# DANNY HUNTER

***Today we welcome Dorking Wanderers to the Mangata Pay UK Stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.***

Well it feels at times that we have been the most unpredictable team around this season, but if that's true then it equally applies to today's opponents Dorking Wanderers, and possibly 5 or 6 others who sit in and around us in the current play-off places. In truth the top 7 or 8 teams this season have all been unpredictable at times, poor at times, outstanding at times and mediocre for large periods. All of the top sides in this division have been to the summit on more than one occasion only to fall away meekly, then somehow found a way to re-group, grab a few wins and come again.

As such the feeling was that there were bound to be a few more twists and turns at the top, but after our performance and surrender at Weymouth last Saturday, on top of Dorking losing 1-0 at home to Torquay United and Truro squandering a 2-0 lead before losing 3-2 at Enfield Town, it's now Worthing's title to lose. Ourselves, Dorking Wanderers, Eastbourne Borough, Truro City and Torquay United will in desperation hope that we get one last chance to sit at the summit, but the reality is in my opinion that is not going to happen.

Trust me, for us to give up on the title like we did at Weymouth without a fight hurts every fibre of my sensibilities. That said I cannot say I was surprised and it shows me we still have weak mentalities and entitled thinking within the dressing room and that needs to change.

I believe that every club in and around the play-offs other than Worthing, will remember this season for their own inconsistency, for the crazy points they dropped, the late goals they conceded and the multiple injuries we have all whinged about. We will all have hard luck stories to tell, though whether they are true or just lame excuses for social media is another matter.

I always felt personally that unless we achieved promotion this season, especially with the squad we have put together and with what we're spending, we would possibly remember this league campaign as a lost opportunity, a dressing room falling short, where we struggled in key moments and the quality of this squad was perhaps wasted.

Our vocabulary will now possibly be about woulda, coulda, shoulda, what if and if only..... I certainly hope not, as this club and dressing room should not be making excuses for our failings or inadequacies. We must be big enough to wipe our mouths, congratulate the victors and be ready to go again in readiness for the play-offs and then prepare for next season.

What I do now need at the season's end on a personal note, is to find a bit of time for some self reflection as I need to deal with all manner of football matters, while ensuring that I get my spring and summer stadium/facility builds completed in a timely manner.

To do that I need to ensure my budgets are aligned, that I'm motivated to stay full time and that we do not play the blame game as a football club. I do not want anyone making excuses for our failures, our inadequacies or our weaknesses. I'm very aware of my own shortfalls and failures, I'm also very aware of what I'm spending at present and of certain long held misgivings I hold in regards to how our club has re-grouped after relegation and how it has progressed recently.

I say that because I cannot continue spending at our present rate with no return, nor want to without more honesty, accountability and hard work in key areas. Mostly though I'm upset because of the continued stupid mistakes we've collectively made within the dressing room and academy areas over the last two seasons.

In post season I think I mistakenly had an early arrogance in terms of how tough I thought this league would be. Perhaps I also had a false confidence in what I perceived to be the mental strength of our football club, its spending power, our dressing room quality, this league's qualities and the strength of its clubs.

I have seen the players at this level, of course, but not closely for around 10 years. In my opinion though they are now much improved, are fitter and far more professional. I had expected the players within the National South to be honest, hard working, perhaps not always pretty on the eye, but 10 years on I feel there are far more hungry young players at the level, they are better prepared, they work for young managers who want to progress themselves and it shows on the pitch.

I've also been surprised that most teams now have one or two of these very good young local players with real ability within their ranks. I feel because these young players have legs, are fitter, smarter and hungry to learn that the teams they play for are better prepared, more focused and have improved their attitudes, discipline, desire, fitness levels and work rate, which makes up for any lack of quality they might have. Their desire and commitment reminds me of where we sat as a part time football club no more than eight years ago as we were hard working, very honest and always showed a fighting spirit that all small clubs like us needed back then.

When we were last promoted, we knew from the bottom up what our capabilities, strengths and our weaknesses were, but we also knew exactly who we were. To know yourself, your strengths, your club's work ethic and know why you're there helps incredibly, as you create unity and togetherness. Togetherness gives you a competitive edge and a mindset that bonds staff, players, supporters and assists with everyone's ambition. These traits make winners not only in football but in life and cost you nothing. That said, I've found one of the big changes in football at this level is that it has become far less local, and a club's love of developing or finding a player for his local club has disappeared, especially at clubs like ours.

As such I feel it has now become more about the length of a player's contract, what his agent wants, which is always more money and excessive wage demands, which in most cases do not relate to achievement, success or their development or well being. Players are now actively encouraged by their agents to sit on contracts or run them down, whether they are playing or not, hence why we now have 22 players - and good players sitting in the stand. It's more about the agents 5% than their client playing the game they purport to love and these are now the realities of the modern game, the modern agent and the modern footballer.

Years ago it was more about clubs knowing all of the good local players and talent within a 30 mile radius, and convincing those players as their contracts ended elsewhere that we were a good club and trying to convince them and their parents that they would develop and achieve success here.

It was our job to convince them, not an agent, to want to play for an ambitious club, one with great staff and a very good manager because they would be looked after. I spent millions for them to play on a great pitch and we built great training facilities for them, as we wanted them to train properly, share our ambition and work hard with us to bring us both the success we craved.

These things for 15 years went hand in hand with our ambition, without agents being involved, and with us ever improving our facilities as we continued to build. Now though it's more about finding nationwide players who have good reputations, who are not sick notes and who occasionally represent good value. That said, whether I'm right or wrong, I always ask myself one question, why would people from the other end of the country genuinely care about this community football club?

For me attitude, discipline and desire is still needed, but working within this wider recruitment network and watching this obsessive analyst culture that has developed over the last five years, stops managers looking at things with their eyes and trusting their instincts. In truth the wider recruitment model means expensive accommodation and in truth it can only work for the clubs with the better budgets. This means many of the smaller clubs at this level, are now struggling to compete with the bigger budget clubs across a whole season.

I'm still a huge fan of the part time club and the non league part time pyramid system. I'm also still a huge fan of the part time player and his commitment, and also the part time manager and coach, who are all holding down days jobs, while trying to progress themselves, their teams and their clubs.

In my time here I've met many thousands of amazing away supporters who follow their part time clubs through thick and thin. In hindsight, I'm also lucky that I had the support of our loyal supporters who allowed me in 1999 to 2005 to rip this club's business model up and rebuild it in my own image, even though for a time it created a yo-yo club - nowadays with social media and the instant success culture, that type of patient rebuild just could not happen.

Our supporter's patience with me and their collective foresight, allowed me to create

and bed in an academy structure and create sustainable growth and investment. The decisions I made then now employ many good local people, that in turn allowed me a vehicle to attract great partners like Arsenal and between us we created hundreds of thousands of pounds worth of third party spend in our town, in our high streets and with our retailers.

Our promotions and cup success attracted local and national sponsors and because of all that, we grew, we identified, we discovered and we developed more great coaches and more great young players than almost every other non league club that I can think of. In truth, I've had some of my best footballing moments with incredibly hard working part time people, having won four promotions along the way as the Chairman of a hard working, honest, part time club. In that time we have sent so many players to the Football League, Premier League and even the World Cup.

My record back then as Chairman of a part time club, possibly compares to most Chairmen in non-league at our level over the last quarter of a century as we won 4 promotions, 2 titles, had 2 play-off wins, plus a trip to Wembley in a play-off final in that time. As a part time club, we also won the Herts Senior Cup on 5 occasions and reached the 1st Round of the FA Cup 13 times. We also got to enjoy a few FA Cup 2nd Round Proper days out with our supporters, town and community.

That said, as a full time club, we've also enjoyed three play-offs at the level above, three FA Cup 3rd Round Proper appearances, and I got to enjoy the greatest day of my life when we beat Bournemouth 1-0 away in the FA Cup 4th Round Proper. By winning that game, we then got to enjoy an FA Cup 5th Round appearance at Goodison Park, going down 2-0 to Everton in front of forty thousand people.... and in truth I wouldn't change a thing.

All of the above sounds quite impressive for any non league club, but trust me it pales into insignificance when put up against the incredible record of the current Dorking Wanderers owner, chairman and manager Mr Marc White, who like me began shaping his club in 1999. Mark I believe has had 12 promotions in his 26 years and in that time he has won numerous titles, also has play off success to his name and has had his fair share of FA Cup success.

I'm told he's done much of it with his own money, through sheer determination and sheer hard work. No doubt there's been a few sleepless nights and a bit of tough love administered along the way. However for Marc to have had his success and his longevity, it means he's devoted himself to his community and to his beloved football club. Marc as I've learned over the last three seasons, is a huge character within non league and he genuinely does have a story worth telling. He also has the big personality to match his strong opinions, and I seldom say this about a fellow owner or chairman, as most trust me are self promoting and boring, most are about me, me, me and most are very entitled - but in all honesty I have genuine respect for Marc and his achievements without knowing him in any way.

I like how his teams play, I look forward to his colourful after match interviews that are almost borderline at times, but always lined with honesty, humour, frustration, elation and basic truths. Marc comes across to me as a very smart, slightly unorthodox manager, who's also a caring owner, and a chairman who knows himself. Recently I've been told by people close to me, that he's an all round good guy and that's been said to me by both my manager Luke Garrard and my Sporting Director Charlie Hunter and that's good enough for me.

Anyway back to this afternoon.... I find nowadays that there are far too many false six pointers spoken about especially early season and then there are the real six pointers of which today's game is definitely one of them. In all honesty the title has gone for us and it's now all about us being realistic, pragmatic and setting new goals and ambitions for the club and dressing room until the season's end.

I believe If either Boreham Wood or Dorking Wanderers do want a realistic shot at promotion, then it's only going to be through the play offs. As such, both clubs, managers and dressing rooms must now acknowledge they are possibly already sitting in the last chance saloon. Both clubs already know that finishing second or third in this league is massive, as it will give you one less game, a week off and home advantage in the play-off semis.

Only victory today will satisfy Marc, Luke and both sets of supporters. That said, whether we win, lose or draw this afternoon we are in all probability going to meet Dorking Wanderers

again at some stage if we're going to win the play-offs and If I'm being completely honest I don't fancy playing them without home advantage and 3,000 home fans and that means we need a win today if we are to achieve second or third.

Anyway enough of my diatribe above regarding my misgivings, my thoughts on part time clubs, on part time players and my love in with Mr Marc White. Today is simply about nicking three points, looking at the league table at 5pm and seeing where it's put us and not about over complicating things.

As I've said the title has gone, it's now about looking forward, wiping our mouths, going again and securing second or third place, as play-offs are always about fine margins and about taking momentum and confidence into them.

Lastly, can I thank those of you who travelled with hope down to Weymouth and returned with nothing but empty pockets. Please stay with us for the next six weeks, as I've been here before and even the footballing gods don't know where this season might take us.

If it helps then take this positive from my notes. We've never lost a play-off game let alone a play off final at this level or the level below. As such, trust me, no team will want to play us in the play-offs and if we can secure home advantage, everyone will fear coming here with a partisan full house - so I'll say it again loudly because I believe it - "NOTHING'S OVER UNTIL ITS OVER".

So whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

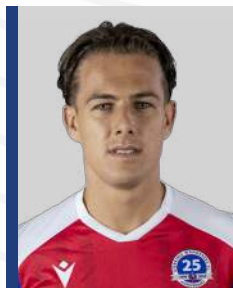
# IN THE DUGOUT

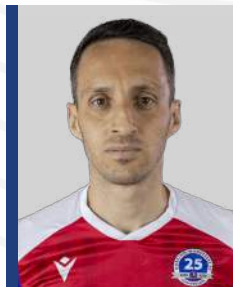


## **Charlie CARTER**

**Born:** 25 October 1996

**Position:** Midfield

The Wanderers' skipper began his footballing journey at Fulham before joining Woking, where he signed professionally in 2016. His breakout 2017/18 season saw him finish as top scorer, earning moves to Chesterfield and then Stevenage. After shining at Eastleigh in 2022/23, Carter returned to his native Surrey, joining Marc White's men in October of 2023. He was named club captain ahead of the current campaign in which he has netted 10 goals thus far.

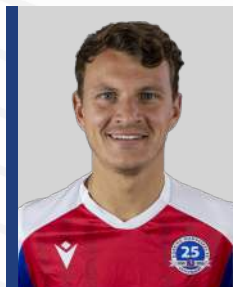


## **Jason PRIOR**

**Born:** 20 December 1988

**Position:** Forward

Wanderers club legend, Jason Prior re-signed at Meadowbank in February of 2023 after leaving Havant & Waterlooville. In his previous spell between 2018 and 2022, 'JP9' would play an instrumental part in the club's recent history, helping Marc White's side gain promotion from the Isthmian Premier and National League South divisions. Over the current National League South campaign, the forward has found the back of the net on 11 occasions.



## **Alfie RUTHERFORD**

**Born:** 4 August 1998

**Position:** Forward

Joining ahead of the 2020/21 season, Rutherford quickly became a fan favourite at the Wanderers. Reuniting with attacking partner Jason Prior after signing from Havant & Waterlooville, he brought National League experience and won the National League South Golden Boot with 30 goals in Marc White's side's promotion season. Despite overcoming heart and knee surgery, the forward remains both a prolific goalscorer and a key player at Meadowbank.

# DORKING WANDERERS

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Dorking Wanderers 'Classic Campaigns'

### 2006/07

Dorking Wanderers won the West Sussex League Premier Division title in 2006/07. They won 16 of their 22 games, winning all of their home matches, trouncing Rogate 9-1 and Clymping 6-3, also slamming four goals past East Dean and Henfield. Drawing 4-4 at Predators, they clinched the title with a 2-1 home victory on the final day. They gained 51 points, finishing four ahead of runners-up University of Chichester and securing promotion to the Sussex County League Third Division. They defeated Wittering United 2-0, Clymping 2-1 and Barnham 5-2 in the West Sussex League Cup before losing 2-0 to eventual winners Predators in the final.

### 2008/09

Dorking Wanderers reached the Sussex County League Third Division Cup final in 2008/09. Marc White's side beat Little Common 4-0, Pease Pottage Village 2-0 and Bosham 4-2 en route to the Sussex County League Third Division Cup final, losing 2-0 to Haywards Heath Town, with both goals scored by future Wanderers players Lois Freitas and Kevin Cooper. They challenged for promotion until a late collapse in form saw them finish fifth in the Sussex County League Third Division, winning 15 of their 26 games. Wanderers trounced Pease Pottage Village 7-1 and Hurstpierpoint 6-3 at Westhumble, scoring five goals in each of the respective away matches.

### 2010/11

Dorking Wanderers won the Sussex County League Third Division title in 2010/11. They won 24 of their 30 games, scoring 93 goals and conceding just 35, the best defensive record.

Marc White's side gained 6-0 wins at home to Ifield Edwards, Saltdean and TD Shipley, also slamming five goals past Barnham and Forest at Westhumble. Their solitary home defeat was 1-0 against Broadbridge Heath. Chris Williams was leading scorer in the Sussex County League Third Division with 28 goals. Gaining 74 points, they finished 16 points ahead of runners-up Hurstpierpoint, winning promotion to the Sussex County League Second Division for the first time.

### 2011/12

Dorking Wanderers won promotion again in 2011/12. Marc White's side scored five goals past Loxwood and Oakwood, also four past Bexhill United, East Preston, Eastbourne United Association, Littlehampton Town and Storrington. They won 21 of their 34 games, gaining 69 points and finishing third in the Sussex County League Second Division. Wanderers erected floodlights during the course of the season and were promoted to the top-flight of the Sussex County League following an FA appeal after Westhumble was initially deemed not to meet the necessary ground grading requirements. They also reached the Surrey Premier Cup final at the first attempt.

### 2014/15

Dorking Wanderers finished Sussex County League First Division runners-up in 2014/15. They won 26 of their 38 games, scoring 101 goals. Marc White's side swept to a 7-3 victory at Lancing and scored six goals past East Preston, Hailsham Town, Ringmer and Selsey. Their solitary home defeat in the Sussex County League First Division was 4-2 against Pagham. Gaining 83 points, they were piped



to the title by Littlehampton Town but secured promotion to the Isthmian League First Division One South. They were beaten 6-5 on penalties after a remarkable 6-6 draw at home to eventual winners Newhaven in the Sussex County League Cup third round.

#### 2015/16

Dorking Wanderers qualified for the Isthmian League First Division South play-offs in 2015/16. They began life in the Isthmian League with a 4-0 victory at Carshalton and were unbeaten in their opening eight matches, winning 5-0 at home to Chipstead. Marc White's side triumphed 4-2 at Peacehaven & Telscombe and Worthing, then gained a 5-3 win at home to East Grinstead. Six straight wins included a 5-1 victory over Faversham and a 6-0 success at Three Bridges. Tom Tolfrey was top scorer with 36 goals as they won 27 of their 46 games and gained 90 points. They qualified for the play-offs as runners-up but lost 2-1 to Faversham in the semi-finals.

#### 2016/17

Dorking Wanderers won promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division in 2016/17. Marc White's side won all except one of their opening 11 games, with Matt Briggs grabbing a hat-trick in a 6-0 victory at home to Molesey. They swept to a 7-1 win at home to Horsham and slammed five goals past Guernsey and Godalming in consecutive matches. A nine-match unbeaten finish saw them again qualify for the play-offs as Isthmian League First Division South runners-up. They defeated Hastings United 4-3 on penalties in the semi-final, after a 1-1 draw, then triumphed 5-4 penalties against Corinthian Casuals in the final following a 0-0 draw.

#### 2018/19

Dorking Wanderers stormed to the Isthmian League Premier Division title in 2018/19. Playing at the newly redeveloped Meadowbank, Marc White's side lost just one of their opening 15 Isthmian League games. They went top in November and Jason Prior grabbed a hat-trick in a 4-1 victory at home to Potters Bar. Following a thrilling 5-3 win over Harlow, they regained pole position with a 1-0 victory at home to Enfield in

late January. They won all except two of their final 19 games, trouncing Kingstonian 7-1 and winning 6-0 at home to both Folkestone Invicta and Burgess Hill, gaining 93 points and finishing 22 ahead of runners-up Carshalton.

#### 2019/20

Dorking Wanderers qualified for the Conference South play-offs in 2019/20. Marc White's side won 14 of their 35 Conference South matches before the season was curtailed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Placed seventh in the Conference South table, decided on a points-per-game basis, they qualified for the play-offs and defeated Bath City 2-1 with goals from James McShane and Jason Prior in the quarter-finals but lost 3-2 to eventual winners Weymouth in the play-off semi-finals. They also reached the FA Trophy third round, beating Leatherhead 3-0, Bromley 3-0 and Stockport County 4-0 before losing 4-2 at home to holders AFC Fylde.



#### 2021/22

Dorking Wanderers won promotion to the Conference National for the first time in 2021/22. They won 25 of their 40 Conference South games. Leading marksman Alfie Rutherford scored 30 of their 101 goals. Gaining 81 points, they qualified for the play-offs as runners-up, finishing six points behind champions Maidstone United. Marc White's side beat Oxford City 3-0 in the play-off semi-finals, then James McShane, Luke Moore and Alfie Rutherford scored as they defeated Ebbsfleet United 3-2 after extra-time in the play-off final. They also won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first time, beating Kingstonian 5-4 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the final.

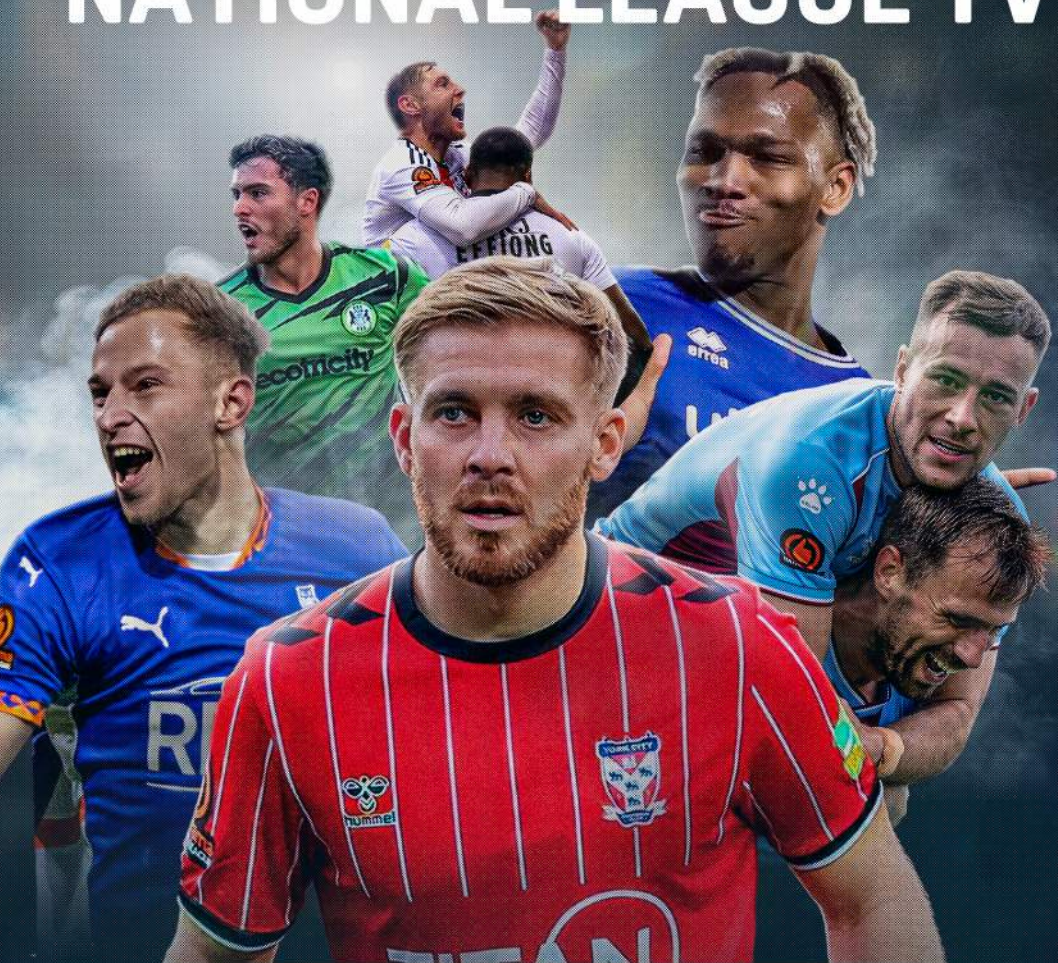
