Today we welcome Chippenham Town to the Mangata Pay UK stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager and players an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well after being close to the top of the form guide over the last three months, we have put ourselves bang in the middle of the promotion conversation, and after putting in honest away performances especially in December and January away at Bath City, Chelmsford City, Enfield Town and Welling United that resulted in 12 points in 4 away games, it looks like we're now in it to win it.

In that time we also went down to Weymouth in the FA Trophy, rested five big players from the previous starting XI, whilst still being without the injured Erico Sousa, Junior Dixon, Tyrone Marsh and Femi Ilesanmi. We won the game 2-1 with a bit to spare and results like that will give Luke the confidence to mix his starting XI up at Aldershot in the last 16 of the FA Trophy, if he feels it will help our promotion push.

Our recent player recruitment has meant we are now looking much stronger, with some of our younger players starting to gain vital match experience and some

much needed game management. These are I feel important factors into why we are now grinding out wins in tight games and winning ugly.

In truth I also think we've improved our fitness levels, our work ethic, our togetherness and our quality over the last three or four months and that showed itself last Saturday down at Welling and again on Tuesday evening at home to Hampton, where both games were won pretty comfortably against two resolute, hard working and well organised teams.

Luke 11 days ago mixed up his starting XI at Wormley Rovers in the Herts Senior Cup - but by resting 12 senior players four days before the Welling game and using 9 academy players within the squad, the game proved a step too far for our youngsters and we exited the competition.

Put simply the message within the dressing room is, nothing must get in the way of our

promotion push, as such we arrive here today against Chippenham Town sitting top of the league, full of confidence after overcoming a poor start to the season. We are a tad fresher after Luke's recent squad rotations and now have momentum on our side after taking our unbeaten run to 14 in both League and FA Trophy.

That said, we know will face a well organised and hard working Chippenham Town here today, who boast a top 7 away record in the division and so must be given the utmost of respect. After today we then travel to Worthing on Tuesday to play one of our promotion challengers to end what has been a very busy January.

So as we enter the second half of the season, we know we have an improved squad, and recent results now mean it has become difficult to play down our title ambitions, as it's clear to everyone that we are now going full tilt for the League and half tilt for a Quarter Final spot in the FA Trophy.

This afternoon we face another banana skin, as those who travelled down to Chippenham can tell you. We really struggled to take control of that game at times, however we worked hard, found a way to just about edge it, and nicked a 1-0 win courtesy of a set piece Kwezi Appiah header.

Our squad as I've said, has evolved nicely over the last three or four months and will include Jayden Richardson, Jon Benton and Matt Rush this afternoon. Jayden was with Aberdeen last season, Matt Rush we managed to take from Sutton United and Jon Benton we took from Solihull Moors.....

All three were signed on free's and In truth we are delighted to secure the services of three young, very talented footballers, who we believe can help us challenge for promotion. Jayden in my opinion has slipped into the right wing back role seamlessly, Jon has added energy, legs and guile to our midfield and Matt has already

found the net five times after making his debut in our New Years Day win against Slough Town..

Matt that day helped himself to a debut brace and along with Abdul Abdulmalik, turned what was a tight game against Slough Town on its head, as we went from 1-1 to 5-1 very quickly. That type of impact, alongside Kwezi getting himself another hat trick, meant we battered Slough in the last half hour and it could have been six, seven or eight.

On the exit side of things, we received an offer for striker Lee Ndlovu two weeks ago from Barnet and after discussions with Luke and Charlie, decided to accept what was a reasonable offer for a player who would of been out of contract in just over 12 weeks. In truth Lee had already made it clear to me personally, that he was not going to sign a new contract and so we made the decision to sell him, take the fee and possibly look at signing Junior Dixon on a permanent from Birmingham City.

I personally feel we are working smarter within the current transfer market compared to the last few seasons and feel with our new strike force and attacking midfield options, we now have a nice mixture of legs, guile, goals, youth, experience and strength.

With Erico Sousa also now nearing full fitness, I feel our attacking strength will continue to have an impact on the promotion race going forward and believe our new signings and strength from the bench could ultimately make the difference. As it is clear that our substitutes are becoming game changers, who have helped us recently get big wins away at Bath City, Chelmsford City, Enfield Town and Welling Utd, whilst also getting us results in the FA Trophy.

So as we near completion of our January fixtures, I hope we continue to show our defensive qualities, our improved game management, as well as our attacking

strength and renewed player confidence, which I feel has been brought about by our mid season mini squad rebuild.

I told you all some months ago, what I felt was needed across the club, and I hope through positive messaging that you understand, that any squad rebuild in mid season can only ever be about evolution not revolution. I know talk is cheap in football, but between Luke, Charlie and myself we've quietly managed to sign three very good players in mid-season who at present are all in the starting XI and gone from 11th to top of the table in that time.

In that period, we've lost just once in the league since November, remained unbeaten in December and January, whilst also progressing to the last 16 in the FA Trophy. We've now taken 32 points from our last 13 league games and averaged 2.46 points per game since the start of November.... So I cannot be anything other than pleased.

Following our recruitment, we've also had a return of some of our injured players, as such the squad had become slightly bloated in certain areas which meant we could control the budget better by allowing John Goddard to return to Slough Town, Cameron Cox to go on loan to Salisbury and agree Lee Ndlovu being sold to Barnet.

I genuinely feel after what has been a difficult last 12 months and problematic start to our season, that we have through experience, character, hard work, further investment and a bit of old fashioned fight, clawed our way back into this seasons promotion race. Which means I'm now (almost) happy with our squad strength, (almost) happy with our player quality, and very happy with our recent recruits and results.

The positive messaging and mindset change of key staff has also helped me, the club, my partners and our dressing room to move forward. As everyone at present is buying into what we're trying to achieve here both on and off the field, and that

collective spirit is joyful and bringing us all together.

I now sense a united club, a united dressing room and a united support base, who will not overreact to the odd poor result, and I sense our club and dressing room now genuinely expect to be there or thereabouts come the business end of the season.

I feel as a club we are enjoying the pressure of being a promotion challenger. and I'm just thankful to be back in the title race. My belief is, it will now take a very good points total, team and club to take the title from us.... That said If any team is better than us come the seasons end, then there will no complaints or excuses from me.

As we close in on February, we know our investment strength, know our squad strength, know our quality, know our fitness levels and know our mindsets are strong. Trust me we will stay grounded, we will collectively picture the finishing line and focus on the 20 league games in front of us.

All of the above means we'll be fighting every inch of the way to April 27th to win a title but if need be we'll be ready for the play offs. Only through a managerial change, unity, investment, good recruitment and renewed belief, are we now in a position to enjoy a club defining next three months.

So let me finish by saying, this sense of collective achievement is why I'm in football.... "let the madness and mind games begin"....

Good Afternoon, firstly I would like to welcome Gary Horgan, his Staff and Players to The Mangata Pay Uk Stadium for today's National South fixture.

It's nice to have back-to-back fixtures at Meadow Park to finish off a busy week, having played one of the in form sides on Tuesday and to get an excellent three points shows us where we are currently as a group.

They definitely presented us different questions from the weekend, with them being way more aggressive in their play and looking to press us higher up the pitch.

And now we find ourselves wanting to achieve a new target and that is something I have addressed with the Staff and Players the last few days and the response was exactly what I expected.

The group is driven, the energy around the whole club is positive. The messaging and language have changed, and you can feel it within the place.

We now need to up our game even more and show a level of consistency that warrants us to be where we are.

Let's finish off a really positive week with another big performance and three points to continue us on our journey.

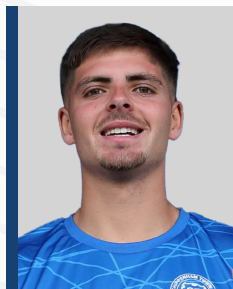


Luke HAINES

Born: Swindon - 15 October 2000

Position: Defender

Haines joined Swindon Town's academy in 2007, signing his first professional contract in 2019. He had two loan spells at Hardenhuish Park, scoring twice in 25 appearances, and briefly joined Hereford on loan before making a permanent move in 2021. Released by Hereford in 2023, he rejoined Chippenham Town in May of 2023 after two previous loan stints in Wiltshire and has recently been skipping the Bluebirds.



Harry PARSONS

Born: Swindon - 9 October 2002

Position: Forward

Top scorer for the Bluebirds so far this season, Parsons rejoined Chippenham Town in the summer having previously been with Maidenhead United. In November of 2021, he first signed for the club on a one-month loan deal and notably scored three goals in seven minutes against Marc White's Dorking Wanderers. The loan was extended for a further month and in October of 2022, he returned for a second loan spell at Hardenhuish Park.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

CHIPPENHAM TOWN

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Chippenham Town 'Classic Campaigns'

1951/52

Chippenham Town won the Western League title for the first time in 1951/52. They began with a 4-0 win over Paulton Rovers, with Jock Boyd scoring from the half-way line after just 30 seconds. George Flowers' side won 5-2 at Salisbury and 6-0 in the return match three months later, then beat Bath City reserves 2-0 in front of 2,957 at Hardenhuish Park on Boxing Day. They trounced Poole Town 9-1 and won 23 of their 34 Western League games. Scoring 103 goals, they also had the best defensive record, gaining 50 points and finishing four ahead of runners-up Glastonbury. They reached the FA Cup first round proper for the first time, losing 3-0 at Leyton.

1980/81

Player-manager John Howell guided Chippenham Town to the Western League First Division title in 1980/81. Town won 25 of their 36 Western League games, losing only three times, scoring 76 goals and conceding just 24. They clinched promotion to the Premier Division with a 1-0 victory at Glastonbury in mid-April, then secured the title with two games remaining with a 0-0 draw against rivals Wellington on Good Friday. Town gained 58 points, finishing six ahead of runners-up Wellington. Colin Moss, Martin Glanvill, Micky Bohane and Chris Meech formed a deadly strike force, while Keith Nash and Ian Monnery were dominant in defence.

1999/00

Chippenham were FA Vase finalists in 2000. Tommy Saunders' side gained a 3-1 first round win at Wimborne, then won 3-0 at home to Swindon Supermarine before a 2-0 third round

win over Northwood. Steve Tweddle scored to clinch a 1-0 win after extra-time at Glossop NE, then Town gained a 3-1 fifth round win at home to Wroxham. They beat Bedlington Terriers 2-0 in a sixth round replay, then Vauxhall Motors 1-0 in the semi-finals. The following team lost 1-0 to Deal Town in the Wembley final: Ian Jones, Lea James, Shane Andrews, Ian Murphy, Lee Burns, John Woods, Steve Brown, Simon Charity, Steve Tweddle, Lee Collier, Dave Godley.

2000/01

Chippenham Town achieved a promotion and Western League Cup 'double' in 2000/01. Tommy Saunders' side won 30 of their 38 Western League Premier Division games, trouncing Minehead 8-0, Dawlish Town 6-1 and slamming five goals past Bishop Sutton, Bridgwater, Bridport, Devizes, Taunton, Westbury and Yeovil Town reserves. Town finished runners-up with 95 points, just two behind champions Taunton. They beat Warminster 2-0, Hallen 2-0, Yeovil Town reserves 3-2, Bridport 3-2 and Bideford 2-1 en route to the Western League Cup final, beating Exmouth Town 1-0. Top scorer Steve Tweddle and Matt Rawlins netted 56 goals between them.

2001/02

Chippenham Town won promotion for the second consecutive season in 2001/02. Tommy Saunders' side made a six-match unbeaten start to life in the Southern League Western Division, then scored four goals past Shepshed Dynamo and Redditch United during October. The Bluebirds maintained their title challenge with a 17 match unbeaten run, including a 6-0 victory at Evesham United. Matt Rawlins was leading marksman and Shane Andrews 'Player of the Year' as they won 26 of their 40 games.

They finished runners-up with 87 points, just three behind champions Halesowen Town, winning promotion to the Southern League Premier Division.

2004/05

Chippenham Town reached the Southern League Premier Division play-off final in 2004/05. Steve White's side kicked off with a 6-0 victory at Dunstable and dropped just two points in their opening seven games. They were knocked off the top of the table by a 5-0 defeat at home to Histon and won only three times in 11 matches before soaring back to the top with a 13 match unbeaten run, including five-goal wins over Hemel Hempstead and Cirencester. The Bluebirds were pipped to the title after losing 1-0 at rivals Histon on the final day. They beat Bedford 5-4 on penalties after a 2-2 draw in the play-off semi-finals but lost 1-0 to Hednesford in the final.

2005/06

Chippenham Town reached the Southern League Premier Division play-off final for the second consecutive season in 2005/06. The Bluebirds were unbeaten in their first three games with Dave Gilroy grabbing a hat-trick in a 3-1 win over Northwood. They reached the FA Cup first round proper for the second time but lost 1-0 at Worcester in a replay. Darren Perrin's side soared up the table after dropping only two points in eight games and briefly went top after a 2-0 victory at Evesham in late February. Dave Gilroy was top scorer as they qualified for the play-offs in fourth place. They won 3-1 at King's Lynn in the semi-finals but lost 3-2 to Bedford in the final.

2007/08

Chippenham Town qualified for the Southern League Premier Division play-offs again in 2007/08. They started with a 1-0 defeat at Hitchin but then won four of their next five games including a 5-1 demolition of Cheshunt. Adie Mings' side also won 5-1 at home to Tiverton and went top of the table after winning 2-0 at Swindon Supermarine in mid-December. After five matches without a win, they trounced Bedford 5-0 and Yate 4-0 in consecutive games in February. David Pratt

grabbed a hat-trick in their 4-1 win at Cheshunt and was top scorer as Chippenham qualified for the play-offs in fourth position. They lost 2-1 at Halesowen in the semi-finals.

2009/10

Chippenham Town reached the Southern League Premier Division play-offs for the fourth time in six seasons in 2009/10. Adie Mings' side raced to the top of the table with a six-match unbeaten start, trouncing Hemel Hempstead 6-1 and drawing 4-4 at Leamington. Ben Highmore netted a hat-trick in their 5-3 win at Truro before just one victory in eight games. The Bluebirds revived their promotion challenge with an 11 match unbeaten run, then stormed to a 5-0 win at home to Banbury. They qualified for the play-offs in third place after winning their last four games but after beating Hednesford 2-0 in the semi-finals, they lost 2-1 at Nuneaton in the final.



2016/17

Chippenham Town stormed to the Southern League Premier Division title in 2016/17. Mark Collier's side were early leaders after winning six times in an eight-match unbeaten start. They overcame defeats against Banbury and King's Lynn to drop just two points in nine games, culminating in a 5-0 win at home to Cambridge City. The Bluebirds extended their lead at the top with a 23 match unbeaten run, including a spell of 15 wins in 16 games. They were crowned champions on Good Friday without kicking a ball as rivals Leamington lost 2-0 at Biggleswade, gaining a Southern League record 103 points as they won promotion to the Conference South.

Luke Haines and Will Henry made crucial blocks for the hosts, while Nathan Ashmore produced key saves to preserve the visitors' lead.

Chippenham's Luke Spokes came closest, with several efforts narrowly missing the target. The second half saw Chippenham dominate possession, but Boreham Wood's defensive resilience limited their opportunities. Harry Parsons and Tom Mehew both threatened for the hosts, but Wood substitute Abdul Abdulmalik almost sealed the win late on with a dazzling solo run. The victory kept the Wood's promotion hopes alive as they turned their focus to an FA Cup clash with Carshalton Athletic.
