Today we welcome Eastbourne Borough to the Mangata Pay UK stadium. May I wish their Directors, players and supporters an enjoyable time with us and a safe journey home.

Although our league position has stayed pretty static since Luke's reappointment, it doesn't truly reflect the small margins of improvement that we are now making. I feel we are all quietly starting to see those small margins that I've spoken about in my programme notes in recent months - but in any football season, you must first deal with the lows and the setbacks if you want to reach the highs and I feel we are now doing that.

My notes have recently addressed the start of our mini squad rebuild, plus the need for further investment, addressing the playing budget, re-focusing on our new academy structure, trying to be more resolute mentally and addressing better game management and trying to improve our full-time fitness levels.

Once the above is achieved, it is still about having the leaders, characters, attitude, discipline, desire and most importantly it is also about consistent performances and improved results. It was very clear to me before Ross Jenkins' departure that we needed a reset to be more solid defensively, be more workmanlike but creative in midfield, and address the lack of goals.

Importantly, we needed to show more character, togetherness, resolve and create a winning mentality. Of course, there is still a long, long way to go but thankfully the small margins of improvement that we speak about have started to become more apparent.

With a heavier focus nowadays on match stats which is so prevalent at our level of football I personally feel that my manager, his staff and you supporters have to be very careful not to become too heavily reliant on them, as some of the stats are in truth more about football fashion, and I've discussed that with Luke.

Put simply, stats and data don't tell you about intelligent game management, intelligent use of substitutes and intelligent man management. Stats don't necessarily mean you are working smart, as they don't tell you when to kick someone up the backside when they need it, when to put an arm around a player who is perhaps struggling a bit, or teach you when to listen and not just talk.

Data doesn't tell you the true importance of a modern gaffer, as it doesn't define his man management, the importance of communication, relationships, the reading of situations or how he chooses to lead, unite and focus his promotion-chasing dressing room into title winners.

That's the barometer an experienced Chairman like myself would judge football people on.....l, of course, have to differentiate between 'new' and 'old school' values and take into consideration social media etc, but fundamentally values like honesty, integrity and genuinely caring are how I have always judged the good, the bad and the ugly about managers and staff.

I can tell you though that once again we have a good manager and a more committed group of staff.

What my eyes tell me at present are that week by week we are becoming slightly more focused, well drilled and becoming a difficult side to beat - that said, we are still not quite looking like the free-flowing team that we're trying to be, but with hard work I hope that will come.

However, after our mixed start to this season, we are thankfully not playing horseshoe football anymore, yes we do have lapses - but we are not playing suicide football at the back and it's one of the reasons we have one of the best defensive records in the league. That in truth is what I expected with Luke Garrard in charge, and it's all to do with good communication, good coaching, good management and good players.

At the moment Luke and the dressing room are still trying to find the right blend between defence, midfield and attack - but as I said, I genuinely feel that progress, albeit slowly, is being made. For me, one of the reasons why we are not looking quite so balanced and free-flowing down the left in recent weeks is not having the creativity of Erico Sousa.

Charles Clayden suffering a hamstring injury was also a blow, because Charles and Erico's absence does take away some of our pace, and also takes away two of our game-changers and match-winners. That said, with Kwezi Appiah, Tyrone Marsh, Junior Dixon, Lee Ndlovu and Abdul Abdulmalik now all fit, the squad is looking much stronger offensively.

In terms of our mini squad rebuild, the recent arrival of two ball carriers in Jayden Richardson and Jon Benton, has improved us and the small margins we felt were needed regarding our squad improvement are starting to show.

We are still quietly looking to add one or two to the squad - but as I said in my last notes, this is evolution, not revolution and any new signings must have the character, personality, work ethic and hunger to want promotion, and want to work hard at fitting into our squad and they cannot just expect to be a starter unless their performances dictate.

Our squad is evolving, it is improving, our character and ability is also now slowly starting to show itself and the attitude. discipline and desire I constantly talk about is beginning to permeate through the squad, the staff and the club. That has shown itself with recent victories over two of our promotion rivals in Farnborough and Truro City - it also showed itself in two well-earned 0-0 draws, against two other promotion rivals, down at Weston Super Mare and at home to Torquay United. In truth, we were the better side in all four of those games and we then followed those results up last Saturday and on Monday, with two important on-the-road victories at Bath City and Chelmsford City.

The stats that really interest me at present, are the ones in the WIN column, in the goals FOR column and in the goals AGAINST column..... it is also great to see our match winners and game changers now making such a difference off the bench, as that meant we have slowly climbed back and are now averaging around 1.75 points per game. Under Luke, we are now averaging around 1.9 points

per game and we feel if we can become just slightly more consistent, and add a few more goals, we could even get that up close to 2 points per game.

We also feel if we can slightly improve our squad strength in the coming months, that we can get to around 86 to 92 points this season and feel that would give us a minimum top three position and might even mean we could win the title, as everyone appears to beat everyone else in this league.

To do that though, we must focus on maintaining the best defensive record in this league and try and keep things down to under a goal a game conceded, whilst also hitting upwards of 70 goals......if we can do that it will ensure plenty of W's in the Win column and from there who knows where Luke and this squad might take us?

Tuesday is another very big test for us, as it brings local rivals St Albans City to our humble abode - we have not played the Saints in the league for almost a decade and so it promises to be a pre-Christmas cracker and one both supporters will enjoy.

I know things are tight with Christmas coming up - but please do your very best to get yourselves down here on Tuesday night and if you get your tickets early, there are several community initiatives to make this game more affordable for all of our fans pre Xmas. At present the St Albans City fans are outbuying our supporters by around 4 to 1 but, as always, history tells me you'll buy your tickets late but you'll be there in your numbers on the night.

Anyway back to today, it's all about the FA Trophy and our task in hand is beating a very good Eastbourne Borough side. We have already played them twice, both at Eastbourne, once in the FA Cup and once in the league and we each have a win apiece.

I again expect things to be very tight this afternoon - but hopefully with home advantage we can nick a positive result and progress into the next round.

Lastly, whoever you support, let's hope for an open attacking game and may the hest team win.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED

EASTBOURNE BOROUGH

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten leading Eastbourne Borough managers

PETER CHERRY

Colourful, long-serving manager Peter Cherry guided Langney Sports (as Eastbourne Borough were then known) through all three divisions of the Sussex County League. A big, bustling centre-forward, he played for Seaford before ending his career at Langney. He became manager in 1983, taking them to the Sussex League Third Division title in 1986-87 and Second Division title in 1987-88, also the 1992 Sussex Senior Cup final. Success was based on local players such as Mick Green, Nigel Hole, Steve Dell and the Callingham brothers. Leaving Langney in May 1996, he then managed Eastbourne Town until May 2001. He died in March 2023.

STEVE RICHARDSON

Steve Richardson managed Langney Sports to the FA Cup fourth qualifying round for the first time in 1998-99. A former midfielder, 'Rico' had spells at Ringmer and Hailsham, where he was 'Player of the Year' in 1985-86. He joined Eastbourne Town in August 1986 and was 'Player of the Year' in 1987-88. Moving via Whitehawk back to Hailsham, becoming playerboss, he managed Langney Sports from May 1996 until January 1999, also guiding them to fourth place in the Sussex League First Division in 1997-98. Rejoining Hailsham as manager, where his team included sons Paul and Martin, he briefly managed Whitehawk before resigning in June 2001.

GARRY WILSON

Long-serving manager Garry Wilson guided Eastbourne Borough from the Sussex League to Conference National. A former Scotland Youth defender, he played for Campsie Black Watch, Queen's Park, Kirkintilloch Rob Roy, Stranraer and Hastings Town. He became Hastings' boss, plotting their 1995 Southern League Cup and 1996 Sussex Senior Cup final triumphs. Briefly

St Leonards' assistant-boss, he managed Eastbourne Borough from February 1999 until January 2012, plotting four promotions as well as their first two Sussex Senior Cup triumphs. He was Eastbourne Town's assistant-boss, then managed Lewes and Hastings United.



TOMMY WIDDRINGTON

Tommy Widdrington managed Eastbourne
Borough's 2016 Sussex Senior Cup win. Initially
at Southampton, the midfielder joined Grimsby
in July 1996 and featured in their 1997-98
promotion and Auto Windscreens Shield 'double'
success. He captained Port Vale's 2001 League
Trophy triumph, then was a promotion winner
with Hartlepool in 2002-03 before spells at
Macclesfield and Port Vale again. Moving to
Salisbury in February 2005, he starred in their
rise to the Conference National and became
player-boss. He has since managed Hemel
Hempstead, Eastbourne Borough from February
2012 until April 2017, King's Lynn and Aldershot
Town

JAMIE HOWELL

Ex-England Schoolboy midfielder Jamie Howell managed Eastbourne Borough. He helped Arsenal win the 1994 FA Youth Cup, then had spells with Portsmouth, Torquay United and Brighton prior to joining Bognor Regis in October 1997. Making over 400 appearances

for them, he became Burgess Hill's player-coach in June 2007 and later player-manager. He rejoined Bognor Regis as assistant-boss in June 2009 and became manager, taking them to the Conference South in 2016-17. Managing Eastbourne Borough from May 2017 until February 2019, he has since held coaching posts and run a football business with his brother-in-law Adam Hinshelwood.

MARK McGHEE

Ex-Scotland international striker Mark McGhee had a spell as Eastbourne Borough's caretakerboss. Initially with Bristol City, he played for Morton and Newcastle before moving to Aberdeen in March 1979, starring as they twice won the Scottish League and ECWC. After spells at Hamburg, Celtic and Newcastle again, he was Reading's player-boss, guiding them to the Second Division title in 1993-94. He managed Leicester and Wolves, then plotted promotion with Millwall in 2000-01 and Brighton in 2003-04 before managing Motherwell (twice), Aberdeen, Bristol Rovers and Barnet. He was Boro's caretaker-boss from February 2019 until May 2019

LEE BRADBURY

Ex-England U-21 striker Lee Bradbury had a brief spell as Eastbourne Borough's manager. A former soldier, he moved from Cowes to Portsmouth in August 1995 and was top scorer and 'Player of the Year' as they reached the FA Cup sixth round in 1996-97. He followed Alan Ball to Manchester City for £3,000,000 in August 1997. He joined Crystal Palace in October 1998 and returned to Pompey in October 1999. Later with Walsall, Oxford United, Southend and AFC Bournemouth, he won promotion in 2009-10, becoming playerboss, since managing Havant & Waterlooville, Eastbourne Borough from May 2019 until October 2019 and Eastleigh.

DANNY BLOOR

Danny Bloor managed Eastbourne Borough to the FA Cup first round proper in 2020-21, facing past winners Blackpool at Priory Lane in front of the BT Sport cameras. He began his managerial career with Worthing, then managed Eastbourne Town from December 2009 until June 2013, assisted by Garry Wilson in 2012-13, before a spell as Lewes' assistant-boss. Later assisting Lee Bradbury at Eastbourne Borough, he became their manager in November 2019, consistently

finishing in the top third of the Conference South until leaving in June 2023 after a take-over. He managed Welling United between June 2023 and January 2024, since managing Hastings United.

MARK BEARD

Mark Beard managed Eastbourne Borough during the 2023-24 campaign. A former midfielder, he captained Millwall's 1991 FA Youth Cup final triumph and scored in their 1994-95 FA Cup win at Arsenal. He played for Sheffield United and was Southend's 'Player of the Year' in 1998-99. Later at Kingstonian, then Southend and Kingstonian again, he was at San Pedro before winning the FA Trophy with Stevenage in 2007 and promotion with AFC Wimbledon in 2007-08. He was player-boss at Haywards Heath and Tooting & Mitcham, coaching at Brighton, Stockport County and Dorking Wanderers before managing Boro from June 2023 until January 2024.



ADAM MURRAY

Ex-England Youth midfielder Adam Murray is Eastbourne Borough's manager. Initially at Derby County, he was loaned to Mansfield and helped win promotion in 2001-02. He had spells with Burton Albion, Notts County and Kidderminster before rejoining Mansfield in July 2004. Moving to Carlisle in March 2005, he featured in their 2005-06 League Two title campaign, then played for Torquay, Macclesfield, Oxford United and Luton. He rejoined Mansfield and was player-coach in their 2012-13 Conference title triumph. Later managing Boston United, then AFC Fylde to the Conference North title in 2022-23, he has managed Boro since January 2024.

Luke Garrard's return as manager saw Boreham Wood secure a 1-0 victory over Eastbourne Borough in the Emirates FA Cup.

A second-half strike from Junior Dixon proved decisive, sending the Wood into the third round qualifying. The Wood started strongly, with Kwesi Appiah heading wide early, while Nathan Ashmore denied Eastbourne's free-kick effort. Eastbourne's Shaun Williams nearly scored from his own half, but the ball struck the crossbar.

In the second half, Boreham Wood increased the tempo. Eastbourne keeper Holter impressed with key saves but couldn't stop Dixon's composed 70th-minute finish from a Gus Mafuta assist. Eastbourne pushed for an equaliser late, with Ligendza firing just wide in stoppage time. The Wood defence held firm, preserving the clean sheet. Despite Sousa missing a late chance, Dixon's goal ensured Garrard's side advanced.


