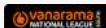

DANNY HUNTER

Tonight we welcome Hampton and Richmond Borough to the Mangata Pay UK stadium for this hastily re-arranged game after the postponement through frost 10 days ago. May I wish their Directors, Manager and players an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, after more than twenty-five years I've tried to re-build our club brick by brick, step by step, with a clear vision and with a progressive culture. In that time we have most definitely progressed ourselves both on and off the field of play, that said, we have just experienced a calendar year of adversity, with very few ups, many more downs, and faced difficulties, disappointment and relegation.

However through sheer hard work, further investment and with perhaps a new realism and perspective, it's a rather nice feeling to report to you all so early in 2025, that the rebirth of our club in terms of its hope, confidence, pride, passion and belief is I feel back within both the staff and players.

That positive mentality is also seen within our sponsors, our partners and the wider community, and as such I hope we've finally brought an end to what was a very difficult period in 2024 and entered 2025 much stronger for the experience.

On a personal note to cap off what was a difficult 2024.....I had my house burgled by three masked intruders over the Christmas period while still in the house. That was both traumatic, upsetting and the scariest of situations, which probably best summed up my year.

The most upsetting thing about the burglary though, was that these low life's stole my late mother's wedding ring which is worthless to anyone other than me, my brothers, my sister or my family.

Anyway, back to football, I believe our recent improvements on the pitch now cement our very realistic ambitions off it as we enter 2025. I believe our renewed confidence has stemmed from big decisions made by myself, my key staff, our manager all in conjunction with our senior players.

I feel by owning and accepting the mistakes we made collectively last season, it has brought everyone back together. Our

collective acceptance of our mistakes, will I feel give us a great chance to right a few wrongs before the end of April. I also think some recent honesty sessions have brought about much needed self awareness, personal improvement and a real understanding that only through hard work, only by continuing to improve our fitness levels and only by creating an environment where everyone delivers on what is expected from them at a full time club, can we hope to get out of this league.

It's my genuine belief, that a club of our size can only succeed at this level and the level above through honesty, togetherness, good fiscal management and smarter decision-making. In truth, good recruitment only improves if you have good talent spotters, analysts and dealmakers, but you still very much need a professional infrastructure to attract players and you must have serious dressing room investment.

To build long-term success you always need football intelligence and experience within your ranks, plus a staff togetherness and wider understanding of what it takes to build a bigger, better and more sustainable community football club. Investment, strength and patience at the top is vital and in the main must come from me and my inner circle.

However that strength must continue through the positive messaging of our manager, key staff and our players both old and new. As It's they who must deliver the positivity and togetherness to each other, to you supporters, to our town and to our community, regarding our clubs hopes, aspirations and ambitions, because they know only promotion this season will be deemed as success in my book.

As Chairman, I think I know what it takes to be successful and continued investment is key.... we have won four promotions, had countless cup runs and plenty of play-off success in my 26 seasons here, though in truth every one of our four promotions has been remarkably different in style of play.

That said, the building blocks of a promotion-winning club and dressing room are remarkably similar in terms of the traits

required from your staff, players and managers in terms of attitude, discipline, desire, a winning mentality and importantly, a genuine hunger, as these consistent characteristics are normally only seen in winners and champions.

Trust me for a dressing room to win a title at any level, you have to have a bit of luck with injuries and suspensions. You must also be disciplined hence our strict code of conduct, you must always be professional hence our infrastructure builds, and you must be aided by very loyal staff and the right characters. These are very simple requirements but much needed within your club if you want to be champions and sustain progress and success.

You always need your experienced key people around you who will eat, drink and sleep a clubs progression or promotion challenge. As they are the types who sacrifice a normal life on easy street to go that extra mile for you, and they do it day after day, week after week, month after month and always find a way to get the job done.

If we succeed this season, trust me a promotion or title success will bond our fans, our staff, our manager and his dressing room forever, as collective success in football somehow lives with you for forever and a day.

Why? Because players, staff, friends, family and you the fans, all know its importance and so become forever invested in the club's historical journey and the players and manager become forever revered by the generations of fans, players and staff thereafter, who then follow in that historic success.

Some managers and players will go through their whole footballing careers and never experience being called a champion or a title winner. It's why when things are within my control, I must as Chairman, occasionally be hard-nosed and selfish enough to re-look at certain situations and observe those around me, who DO NOT want to eat, sleep and drink a promotion push and subconsciously live on easy street.....I sometimes then have to make very difficult decisions.

That was the dilemma I faced this season just eight games in, after dropping points in five games at the start of the season, winning three, drawing three and losing two. We were in my opinion lacklustre, rudderless, down in 10th, with team selection more about rotation than creating a consistent winning formula with a very good squad.

To be in any promotion conversation, is all about leadership, decision making and consistency, especially if you have genuine ambitions to be title challengers. You simply cannot go into every game as an ideologue, flip flop on team selection and be defensively unsound, not if you want to win a title, and especially if you have an opinionated, experienced and talented dressing room.

You cannot when in charge of a big budget, great staff and such a talented squad, not communicate, play one dimensional football or think you can draw your way to promotion. The reality was and is, you cannot drop points in more than 17 to 19 games over a 46-game season if you want a realistic title chance, that's not just a throw away stat, it's a fact.

As such after just eight games, I felt our promotion aspirations were already on the floor, there was no room for further error and there was NO dressing room awareness or acknowledgement of that fact. As such I owed it to you the fans, to myself, to my investment, sponsors, partners, to my Father and Presidents late memories, to my family, key staff, players, club, town and community, to man up, use all of my experience and accept I'd made a key appointment mistake.

To do that I also had to accept any flak or abuse that might come my way, wipe my mouth, back my instincts, increase my investment, but mostly back my experience to do what was needed to give our football club and supporters an honest shot at winning a league or at worse try and achieve a promotion through the play-offs.

I knew more than anyone what had caused our relegation as does Luke Garrard and my inner circle. I also knew that if I was to re-appoint Luke then our partnership would need to realign, we would need to re-ignite our relationship, we would also need to improve

our squad through further recruitment, as we were good, but not quite good enough. As such I would need to work very closely again with both Luke if he came back on board and our Sporting Director Charlie Hunter.

I knew what Luke would bring us organisationally and defensively. More importantly, I knew that Luke knew me, our staff and our players intimately. I instinctively felt Luke would enjoy most of our summer squad and staff recruitment. I also knew Luke more than anyone, would understand the club was still hurting and trying to heal itself after our relegation and would match my ambition to right those wrongs.

By the time I decided to replace our Head Coach after the away game at Hampton, it had become clear that some of our senior players already lacked belief, motivation and their focus was a long, long way short of what Champions or promotion challengers are made of.

As such I had a lot to think about as I drove home quietly from the Hampton game with fans liaison officer Grant Morris and with some of the grandchildren in tow. Throughout that journey, all I kept thinking about was whether I should at least try and re-appoint Luke Garrard? What if that was not possible as I had not spoken to him for months and had no idea of his reaction?

If not Luke, then who else should we best appoint to try and maximise what was a fantastic budget, a good group of people and a very talented squad? Luke I knew would understand me, he would understand the group, the fan base and would understand the club infrastructure better than anyone and of course that appealed to me.

Luke more than anyone would understand after our relegation, that this season was not remotely a project. I also knew if I approached him and he accepted, this dressing room would understand how to defend properly once again and know if we wanted a shot at the title or a play-off place, that we could not play the suicide football that I'd watched since July a moment longer.

So the decision was made on the journey

back from Hampton and Richmond game, even though we had salvaged a draw through a last-minute Kwezi Appiah equaliser. That myself and Charlie Hunter would explore the possibility of a managerial change, as it was clear to me the dressing room and key club staff lacked motivation, needed a more experienced and communicative leader and the team needed better messaging from the dugout.... As such my mind was made up and the new manager search began in earnest.

My sleepless and troubled nights of course continued - but today as results improve and belief increases they have become less and less. In truth as we enter a new year, I must of course own my mistakes, I must also face my fears of failure and of letting down our loyal support base. However, on reflection in regards to Luke return I feel my instincts, knowledge and experience have thankfully been vindicated.

Yes I know it's still early days, but If I'm honest my fears in regards to Luke's return all but disappeared as we travelled on the team coach together down to Eastbourne Borough in the FA Cup just a week after the Hampton game.... I knew in an instant, that our relationship and chemistry again felt right. I also felt that our respect, long-term friendship and long-standing relationship, could give our football club the promotion boost it needed and give you supporters, our town and our community a few more footballing memories.

The brief explanation above of a key member of staffs departure and Luke's return, is made only for clarity as we enter 2025 and another New Year. Hopefully it will now stop our supporters who continually still question me on the subject and help everyone to move on.

In terms of our immediate future and my long-term ambitions, I think I've made my aspirations clear, with continued investment in our dressing room, in our facility upgrades and with the planned new build at the South end of the ground that we hope to begin in late 2025.

As such my ambitions are clear and our club plans are very much underway. It also means our future both on and off the park is once

again looking bright. In terms of Luke, Charlie Hunter, my key staff and our playing squad, we are thankfully now all on the same page and I feel things on and off the pitch are looking good.

The relationships are back, the hard work and focus on success is everywhere and I feel we are now ready, willing and able to mount a sustained title challenge and take our promotion push all the way to the very end of the season. It was always my aim after a dismal 2024 to make 2025 a more memorable year and that remains my aim, though there is still much work to do.

Trust me, all of us at the club will now need to eat, sleep and drink our title challenge, which can give us the pot of gold at the end of our promotion rainbow. That said, let's not overreact to every result over the coming weeks and months, whether they are good, bad or indifferent. There is still a lot of water to run under our particular bridge and there will be plenty of ups and downs to deal with

What I do hope by way of positive messaging, is that you guys bang on the positivity drum on your socials, as we are going to need to improve our home support for the run-in. If we are going to push for the title or gain a promotion through the play offs, then we will need your vocal support and noise.

Let's be very clear here, your support both home and away will be vital to our promotion cause over the coming weeks and months. You know I'll be doing my bit, you know the dressing room and Luke will be doing their bit.... But we are going to need your help, your voice, your attendance and the Wood Army out in force for every one of our matches, if YOU DO genuinely want to play your part.

Finally whoever you support let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

Good Evening, firstly I would like to welcome Alan Julian, his Staff and Players to The Mangata Pay Uk Stadium for tonight's National League WSouth fixture.

With postponements and a FA Trophy fixture, this will be only our third League game since the turn of the year.

Having returned from Welling on Saturday with a well-earned three points, it's for us to continue our current form tonight against a side that possesses an attacking threat.

It was important to continue our winning form on Saturday as we haven't had a League fixture since January 1st, we have played a game in the cup competition but that was mainly with a changed side, so to get a much needed three points was key.

We have been fortunate to still be the FA Trophy which has allowed for me to utilise the whole squad and give much needed game time to the current players finding themselves on the fringes.

I have explained the importance of us staying focused and having the drive to continue the great work we are doing and that the players will need to ensure the standards are high and the demand is there.

I strongly believe it is player led, and Manager driven, I will always implement what's expected and the intensity required but I have been seeing players flourish recently having adopted way more responsibility.

That has been evident in our meetings, training sessions and on the pitch which for me has been our biggest progression.

We are now a side that can play many ways and that has been a big emphasis in our practices and analysis to make the players understand that winning takes all sorts of performances and being fluid to how the opposition presents itself and the environment we are playing in.

Tonight is about us once again getting on the front foot and taking the game to the opponent, we have been very productive with 12 goals scored in our last 4 League fixtures here and we want to add to that tally this evening.

So please continue to get behind the boys and give them the support they need to get a much needed 3 points.

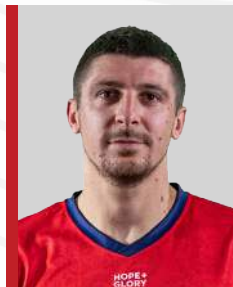


Dominic REVAN

Born: 19 September 2000

Position: Defender

A versatile right back and center back, the Hampton and Richmond Borough's skipper joined from Barnet in December of 2023, initially on a 28-day loan before signing permanently. A former Aston Villa player, he debuted against Liverpool in the FA Cup and had loan spells at Weymouth and Northampton before joining Barnet in 2022. In his first season at the Beveree Stadium, Revan made 22 appearances and provided two assists.



Jake GRAY

Born: 25 December 1995

Position: Midfield

Jake Gray started his career with Crystal Palace aged sixteen, before loans with Cheltenham and Hartlepool. Whilst at Palace, Gray made the Premier League bench on four occasions before racking up over a hundred EFL appearances at Yeovil, Hartlepool and Luton. In January of 2024, Jake registered his 150th appearance for the Beavers and would later finish the 2023/24 with five goals and seven assists from 42 league appearances.



James ROBERTS

Born: 21 June 1996

Position: Forward

In June of 2024, Roberts returned to Beveree after a period on loan at the club in 2022. As a youth player, Roberts represented Wycombe Wanderers and Oxford United, for whom he made his League Two debut aged 18, scoring in his first start. The forward has hit double figures in the league in three of the last five seasons, at Spennymoor Town, Oxford City, and Havant & Waterlooville and has scored nine times so far this campaign.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

HAMPTON & RICHMOND

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Hampton & Richmond Borough 'Classic Campaigns'

1995/96

Hampton won promotion to the Isthmian League First Division in 1995/96. Under long-serving manager Chick Botley, the Beavers won 23 of their 40 Isthmian League Second Division games, finishing in third place with 79 points behind Canvey Island and Croydon. Warren Bayliss was top scorer with 23 goals, while Steve Cheshire was captain and Dave Rattue was 'Player of the Year'. Hampton won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the first time in 26 years, beating Ruislip Manor 3-2 in the final, having been beaten finalists the previous year. They were also Middlesex Senior Cup finalists, losing 3-2 to Isthmian League Premier Division champions Hayes.

1997/98

Hampton won promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division in 1997/98. The Beavers won their opening two matches in the Isthmian League First Division, then gained only two points from their next four games before soaring with a 15 match unbeaten run, culminating in an emphatic 5-0 victory at Thame United shortly before Christmas. Chick Botley's side lost just one of their final 18 games and pipped Maidenhead United to third place with 81 points after beating them 1-0 in their final home match, then winning 2-1 at Berkhamsted Town. Francis Vines was leading scorer with 14 goals, while Mark Russell was the only ever-present player.

2003/04

Hampton & Richmond Borough won promotion back to the Isthmian League Premier Division in 2003/04. The Beavers lost just one of their opening 12 Isthmian League First Division (South)

games under new manager Alan Devonshire, slamming four goals past Slough Town, Croydon Athletic and Whyteleafe. They gained a thrilling 4-3 victory at home to Lewes in mid-January, then Michael Currie grabbed a hat-trick in their 4-0 win at Bracknell Town. Clinching promotion with a 3-0 victory at Leatherhead on the final day, they won 26 of their 46 games and finished in fifth position with 89 points. Adrian Allen was leading marksman with 21 goals.

2005/06

Hampton & Richmond Borough reached the Isthmian League Premier Division play-off final in 2005/06. Alan Devonshire's side were early leaders, winning their first seven games before losing 4-3 at Fisher Athletic. They bounced back with a 4-2 victory over Leyton, then gained five straight wins including a 2-1 victory at home to AFC Wimbledon watched by a 2,520 crowd. The Beavers stormed to a 4-0 win at AFC Wimbledon, in front of 3,315, in early April and Lawrence Yaku was top scorer as they qualified for the play-offs in fifth place. They beat Heybridge Swifts 4-2 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the semi-finals but lost 3-0 at Fisher in the final.

2006/07

Hampton & Richmond Borough won the Isthmian League Premier Division title in 2006/07. Alan Devonshire's side won four of their opening five matches but just one of their next ten, a 1-0 victory at AFC Wimbledon watched by a 2,529 crowd. The Beavers surged back into the title race with a marvellous 20 match unbeaten run but crashed to a 4-0 defeat at rivals Chelmsford City in front of a 2,008 crowd in early April. Leading marksman Ian Hodges scored twice as they clinched the title with a dramatic 4-2 victory

at home to Slough Town on the final day. They won 24 of their 42 games and gained 82 points, finishing two ahead of runners-up Bromley.

2007/08

Hampton & Richmond Borough reached the Conference South play-off final in 2007/08. The Beavers lost two of their opening three games but steadily climbed the table and reached the FA Cup first round proper for only the second time, losing 3-0 at home to Dagenham & Redbridge watched by a 2,252 crowd. Ending the season with a 12 match unbeaten run, including a 6-0 win at home to champions Lewes, they qualified for the play-offs in third place. Lawrence Yaku, Elliott Godfrey and Ian Hodges scored 55 goals between them. They beat Fisher Athletic 4-2 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the semi-finals but lost 2-0 to Eastbourne Borough in the final.

2008/09

Hampton & Richmond Borough were Conference South play-off finalists again in 2008/09. Alan Devonshire's side made a steady start before their 2-0 win over Dorchester in mid-November heralded a 16 match unbeaten run including nine straight wins. Hampton received a club record transfer fee when striker Ben Wright joined Peterborough United in January. The Beavers' 1-1 draw at home to AFC Wimbledon in the title 'decider' in mid-April was watched by a 3,225 crowd. They won 25 of their 42 games, finishing runners-up with 85 points, then beat Chelmsford 3-1 in the play-off semi-finals but lost 3-2 at home to Hayes & Yeading in the final.

2015/16

Hampton & Richmond Borough won the Isthmian League Premier Division title in 2015/16. Alan Dowson's side lost only two of their opening 12 games, then hammered Hendon 5-0 and Merstham 6-1 in consecutive matches in mid-October. Seven straight wins included a 2-1 victory at home to title rivals Bognor Regis. They lost 1-0 in the return match at Bognor at the end of January but slammed five goals past Needham Market, Canvey Island and Brentwood Town during the closing weeks. Nicke Kabamba and Jamal

Lowe netted 32 goals between them as Hampton won 28 of their 46 games, gaining 95 points, one ahead of runners-up Bognor.

2016/17

Hampton & Richmond Borough qualified for the Conference South play-offs in 2016/17. The newly-promoted Beavers started strongly, winning eight of their first 12 games, netting four goals against Margate, Wealdstone, Dartford and St Albans City. Despite the sale of leading scorers Jamal Lowe and Nicke Kabamba to Portsmouth in January, Hampton remained in the promotion race and Brendan Kiernan grabbed a hat-trick in their 5-0 win at Oxford City. They qualified for the play-offs in seventh place, albeit through the failure of the two clubs immediately above them to achieve correct ground gradings, but lost 4-2 to Ebbsfleet United in the semi-finals.



2017/18

Hampton & Richmond Borough reached the Conference South play-off final in 2017/18. After a disappointing start to the campaign, winning just one of their opening six games, Alan Dowson's side went on an unbeaten run of 21 matches that lifted them into the play-off places by Christmas. Debutant Elliott Charles netted a hat-trick in their 3-0 victory at Wealdstone on New Year's Day, while Max Kretschmar was leading marksman with 16 goals as they qualified for the play-offs in fourth place. After beating Truro City 3-1 and Chelmsford City 1-0, they faced Braintree Town in the play-off final at Beveree Stadium but lost 4-3 on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

STONES' STREAK SHATTERED AT CHESHAM

Maidstone's 19-match unbeaten run in National League South ended with a 2-0 defeat at Chesham.

After a quiet first half, Chesham took the lead three minutes into the second half when Ashley Lodge curled a fine strike past Alexis Andre Jr. Connor Stevens doubled the advantage shortly after, heading home from a free-kick. Chesham dominated, nearly adding a third through Connor Roberts. Maidstone's best chance came late on when Sol Wanjau-Smith's header struck the bar, but it wasn't enough. George Elokobi's side, unbeaten since September, couldn't find a way back and suffered their first defeat in four months.



TORQUAY HELD BUT STAY TOP

Torquay United extended their unbeaten run with a 1-1 draw at St Albans City but dropped points despite dominating the second half.

St Albans took the lead in the sixth minute through Harrison Smith's strike. Torquay equalised early in the second half with a Jordan Young penalty. The Gulls created numerous chances, including a disallowed goal, shots saved, and one hitting the post, but couldn't find a winner.

With changes to the starting line-up, Torquay remained on top but failed to convert their dominance into a victory. They stay top of the National League South but drop points, now only two ahead of Boreham Wood.



TRURO SET FOR STADIUM IMPROVEMENTS

Truro City FC's plans to expand covered seating at their stadium have been approved by Cornwall Council.

The project will increase the Eden Hot Tubs north stand from 264 to 508 seats, adding a family area and improved disabled seating. The £180,000 upgrade, funded by the Premier League stadium fund, will also cover terraced areas for better weather protection.

Chairman Eric Perez said the club is "super pumped" about the improvements, with stadium lead John Fabby highlighting fan engagement and enhanced accessibility. The work schedule will be finalised soon, aiming to create one of the most accessible grounds in non-league football.
