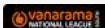

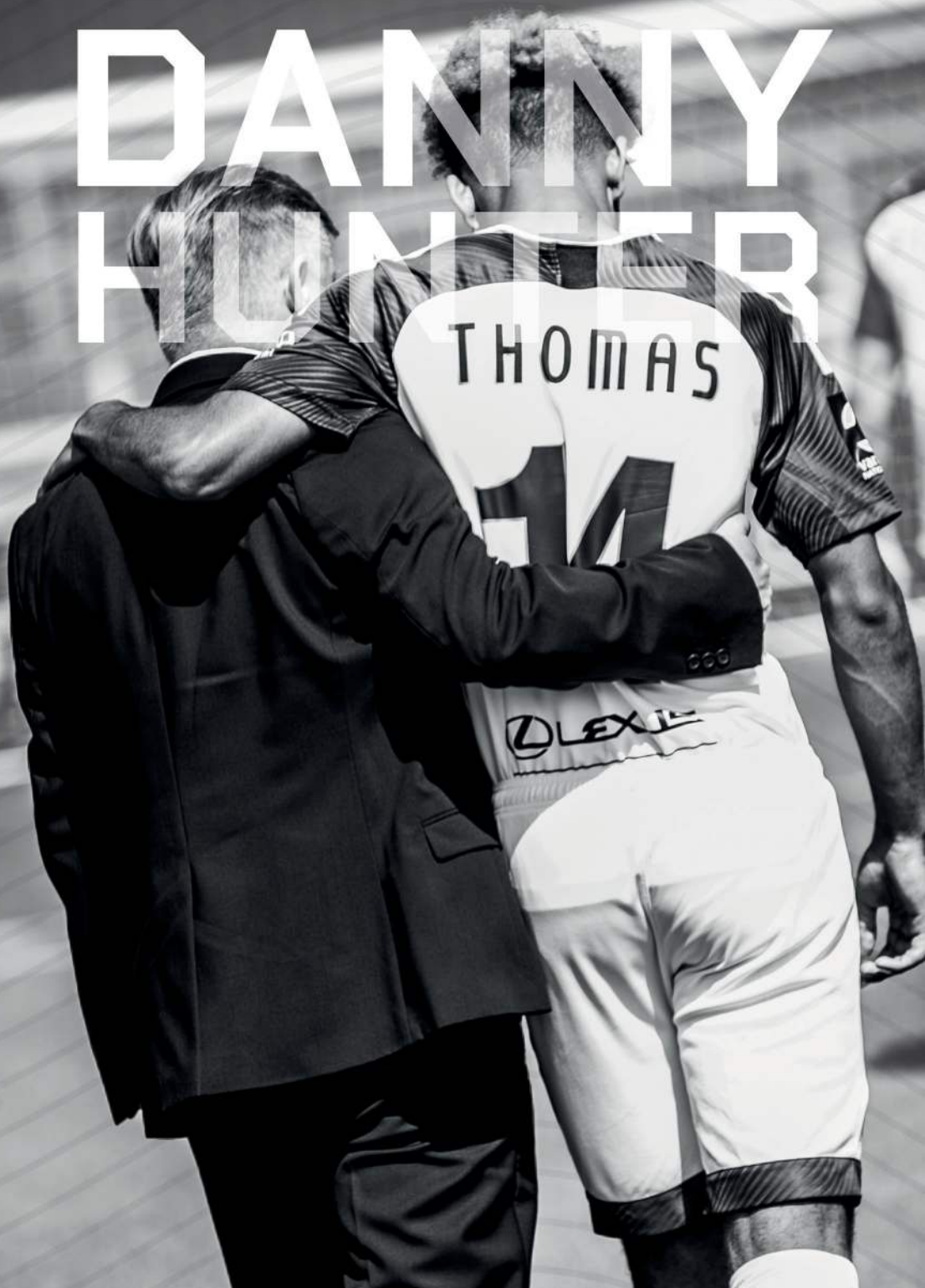

***Today we welcome Chesham United to the Mangata Pay UK stadium.
May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an
enjoyable time with us and a safe journey home later.***

Well, after a season and a half of possible mixed messages and some upheaval, it feels like the wheels are once again being oiled and beginning to turn for us as a club and as a dressing room - I certainly hope so. I feel the consistent messaging given for months is resonating with key people, including key staff and players at the club, who, in all honesty, are the ones who can make all the difference. It's their decision-making and acceptance of what's needed that firstly make the small improvements, and when those are successful, they turn those small improvements into big improvements.

For me, this consistent messaging, better relationships, decision making and recruitment since our relegation, have been key to our upturn in form and led to much of our November progress. As such, if Luke, the dressing room, Charlie Hunter and myself can turn our improvements into genuine belief and realistic ambition that in turn will turn into continued momentum.

In truth, all four of the promotion seasons I've overseen in my time here have always involved good leadership, good recruitment and momentum. Momentum is possibly one of the most undervalued commodities in football - but when you combine it with leadership and good recruitment it normally brings success.

For me, this is the first period since our Play-off season 18 months ago that I'm experiencing myself, my key people and partners all being on the same page. I feel that is why we are quietly going about our business more consistently and a big reason why we've just won three consecutive league games for the first time since our National League Play-Off Season in 2022/23, where we won 5 on the spin.

It's also why we now have a win ratio of 55%, and why we are suddenly up to 18 points per game this season and 2 points per game since Luke's return. That upturn in form is not a fluke and has been achieved with very little fuss, after some honest and open conversations.

I'm now starting to see a more professional and focused approach across the club and a lot of hard work is being carried out both mentally and physically. These are the small improvements I often write or speak about, but they do lead to momentum shifts and inner belief, giving players confidence in what we're doing.

On top of that, our improved leadership and intelligent game management, have shown itself hugely in recent substitute changes and Luke's clever selection policy of late - all that has moved us up to fourth in the league.

Fourth in the league was a minimum requirement for us at the start of the season after our relegation. That said, we are now just two points behind the league leaders without ever hitting the heights and that again will bring us real belief that success is a possibility this season.

If success does come, I feel it will be down to the honesty and newfound trust we have in each other and when I retire I will possibly remember that sea change the most. Also, our NO drama approach, better understanding and improved communications mean we've quietly got ourselves back into the promotion pack and hopefully back into the title conversation.

In truth, today's visitors and their management team have impressed me enormously in regards to how they've gone about their business after their promotion

last season. No doubt they will look forward to testing themselves in this period around Christmas and the New Year and I fancy them to keep themselves on the edge of the Play-offs and perhaps even manage to make them.

Luke already knows that today is going to be a more than difficult game. He knows Chesham United will work extremely hard, are well drilled and have an organised management team, a relatively settled squad, an effective way of playing, and knows they love to upset the teams above them in this league.

We are, though, content with the progress we are quietly making on and off the park at present and I'm especially happy with the progress we've made recently with our academy, commercial department, and with HBC, AFC, and AWFC.

I'm also really pleased for both Luke and Charlie that the recent squad improvements are making a real difference to the quality and depth of our squad. I feel their hard work regarding our mini squad rebuild has more than assisted our recent upturn in form - so credit where credit is due and long may these improvements continue.

As I've told you all for many months through consistent messaging, firstly we would need to eat, sleep and drink our promotion challenge. Then comes good recruitment, mental strength, leadership, experience, good decision-making, character, attitude, discipline and desire, if we wanted to be in a position to win a title, and nothing has changed.

On top of that, we've still had to maintain, re-look and improve our budget, then sustain our investment, let a manager go, re-hire a rejuvenated Luke Garrard, slightly rebuild a squad, rebuild our infrastructure, employ new right people and finally deal with the consistent setbacks and adversity facing it head-on, but with forward thinking.

Only by experiencing success and failure in the past, do you know how to overcome certain failures, whether that's in business or on the football front.....trust me, you cannot succeed with just a Plan A, you must always be flexible, fluid and have a Plan B, C and D.

I already knew in the summer if we were to get anywhere near a Play-off place, or close to a title push in January, February, March and April - then it would mean tough choices, real hard work, inner belief, patience, resilience and most importantly having a manager who understands the importance of game management - that was vital.

Thinking of an analogy to motor racing, at present our promotion race now involves possibly 8 or 9 cars (football clubs in this case) and things at this stage of the season mirror the cars on the starting grid at a Grand Prix. It's at this time of year when every car including the also-rans is still vying to be on the front row of the grid in December. However, the grid (or promotion race in our case) doesn't remotely hot up until the end of January and from then on it begins gathering pace until Easter.

In truth by then, most of these cars (clubs) will have run their race.....some will not have the investment to compete, the budget to sustain, the squad depth, the player quality nor the experience off the park to see the race through.

To complete a successful season is always such a tough challenge to all and this season is where I hope our long-standing investment, budget, experience, consistent messaging, and dressing room quality, aligned to Lukes' experience, and Charlie's recruitment, will hopefully give us a realistic promotion shot.

Being a full-time club will I hope mean that we enter the final months of the season as a fit, focused and fresh club still very much in the title conversation. If that is the case we, along with perhaps two or three

other clubs who I believe will maintain their momentum, I'd expect to slowly pull clear of the chasing pack and fight it out for the title - anyway, that's the plan haha.

We know, though, that we must guard against complacency and today's game is a point in case, as clubs like Chesham United and their supporters will take great delight in putting a dent in our title ambitions and I'd expect nothing less from a side who still have their own Play-off ambitions.

Having beaten Eastbourne United in the FA Trophy last Saturday in awful conditions, and then dispatched St Albans City on Tuesday and having pushed ourselves to within two points of the current league leaders, this next phase of matches will become our latest club, dressing room and squad strength barometer. We are now going to see if we can cope with the pressure of once again being in and around the top teams and again being close to the top of the table. Sometimes it's much easier for a dressing room when trying to reach the summit but harder when trying to stay there.

That's why we've already seen this leadership in the league change hands so many times this season, and nobody to date has remotely handled that pressure well.

In my four promotion seasons here, including two League Title wins, it always came down to who handled the pressure, who perhaps had the best management team, best handled the crowd expectation, and dealt with recruitment, injuries, suspensions and setbacks.

For me if we can manage our expectations, improve our squad just a tad and if Luke can manage to give us another stint back at the top of this league before the end of January, then I feel under Luke, we would be in a far better position to cope with promotion pressure and expectation as we move toward the run in.

Today though is not about looking too far ahead.... it's more about quietly dealing with ourselves, our own expectations, our supporters' expectations and dealing with the future setbacks that we're sure to face. Trust me, there will be further setbacks this season, that said, as the season progresses, hopefully those and the levels of adversity will become less and less.

Experience tells me that pre-Christmas is not about getting too far in front of yourself, it's more about being honest, realistic, pragmatic and about reducing your lows and dealing with any adversity positively where possible.

I say that because our recent good form has meant thankfully that football pressure and expectation have returned to us, as it means we are back in the mix and if we can turn our next run of three home fixtures between now and New Year's Day into wins, then we could go into 2025 in great form, with hope and an even greater belief in each other and our process.

Firstly though we must deal with a very good Chesham United side and all they have to offer this afternoon. We've already beaten them once this season in a closely fought encounter at 'The Meadow' and with them on the edge of the Play-offs with games in hand, we can expect little to choose between the two teams.

Finally, whoever you support let's hope for an open attacking game and may the best team win.

Good Afternoon, firstly I would like to welcome James Duncan and Michael Murray, their Staff and Players to The Mangata Pay Uk Stadium for today's National South fixture.

With another positive midweek result, today is massively important to continue the current run we find ourselves on.

As it stands, we are top of the form guide with a return of 13 points from a possible 15, and that has propelled us into the play-offs with us currently sitting 4th, just two points off the top.

We hit the 2points per game mark on Tuesday evening and that was a target I set the group on my return, we now have a new target and we want to achieve that in the coming weeks.

Lastly, I want to thank the fans for their support on Tuesday, you all played a huge part in the result. The noise and atmosphere definitely had an impact on the team.

We need you behind us, if we are to achieve what we want come the end of the season you are all going to be massive in our success.

Let's keep the momentum going.

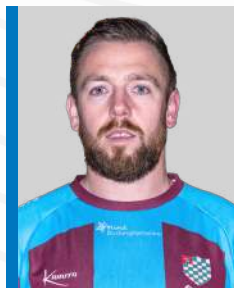
IN THE DUGOUT

Born: 20 October 1989

Position: Defender

Combative centre back, club captain and one of the first players to put pen to paper when James Duncan and Michael Murray were appointed in October of 2018, Steve Brown had made 128 appearances for the Generals before lifting the Southern League Premier South title with the club last season. The defender had previously featured for the likes of Potters Bar Town, Northwood and Oxhey Jets before joining the Buckinghamshire side.

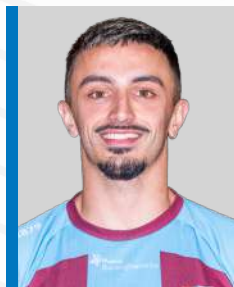


Mitchell WEISS

Born: 11 August 1993

Position: Striker

'Mitch' joined the Generals in the summer from St Albans City. A fan favourite at the Saints, Weiss had spent the last four seasons at Clarence Park, finishing his spell there with 14 goals last season, accompanied by 12 assists. Prior to his time with St Albans City, Weiss had featured for Kings Langley, bagging an impressive 41 goals in a season, as well as for Hemel Hempstead Town and Hayes & Yeading.



Nathan MINHAS

Born: 16 September 1997

Position: Striker

Nathan Minhas, a prolific goalscorer at both step two and three, joined the Generals from Slough Town in the summer. The striker had previously scored 17 goals for Slough in his first season in South, also scoring 52 goals across two seasons with Beaconsfield. As well as the above, Minhas represented Panjab in the 2018 CONIFA World Cup, scoring three times as the team finished fifth overall.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

CHESHAM UNITED

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Chesham United 'Classic Campaigns'

1966/67

Chesham United reached the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in 1966/67. Sid Prosser's side beat Wembley 1-0, Southall 4-3, Hertford Town 1-0, after a 0-0 draw, then Leatherhead 2-1 in the FA Cup before losing 6-0 at that season's Amateur Cup winners Enfield in the first round proper. They also won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup, defeating Slough Town 2-1 after extra-time, then Maidenhead United 2-1 before Cooley's extra-time goal clinched a memorable 1-0 win over Wycombe Wanderers in the final. The Generals finished third in the Athenian League First Division, equalling their best-ever achievement of two years earlier.

1967/68

Chesham United reached the Amateur Cup final in 1967/68. John Reardon's side were 1000-1 outsiders at the start of the competition but beat Hemel Hempstead 2-0, Didcot Town 3-0, Hazells (Aylesbury) 2-0, Marlow 3-1, Soham Town Rangers 1-0, after a 1-1 draw, Maidenhead United 2-1, after two 2-2 draws, Dulwich Hamlet 4-2, after a 1-1 draw, Corinthian Casuals 1-0, after a 0-0 draw, Oxford City 2-0 after a 0-0 draw and Wealdstone 2-0. The following team lost 1-0 to Leytonstone in the Wembley final: Dennis Wells, Brian Thackeray, Derek Smith, Brian Caterer, Les Burgess, Mick McCaffrey, Dave Ellis, Dave Black, Ron Fruen, Joe Harper, Kenny Kent.

1979/80

Chesham United reached the FA Cup third round proper for the first time in 1979/80. Mike Hall's side beat Boreham Wood 2-0, Haverhill Rovers 3-0, after a 0-0 draw, Bedford Town 1-0, after a 0-0 draw, then Maidstone United 3-1 to reach

the FA Cup first round proper. They won 2-1 at Minehead, then 3-1 at Merthyr Tydfil, after a 1-1 draw, to reach the third round. The following team lost 2-0 to Cambridge United watched by a record 5,000 attendance at The Meadow: Billy Barber, Paul Griffiths, Tim Smith, Bobby Horrastead, Norman Dodd, Peter Johnson, Alan Jackett, John Watt, Rob Martell, Danny Johnson (Joe Maguire), Steve Woolfrey.

1986/87

Chesham United won the Isthmian League Second Division North title at the first attempt in 1986/87. Barry Gould replaced caretaker-boss Jim Hegarty as manager in early September after an inconsistent start and Chesham soared to the top of the table, with new signing Francis Araquez adding flair to the team. By New Year's Day, they were eight points clear with two games in hand. The Generals clinched the title with a 1-0 win over Letchworth Garden City. They won 28 of their 42 games and gained 90 points, finishing seven points ahead of runners-up Wolverton as they won promotion straight back to the Isthmian League First Division.

1990/91

Chesham United won the Isthmian League First Division title in 1990/91. They gained an early 7-2 victory at home to Whyteleafe but John Clements was sacked after an FA Cup exit at home to Enfield and George Borg replaced him as manager. Chesham lost 1-0 at home to title rivals Bromley but hammered Southwick 8-1 and clinched the title with another 8-1 win over Worthing. Michael Banton and Byron Walton scored 45 of their 102 goals as Chesham won 27 of their 42 games, gaining 89 points

and finishing nine points ahead of runners-up Bromley. They lost 5-4 on penalties after a 2-2 draw with Bishop's Stortford in the Isthmian League Cup final.

1992/93

Chesham United won the Isthmian League Premier Division title in 1992/93. New signings included former Liverpool defender Mark Lawrenson and Chesham soared to the top of the table with 18 wins in a 23 match unbeaten run. Gerald Aplin's side trounced Stevenage 7-1, Bognor Regis 6-1 and Carshalton 5-1. The run ended with a defeat at Stevenage but Chesham stayed top with a 1-1 draw at rivals St Albans City watched by 3,120. They won 30 of their 42 games and won the title with 98 points but were denied promotion to the Conference due to ground grading. Chesham retained the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup with a 1-0 victory over Abingdon.

1996/97

Chesham United won the Isthmian League First Division title in 1996/97. The Generals lost only two of their opening 16 games, with John Lawford scoring four times in their 4-0 victory at home to Barton Rovers. They lost 4-0 at title rivals Basingstoke in mid-February and Andy Thomas replaced Paul O'Reilly as manager the following month. Chesham gained seven straight wins during the closing weeks, beating Tooting & Mitcham 4-0 and Berkhamsted 5-2, then winning 2-1 at home to rivals Basingstoke. They won 27 of their 42 games and gained 87 points, finishing eight ahead of runners-up Basingstoke as they returned to the Premier Division.

2009/10

Chesham United won promotion back to the Southern League Premier Division in 2009/10. The Generals won 24 of their 42 Southern League First Division Midlands games, beating Sutton Coldfield 4-1 at The Meadow as well as both Beaconsfield SYCOB and Soham Town Rangers. They won 3-0 at home to Atherstone Town, Barton Rovers, Biggleswade Town, Rothwell Town, Stourport Swifts and Woodford United. Andy Leese's side finished fourth with 80 points,

qualifying for the Southern League First Division Midlands play-offs for the second consecutive season. They beat Burnham 1-0 in the semi-finals, then Slough Town 4-0 in the final.

2013/14

Chesham United reached the Southern League Premier Division play-off final in 2013/14. They had lost in the play-offs in the previous two seasons. The Generals started slowly before soaring to the top after dropping only four points in 16 matches. Top scorer Drew Roberts grabbed a hat-trick in their 8-0 win at home to Banbury and Chris Dillon netted four goals in their 4-2 victory at Weymouth as Chesham secured 12 straight wins. Andy Leese's side finished runners-up with 92 points and beat Stourbridge 2-1 in the play-off semi-finals but lost 3-1 to St Albans City in the final. They defeated Beaconsfield SYCOB 1-0 in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup final.



2023/24

Joint-managers James Duncan and Michael Murray guided Chesham United to the Southern League Premier Division South title in 2023/24. The Generals won their opening seven games before losing 2-1 at home to Winchester City. They also beat Walton & Hersham 3-1, Farnham 2-1, Margate 2-0 and Braintree 3-1, after a 0-0 draw, in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 at home to Maidstone United in the first round proper. Chesham then lost just twice in 25 matches, gaining another seven straight wins. They won 28 of their 42 games and gained 90 points, finishing nine ahead of runners-up AFC Totton as they secured promotion to the Conference South.


