's Development Squad, scoring twice in the2023/24 Premier League Cup and netting a hat-trick in the 2022/23 Bedfordshire Senior Cup Final against Biggleswade. Joining Farnborough on loan in January, he made 16 appearances and contributed significantly to their late Play-Off push, notably scoring in a 2-0 win over Bath City. Millar aims to help Boro go further this season in the National League South.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Farnborough 'Classic Campaigns'

1984/85

Farnborough Town won the Isthmian League First Division title in 1984/85. Ted Pearce's side won 26 of their 42 games and scored 101 goals. Keith Morris, Brian Broome and Mark Turkington netted 81 goals between them as Boro gained 86 points, finishing seven ahead of runners-up Kingstonian. They also reached the Isthmian League Cup final but lost 5-1 on aggregate to Wycombe Wanderers. Boro defeated Fleet Town 5-1, AFC Totton 5-1 after a 1-1 draw, Hungerford 4-1 after a 3-3 draw and Chippenham Town 2-1 to reach the FA Cup first round proper. Facing Football League opposition for the first time, they lost 3-0 at Hereford United.

1988/89

Farnborough Town won promotion to the Conference for the first time in 1988/89. Ted Pearce's side lost just one of their opening seven matches in the Isthmian League Premier Division. They went top of the table with a 19 match unbeaten run which included a 3-0 win at Slough over Christmas. Simon Read broke Farnborough's previous individual record of 34 goals in a season by February and went on to score 53 goals in 55 games. Boro were runners-up behind Leytonstone/Ilford and also beaten finalists in the Isthmian League Cup and Hampshire Senior Cup. They were promoted after Leytonstone/Ilford's ground failed to meet the necessary criteria.

1990/91

Farnborough Town regained Conference status at the first attempt in 1990/91. Boro started well in the Southern League Premier Division but then a slump saw them languishing in tenth place by mid-December. They surged back

to the title with 19 wins in their remaining 25 matches, with Simon Read grabbing a hat-trick in a 7-0 victory at home to Waterlooville at the end of March. The title race went to the final day and late goals by Paul Coombs and skipper Colin Fielder clinched a dramatic 2-1 win at Atherstone United as Boro pipped Gloucester City to the championship. Ted Pearce's side won 26 of their 42 Southern League games and gained 85 points.

1991/92

Farnborough Town took top-flight West Ham to an FA Cup third round replay in 1991/92. Simon Read scored four goals in their 7-1 victory at Salisbury, then grabbed a hat-trick as they triumphed 4-0 at home to Halesowen in a first round replay after a 2-2 draw. Goals by Dean Coney, Simon Read, Mick Doherty and Brian Broome gave Ted Pearce's side a 4-3 second round replay at home to Torquay United after a 1-1 draw. Farnborough were drawn at home to West Ham in the third round but switched the tie to Upton Park. Dean Coney's late penalty secured a 1-1 draw but Trevor Morley scored in the dying seconds as West Ham won 1-0 in the replay.

1993/94

Farnborough Town were Southern League champions again in 1993/94, making an immediate return to the Conference. Former coach Alan Taylor replaced long-serving Ted Pearce as manager. Farnborough lost their opening two games but just one of their next ten. Dean Coney switched to central defence and Trevor Senior arrived from Weymouth in November. Boro gained a remarkable 7-6 win at home to Chelmsford City in February. Chris Boothe grabbed a hat-trick as they triumphed

6-O at Corby and they clinched the title with a 5-O victory at home to Gresley Rovers, gaining 82 points, finishing seven ahead of runners-up Cheltenham Town.

2000/01

Farnborough Town stormed to the Isthmian League Premier Division title in 2000/01. Graham Westley's side won their opening five matches, then scored four goals at both Chesham United and St Albans City. The 1-0 win at home to Aldershot on Boxing Day was watched by 3,478. A run of 16 straight wins after New Year included a 5-0 victory at Carshalton and they lost just once during the second half of the campaign. Lenny Piper and Gary Crawshaw netted 34 goals between them as Boro won 31 of their 42 games and gained 99 points, finishing ten ahead of runners-up Canvey Island. Lenny Piper, Barry Laker and Stuart MacKenzie were ever-present.

2002/03

Farnborough Town reached the FA Cup fourth round for the first time in 2002/03. They won 6-0 at Molesey, then beat Harrogate Town 5-1 to progress beyond the FA Cup first round for only the second time. Boro triumphed 3-0 at Southport in the second round, then two goals by Danny Carroll plus another from Rocky Baptiste gave them a 3-2 win at Darlington. They were drawn at home to Arsenal in the fourth round but the game was switched to Highbury. Manager-owner-chairman Graham Westley saw that his investment in the club could be repaid through the Cup income and after a 5-1 defeat, he took seven players with him to Stevenage.

2007/08

The reformed Farnborough won the Southern League First Division South 6 West title in 2007/08. The club had gone into administration and was deducted ten points. Expelled from the Conference, the reformed club was admitted to the Southern League First Division South 6 West. Andy Clement's side won 27 of their 42 games and were the highest scorers with 120 goals, including 13 in the two matches against Newport IOW. They won 7-2 at AFC Hayes, also trouncing Andover 6-0, Abingdon United 6-1 and slamming

five goals past Bracknell, Fleet Town, Gosport Borough and Slough. Gaining 89 points, they finished four ahead of runners-up Fleet.

2009/10

Farnborough won the Southern League Premier Division title in 2009/10. Steve King's side raced to the top of the table, winning their opening five matches and remaining unbeaten in their first 14 games, including a 7-0 victory at Swindon Supermarine. The run ended with a 2-0 defeat at home to title rivals Nuneaton Town. Dean McDonald netted hat-tricks in their 4-0 wins at Bashley and Rugby Town. Farnborough triumphed 6-1 at home to Bedford Town and won 28 of their 42 games. They were the highest scorers with 100 goals and gained 93 points, finishing five ahead of runners-up Nuneaton. Dean McDonald was leading marksman with 28 goals.



2021/22

Farnborough won promotion to the Conference South in 2021/22. They were early pacesetters after losing only two of their first 15 Southern League Premier South Division games, including eight straight wins. Bouncing back from a 4-2 defeat at promotion rivals Hayes & Yeading, they lost just one of their next 12 matches and won 26 of their 42 games. Farnborough qualified for the play-offs in third place with 85 points. Late goals by CJ Fearn and Mitchell Parker gave Farnborough a dramatic 2-1 victory at home to Metropolitan Police in the semi-finals. Mitchell Parker and Sam Deering scored to give them a 2-1 win at Hayes & Yeading in the play-off final.

A tense clash saw the Wood secure a 3-0 win over Boro, breaking the deadlock after a quiet first half. Although the Wood controlled possession, clear chances were scarce, with Boro's Matt Jones proving a thorn in their side.

After halftime, Wood's Reece Beckles and Junior Morias had near-misses before a crucial substitution changed the game. Graeme Montgomery's introduction in the 62nd minute allowed the Wood to shift to a 4-4-2, and this tactical change quickly paid off.

Montgomery's stunning volley put Wood ahead in the 69th minute, and Morias added a second with a powerful strike shortly after. In the dying moments, Angol was fouled by the Boro keeper, converting the penalty to mark his 20th goal of the season. Ian Allison's side would come away with a vital three points, while Boro's attacking threat faded late on.


